PUBLIC FORUM

Waka Kotahi

Jenni Wild gave a presentation on the progress of SH1 between Papakura and Drury including walking/cycling pathways

\$655M budget will probably be exceeded due to Covid, extra cost of materials and extra consents

Papakura southbound onramp from Beach Road should be completed shortly Papakura northbound offramp changes completed in 3 weeks, not 4 as allowed, due to increased night work

6 new bridges need to be built including 2 at Drury interchange to allow for electrification of rail lines

New Chorus depot built at Drury interchange

Waikato pipeline will have to be replaced and moved

Project will take years to be completed

Next stage is up for consent, delayed due to areas of cultural significance on both sides of the motorway

There will be a hearing for the public with meetings planned later 2024. Next meeting in Drury Hall on 18 May 10 am - 1 pm

A discussion took place regarding speed limits. She advised that although central government wants them to be increased, in fact this is up to local councils to determine by by-law

Speed camera on Mill Road Bombay was discussed. Access to Orion Road almost impossible due to culvert and barrier around the camera installation

Lights at Bombay interchange to be installed mid-2024. Tenders close this week. Will take about 4 months subject to weather conditions and disruptions will happen

She is taking back to Waka Kotahi the following:

Question was raised regarding Pokeno southbound off ramp

Vegetation was planted 30 years ago and has not been maintained.

Community Patrol went and cut back huge flax bushes but these have regrown and vegetation is not fit for purpose, blocking visibility and endangering traffic on the roundabout

Lines need to be repainted

Why has Pokeno offramp not received a NZTA number as other off ramps on state highways

Bridges at Pokeno south on/off ramps are not maintained and are very overgrown

Haupai Montgomery

Haupai answered questions and spoke about whanau, hapu, iwi building a marae on Avon Road on the site of the dog park and the paddock next door. This will create better understanding. Also discussion regarding services to Maori. There will not be a convention centre attached to the marae as this will be sited either at Pokeno Sports Park or at the new Community Hub

WDC considering concept plan. No dog park as this culturally offensive to maori near a marae. Dog park to be moved to other side of Tennis Club on Reserve. WDC to decide if no marae or if so, public consideration. Public will get chance to speak on this when submissions when open/close. Outcome August-October 2025

Question regarding suitability of Avon Road. It is narrow and not suitable to extra traffic. Who will pay for road widening and improvements?

Question why another marae is needed for the district as both Tuakau and Mangatawhiri are within 10kms of Pokeno

Question re ownership of land as it appears that is was donated to the People of Pokeno many years ago for use including a school which was later moved to its present site

They are hoping to get 99-year lease on the land. He advised that the marae will not be funded by ratepayers since they will fund themselves and hope to get a result by November / December 2024

There will be a meeting on Saturday 04 May at 10.00 am at Pokeno Hall with local dignitaries, historians etc to explain the concept

KEY WORKS PROGRAMMES

Will Gauntlett (WDC) advised that we should go to WDC website to see all planned Works and Issues and Capital Projects in the Pokeno area on the Home Page.

Vic from Market Place raised a question regarding the road cones on Great South Road/ He has discussed this with Brian Cathro from WDA (managing the works and wants to see gaps where traffic from Pokeno Road can turn right into Great South Road without having to travel up to the roundabout at the Pokeno North off ramp. He wants a stop/go system but this will not work after 5.00 pm

Traffic lights phasing on corner of Hitchen Road and Pokeno Road needs to be changed while works are happening. Traffic delays are extremely long, particularly at school opening/closing times. Instances of impatient, dangerous driving, trucks blocking Pokeno Road/Helenslee intersection

Layby on Pokeno Road

Road Marking scheduled shortly when current water main works are completed

Munro Road

Road will be closed shortly for up to 4 months for widening and for flood protection to enable access to Sports Park

One way/no exit Ford Street

Will discussed this with Brenda Roberts after the meeting

Main Street redevelopment

Asbestos was found at roundabout site which stopped work. This has now been removed and works should restart shortly

Helen Clotworthy raised the subject of the paving and how access to shops was severely impaired with no access for wheelchairs. Dust and grit are a hazard and are filling guttering on Wellington Street carparks

She also raised the fact that rubbish has not been collected and the solar bins are not impacting rubbish and it looks like a third world country. She is not sure whether this is the contractor's fault but needs to be addressed urgently. No collection over Easter. Her staff have filled enormous bags with rubbish but

Toilet block

still is a problem

This has been delayed while decisions are made regarding Community Hub

GENERAL BUSINESS

Pokeno/Tuakau school bus

A letter from Will Gauntlett to Allen Grainger was read out.

