

Works and Issues Report

	Issue	Area	Action
1.	Wanting a new water fountain at skatepark.	Service Delivery/Cory Cullen	The current project budget is not sufficient to include a water fountain at this stage.
			Water fountains are usually installed as an add on item to existing infrastructure already connected to a water supply. With no existing water supply at the skatepark it would be a significant cost to provide a drinking fountain.
			The drinking fountain unit itself costs around \$3,500 plus freight, plus installation (including concrete pad). To supply the fountain with water requires a water meter for the park to be installed, then around 80m of trenching and pipeline installation and connection, backfill and reinstatement.
			The cost could be as much as \$10,000 or more as a standalone item.
			This is outside the scope of the current works. However, the request has been noted by the Open Spaces team for any future development planning at the park.
