There were no members of the public in attendance.

Roller Door Update

Agenda Item 6.1

The Community Led Development Advisor provided a verbal report and discussed the following:

- Staff had been working with Citycare on how to proceed with the roller door project
 to paint murals on the shop doors down Great South Rd. The project would bring in
 community groups to design and implement concepts. Noted that a competition could
 be held for the designs.
- First job would be to clean the doors and promote the project to the community, and get the community to inform the police if tagging takes place.
- The project would be partially funded by Citycare, Council and the Community Board.
- Graffitti guard would be placed on the doors, but the guard is not as effective on metal as it is on concrete. Graffitti guard is a considerable cost.
- Community Led Development Advisor noted that she will provide an information report regarding the project to the board.

ACTION: Community Led Development Advisor to provide the Ngaruawahia Community Board with a report for their next meeting with further information pertaining to the Roller Doors Project.

• Noted it was important to have control on how the murals would look, with the acknowledgement that the murals had to last for many years.

<u>Discretionary Fund Report to 30 August 2021</u> Agenda Item 6.3

The report was received [NCB2109/02 refers] and discussion was held.

 The Board had yet to receive the invoice from Belgravia Leisure for the subsidy of the Ngaruawahia Pools.

Ngaruawahia Senior Citizens and Friendship Club – Vintage Railway and Nikau Caves Agenda Item 6.4

The report was received [NCB2109/02 refers] and discussion was held.

- The total cost of the trip was \$3,065 and the funding request was for a total of \$1,000. The club had supplied quotes for the trip and completed the funding application. They had received funding from the board three (3) years ago.
- The club was very active and was an important social network for seniors in Ngaruawahia.
- Previous trips had been a highlight for the club members, and important for members who often don't venture out from Ngaruawahia.
- The board wished to allocate \$500 more to the funding application to further reduce costs for members attending the tour. This would total \$1,500, \$500 more than requested.

Minutes: 7 September 2021

Ngaruawahia Works and Issues Report: Status of Items September 2021 Agenda Item 6.5

The report was received [NCB2109/02 refers] and discussion was held.

- Speed Limits Waka Kotahi was looking to take over the review of speed limits in the
 future. Council was looking to work with the community before responsibility transfers
 to Waka Kotahi. Elected members and staff were working together to get consultation
 underway and Council was already taking on board feedback from the community.
 Timelines for the speed limit review were still to be confirmed, but consultation was
 scheduled to begin in November 2021.
- Service Request System This was a high priority project. Council was undertaking considerable work to integrate the system with alliance partners. Noted it was important to get a customer experience lens to ensure the system works for the community. It was important in the meantime to continue submitting service requests.
- The Council and the Department of Conservation would publish information of when the Hakarimata Track would re-open noting alert levels.

<u>Chairperson's Report</u> Agenda Item 6.8

The Chair gave a verbal report and answered questions of the Board.

- Noted he had been in contact with the architect for the photo signs to be remade.
 Quotes for the photo signs with installation costs total roughly \$4000.
- Question raised whether the board would be interested in having a community picnic once the community gets down to Level I. Food trucks could be invited and the Board supported the idea.

Councillors' Report Agenda Item 6.9

Crs Gibb and Patterson gave a verbal overview on current Council issues.

- Cr Gibb Acknowledged Turangawaewae for their efforts in organising vaccinations and helping the community with food and other resources during the lockdown. Councillors would be in representation review hearings this week, with two days of hearings.
- Cr Patterson Council was working to get clear information out regarding the Three Waters Reform. Council has yet to confirm a position on the reform. Concern regarding misinformation and it was important that Council be clear with the community with up to date information.