Waikato Regional Council, Franklin Transport Network Group and principal of Tuakau College are in discussions regarding how a school bus would work from beginning of Term 2.

Ministry of Education website states \$1000 per family for buses

Tuakau College is exploring the viability of allowed students to finish early in order to catch 3.19 pm and 3.48 pm services from Tuakau to Pokeno

Question from member of the public regarding a protest walk but Mike Holroyd advised this is not a good idea as it really won't work. Pokeno is not the only place affected, the buses are being withdrawn countrywide

New annual plan 2024/2025 document

It should be on council website for all to read Contains details of projected rate increase of 13.75% Brief discussion regarding abolition of 3 Waters and that Watercare is pulling out of agreement for Tuakau/Pokeno effective 2026. Costs of updating existing water infrastructure is in the millions

Medical Centre

Pookeno Community Committee's Works and Issues Report – May 2024

1.	Pookeno Road Layby – the layby near the new traffic lights – Cecelia has had a few complaints re safety of the road. From those who live on Pookeno Road, coming from Tuakau. There are two entries a top one and the bottom one. The entrances are hard to see. Action: 3 May 2022 Consider options to increase safety/visibility of entry/exit into layby.	Roading / LMC	May 2024: Road marking have now been completed. This item is considered closed.
2.	One Way/No Exit Ford Street Can the "No Exit" sign colour be changed to be more prominent. Suggestions were made to show "No Right Turn" sign or "Residents Only" sign. Action: 24 February 2024 Residents have asked again for 'Residents Only' sign as road is only used by residents and their visitors. However, the road is being used by boy racers which is causing concern by residents.	Roading / WDA	May 2024: Residents of Ford Street have been updated on the new traffic management system. A temporary sign has been erected allowing a right turn which should remove some of the illegal Uturns into the entrance of the street. A temporary chicane has been installed to manage speeding drivers. Residents are to monitor the new measures and report back to WDC Capital Projects Consultant on how well these are working.

Capital Projects Update (as of 22 April 2024)

Playgrounds and Sports Parks

Pookeno Sports Park - Bulk Earth Works and Carpark Construction

The bulk earthworks and the carpark are complete, and planting will get underway in May.

A project opening took place on Thursday, 2 May.

The carpark will remain closed as it will not be accessible with the upcoming Munro Rd Upgrade works.

Roading

Munro Road Resilience Improvement

Consents have been granted and contractors Schick Civil Construction have been selected as the winning tenderer to carry out the works.

Works are scheduled to start this month but may be delayed slightly while the power is relocated near the culverts.

Pookeno Main Street Re-development

The construction crew have completed most of the 'street side' paving and when complete will shift to the shop side. A reinforced concrete pad was laid between the existing trees to support new tree surrounds and street furniture. Prep for the concrete speed table (pedestrian crossing) will commence when the weather allows.

Counties Energy came and energised the four new traffic light poles. This created real disruption for the two ice cream shops, and we thank them greatly for their understanding.

Comms connections will be installed in the streetlight poles (traffic lights are self-learning but sometimes need to be remotely adjusted).

Helenslee Road Minor Improvements

This project has been put on hold due to having an issue with the outlet of the stormwater, which runs on the overland flow path through a private property causing delays with the consent.

Construction works are now scheduled to commence in October 2024.

Pokeno Road - Bridge to Munro Rd

Expecting construction to kick off in January 2025 depending upon the outcome of resource consent application.

Great South Road and Pokeno Road Intersection Upgrade

Great news for the crew as the site is confirmed clear of any further asbestos piping.

We have now resolved the various design issues. Night works started on 21 April and are progressing well.

We've made a few adjustments to the traffic management as well following feedback from the community, and we will continue to tweak as we monitor traffic and progress with the works.
