**Picking up litter is a very useful activity as it:**

- Helps to keep our district tidy
- Gives a feeling of contributing to the community
- Encourages "clean up people" to be tidy Kiwis
- Gives a good example to others

With common sense safety awareness your clean up will be very safe and enjoyable. Most litter is paper and plastic and very seldom is unsafe to pick up, using a glove on your "pick-up" hand.

**Our safety advice:**

- Do not pick up any dangerous or unhygienic litter (e.g. sharp glass or dead animals) – if you encounter such litter please ring the Council and provide us with the details so that we can arrange collection later
- Take care on or near roads, and do not pick up litter on road surfaces
- If walking on uneven ground, be careful to avoid falls
- Keep away from areas that may be unsafe, such as steep banks, overhanging cliffs, railways or waterways
- Provide close supervision and guidance for any children taking part

In the very unlikely event of an injury, please provide basic first aid and seek help if necessary. If an accident is serious, please ensure that suitable help is called to assist during and after the person has been cared for.
