CONDITIONS

- 1 All fences located on road reserve remain there at Council’s discretion and are to be removed or relocated by the property owner, if required, at the property owner’s expense.
- 2 THE FOLLOWING ‘ROADSIDE FENCING GUIDELINES’ SHALL APPLY TO FENCES LOCATED ON THE ROAD RESERVE:
 - (a) On strategic, arterial and collector roads, fences shall generally be on the boundary.
 - (b) On local roads, the fence may be located on road reserve to a minimum distance of **3 metres** from the carriageway or **2 metres** from the watertable.
 - (c) Fence locations shall take into account the existing road width and possible widening over a 10-15 year period.
 - (d) In rolling and hill country, fences may be located no closer than 1.2 metres to the top of batters.
 - (e) Recognition shall be made for provision of other services in the roadway and for others travelling off the carriageway.
- 3 Where the landowner does not accept the decision on the location of the fence, the landowner may request the decision to be reviewed by an appeal panel comprising the Roading Group Manager, Roading Committee Chairperson and the Ward member for that area.
