<u>Update on Variation 3 to the Proposed Waikato District Plan</u> Agenda Item 6.1

The report was received [TCB2208/02 refers] and the following discussion was held:

- The Strategic Planning Team Leader provided an update on the work being undertaken to change the district plan to allow intensive housing.
- Changes to the RMA mean that Council was required to make changes to the district plan – the proposal was that these changes only apply to residential zones in Huntly, Ngāruawāhia, Pōkeno and Tuakau. Council referred to these changes as 'Enabling Housing Supply Variation 3'.
- Council was still in the process of working on the policy options and approach.
- Variation 3 would be notified to the public by 20 August 2022 and residents were encouraged to have their say. People would have the opportunity to make submissions, and additional information regarding submissions and the submissions and hearing process would be available when the public are notified.
- The draft Variation 3 would apply to the residential zones in Huntly, Ngāruawāhia, Pōkeno and Tuakau; and also proposed that the Medium Density Residential Zone be amended to add most of the government's density standards, without modification.
- It also proposed that some areas currently zoned General Residential Zone be rezoned as Medium Density Residential Zone and that the new controlled activity rules in the RMA be added to the subdivision chapter.
- The Board queried the implications these changes would have on infrastructure. Staff confirmed there was a requirement that developments would need to be able to connect with water and wastewater supply.
- Staff encouraged the Board to consider making a submission.

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<u>Ngāruawāhia, Hopuhopu & Taupiri Structure Plan / Ngāruawāhia Town Centre Plan Update</u> Agenda Item 6.2

The report was received [TCB2208/02 refers] and the following discussion was held:

- The purpose of the presentation was to inform the Taupiri Community Board of the Ngāruawāhia, Taupiri, & Hopuhopu Structure Plan review and the development of a Ngāruawāhia Town Centre Plan project and progress to date.
- Waikato District Council had completed a gap analysis of the existing 2017 Structure Plan, which identified where additional work was needed to better plan for and address the growth and development of these communities over the next 30 years.
- Council was going to engage with the communities over the coming months to hear what the communities see as the opportunities and issues facing the township/village and what could be done to address or action them as the township/village grows. To date Waikato District Council had engaged with a Marae representative from Taupiri and is expecting to meet with additional Marae representatives from Taupiri, Ngāruawāhia, and Hopuhopu before the end of July.
- The Board raised issue of safety and pedestrian connectivity, as there was no pedestrian option for getting to the Taupiri Cemetery. They also queried how the township could be connected to the service centre as well e.g. a walkway/cycleway connection.
- The Board nominated the Chair (Dorothy Lovell) as its local representative for the Town Centre Plan Update's Reference Group. The Strategic Planning Team Leader would contact the Chair with further information.
- ACTION: The Strategic Planning Team Leader would contact Dorothy Lovell with further information regarding her role as Taupiri representative for the Town Centre Plan Update's Reference Group.