Community Board Members' Report Agenda Item 6.10

Members provided a verbal report on the following issues:

- Ms Rice Question raised whether pensioners would be penalised for late payment of rates due to the lockdown and it was noted they would not.
- Ms Morgan Koroneihana events were cancelled due to the lockdown, and food and resources were distributed throughout the Waikato for those in need. There had been Koroneihana online events, which had been successful. A new pou had been placed on the river bank, to honour Te Puia and the first whaanaus to arrive in Ngaruawahia. Maraes were pushing the need to get whaanau vaccinated and it was great to have a vaccination centre in Ngaruawahia.
- Mr Ayers Noted how grateful the community is for Turangawaewae and the help to get people vaccinated.

There being no further business the meeting was declared closed at 6:49pm.

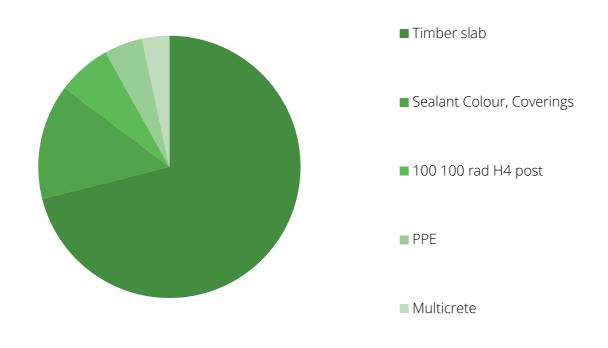

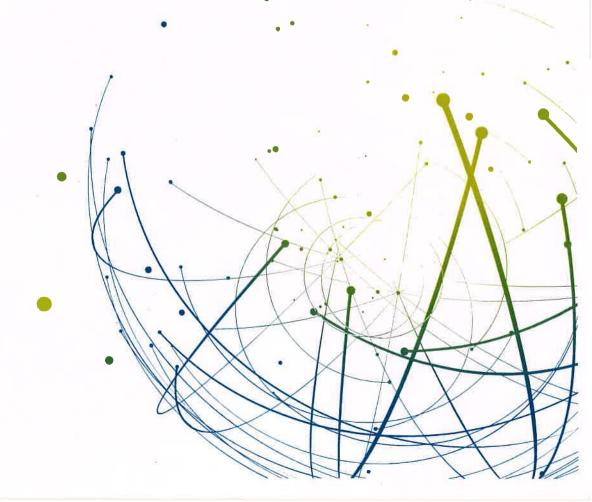

Kiwi Can

Kiwi Can is a life skills and values programme delivered to the whole (primary) school by trained Kiwi Can leaders, with every child attending a Kiwi Can lesson once a week, every week of the school year. Kiwi Can lessons have been shown to contribute to greater communication skills, social interaction, cooperation and displays of kindness and caring. School Principals tell us that the Kiwi Can programme has a noticeable effect on how well their children interact with each other – with significant decreases in truancy and bullying in the playground.

Stars Teina

Stars Teina is the follow-on programme from Kiwi Can in a suite of Graeme Dingle Foundation programmes that aims to: Inspire all school age New Zealand children to reach their full potential through programmes that help build self-confidence, promote good values and that teach valuable life, education and health skills. Stars Teina is a year 7 and 8 programme ideally suited for Intermediate Schools. It is designed to help students make a successful transition into Intermediate and Secondary school. It uses an inquiry based learning approach to strengthen the sense of community within a school, brings younger and older students together with a 'buddy system', develops positive relationships by encouraging older students to role model positive behaviour. The programme also builds student confidence and life-skills that can be transferred to their school and community.

Following a successful pilot programme at Tokoroa Intermediate School in 2019, Stars Teina continued in 2020.

Stars

Stars uses the teina / tuakana mentoring model and achieves positive and measurable results, including increased academic engagement and achievement for junior and senior (secondary school) students. Stars supports the successful transition for Year 9 students into their first year of secondary school. The programme also provides leadership and citizenship development opportunities for senior students, helping them to build confidence, improve communication and relationship building skills and strengthen their time management and planning skills, which together support increased social and academic outcomes. Stars involves matching trained Year 12 and 13 students as mentors to their Year 9 counterparts and has four components (adventure camp, peer mentoring, community adventure and a community project). Stars makes the transition into high school a more positive experience for Year 9 students.
