Native bush reserve, river cycleways and beach walks are just some of the ways people living in our district can explore the Waikato over summer.

Getting out and about in our own backyard has never been more fun as new walkways have opened up this year and the Te Awa River Ride project takes off.


The Allan Turner Walkway was officially opened in Tamahere during October and includes an impressive bridge across the Mangaharakeke stream, linking Woodcock Road and Fuchsia Lane.

Te Awa – the great New Zealand river ride is gathering momentum with work in progress to link Ngaruawahia to the Horotiu section. There is a 2km stretch of cycleway which Ngaruawahia residents can currently enjoy as it weaves its way alongside the Waikato river – running the length of the town.

The Hakarimata Summit Track in Ngaruawahia is also a very popular destination for walkers wanting a workout!

Coastal walks at Port Waikato and Raglan are well worth doing and both these destinations host Surf Lifesaving patrols over the summer months.

The Raglan beach patrol at Ngarunui Beach and the Sunset Beach patrol at Port Waikato began operating at Labour weekend and will continue until Easter 2015. You'll hear more about our Draft Sports Park Management Plan and General Reserve Policies Management Plan next month. Both will be available for you to provide feedback on in early 2015.


Smart Water

LET'S TALK rubbish!

Rubbish – it clutters our cupboards, fills our bins and clogs our landfills. There's only so much rubbish we can take so we're reviewing our rubbish and recycling habits.

Why? In 2012 we developed the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan to help achieve our goal of creating a sustainable community with a zero waste policy. To see if we were on the right track we surveyed a randomly selected group of residents and asked what they thought of our current rubbish and recycling services.

Here's what they said:

- · Council should do more to reduce waste going to
- More recycling crates and more places to drop off recycling
- · More rubbish in bags rather than wheelie bins.

Here's what we propose:

- Over 2,800 houses already receive a weekly rubbish collection but don't have recycling services. We'll extend weekly kerbside recycling to those houses too.
- Everyone who has a regular Council rubbish collection would have access to an inorganic collection by phone request. That means no more mess in our streets during the annual inorganic collection.

- · About 15,000 properties are on a fixed rate for weekly rubbish collection, either wheelie bins or bags. They'd change to a pre-paid rubbish service reducing the amount of waste to landfill. This might help the household budget - the less rubbish generated, the less spent on pre-paid bags.
- An upgrade of our Huntly and Te Kauwhata transfer stations. They'll likely be the hubs to process additional recyclables from inorganic collections.

So now we'd like to know what you think of the current rubbish and recycling services in your community and what it could be like in the future. Likely you have received a letter about changes to your property and hopefully provided feedback. We're compiling that information now and will come back to you in March with our preferred options as part of the Long Term Plan process.

IT'S A dog's life!

Our district has a wealth of beautiful parks and reserves that are perfect for exercising your four-legged friend. You can take your dog on a leash in almost all public parks and reserves in our district. We also have off-leash areas throughout the district, including beaches, where dogs are allowed to run free. We're reviewing the Dog Control Policy and Bylaw – this policy sets out the guidelines around dog exercise areas, how many dogs you can keep and what happens when a dog is impounded. Keep an eye out on how to have your say about the revised guidelines in mid January.



Pool Safety – make it everyone's responsibility

With summer approaching, pool owners have a legal responsibility to ensure their pool is fenced to comply with the requirements of the Fencing of Swimming Pools Act 1987.

It's Council's policy to undertake spot visits to ensure swimming pool fences comply with the Fencing of Swimming Pools Act 1987 and are safe. Council may visit your property at any time to undertake such a check. Please make sure your pool fencing meets the required standard as stated in the Act. If you're unsure you can call us on 0800 492 452 to check.

If you own a property, but don't live there and perhaps rent it to others, you have a duty to inform any occupiers or tenants of their responsibilities.

Pool owners and tenants also have a duty to ensure that gates and fences are checked regularly and remain in good working order.

Community project UPDATE 2014

Council and Community Boards have worked with a variety of district organisations to provide funding in order to get some fantastic projects off the ground this year.

Huntly Community Board

Ralph Mine Poppet Head

A replica of the Ralph Mine poppet head was installed between the BNZ and the car park on Huntly's main street to commemorate the Ralph Mine disaster 100th anniversary in September. It is located as close as practicable to the original site of the poppet head. The Huntly Lions Club was the key driver for this project.



Whaingaroa Community Toy Library

Earlier this year, the Raglan Community Board worked with the Whaingaroa Community Toy Library and granted funding to purchase new toys. This toy library has been operating since 2008, and has seen a marked increase in families wanting to hire educational toys for their young ones.

Discretionary and Funding Committee

Turangawaewae Regatta

Council's Discretionary and Funding Committee provided Turangawaewae Marae with some funds to assist with the 119th Turangawaewae Regatta, held in March this year. Some of the key highlights included school crews competing in the kopapa racing, and the grand parade of the mighty waka taua (war canoes). The event is one of New Zealand's most culturally unique experiences and attracts visitors from all over the country.

Funds also went towards the Te Kotahitanga Marae (Te Kumi pa) hosting a Matariki at the Pa event. This included Maaori music and dance, the art and design of making a korowai and a planting session, among other activities. The event attracted in excess of 400 people from the surrounding district.



The Raglan Community Arts Council also benefited from funding to assist with hosting the 2014 inaugural Raglan Arts Trail weekend in January. With 2015 funding, approximately 30 studios will once again open their doors to display a variety of visual arts.

The event showcases and promotes the multi-talented art scene that Raglan is well known for; bringing visitors from around New Zealand.

Ohinewai Tennis Club

The Ohinewai Tennis Club received funding to replace the tennis court concrete block wall that collapsed due to bad weather conditions. The wall is a vital component of the tennis club's training activities.

2014/2015 Annual Plan (Grants & Donations)

Puketaha School / Community Adventure Playground

Puketaha School received a donation to assist with building an adventure area that will encourage students to take risks, problem solve, use initiative, be creative, work collaboratively and have fun! This is located on Council Reserve land, behind the school.
