#### Purpose

The Policy & Regulatory Committee is responsible for the Council's governance policies and bylaws and reviewing the District Plan.

# *In addition to the common delegations on page 10, the Policy & Regulatory Committee is delegated the following Terms of Reference and powers:*

#### **Terms of Reference:**

- 1. To establish, implement and review the governance policy framework that will assist in achieving the Council's strategic priorities and outcomes.
- 2. To develop, review and approve Council bylaws for consultation.
- 3. To consider and determine changes to the schedules and parking restrictions in the Public Places Bylaw 2016, including hearing any submissions relating to those proposed changes.
- 4. To hear and determine matters arising under current bylaws, including applications for dispensation from compliance with the requirements of bylaws, unless such matters are otherwise delegated by Council.
- 5. To administer the Council's District Plan in accordance with the Resource Management Act 1991.
- To monitor the performance of regulatory decision-making by the District Licensing Committee<sup>1</sup>, Regulatory Subcommittee and officers under their respective delegations.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> For clarity, the District Licensing Committee is a committee of Council under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

#### The Committee is delegated the following powers to act:

#### **Governance** Policies

- Develop and agree governance policies for the purpose of consultation/engagement.
- Recommend to Council policy for adoption, amendment, or revocation.
- Monitor and review policy, including recommending amendments to any policy as and when required.

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#### **Bylaws**

- Determine all preliminary matters in relation to bylaws, except where expressly reserved for Council under legislation or the bylaw itself. For clarity, this delegation includes those matters to be determined under section 155 Local Government Act 2002.
- Develop and approve the statement of proposal and associated documentation for new or amended bylaws for consultation.
- Make any resolution where in a bylaw the Council has specified that a matter be regulated, controlled or prohibited by the Council by resolution.
- Recommend to Council new or amended bylaws for adoption.

#### District Plan

- Review and approve for notification a proposed district plan, a proposed change to the District Plan, or a variation to a proposed plan or proposed plan change (excluding any plan change notified under clause 25(2)(a), Schedule 1 of the Resource Management Act 1991)
- Withdraw a proposed plan or plan change under clause 8D, Schedule 1 of the Resource Management Act 1991.
- Make the following decisions to facilitate the administration of plan changes, variations, designation and heritage order processes:
  - a. To decide whether a decision of a Requiring Authority or Heritage Protection Authority will be appealed to the Environment Court by the Council and authorise the resolution of any such appeal, provided such decisions are consistent with professional advice.
  - b. To consider and approve Council submissions on a proposed plan, plan changes, and variations, unless expressly delegated to another decision-making body.
  - c. To monitor the private plan change process.
  - d. To accept, adopt or reject private plan change applications under clause 25, Schedule 1, Resource Management Act 1991.

#### Other Resource Management Issues

- Pursuant to Section 34(1) of the Resource Management Act 1991, to exercise all of the Council's functions, powers, and duties under that Act, except the functions, powers and duties:
  - a. that cannot be delegated or that are otherwise retained by the Council under its terms of reference; or
  - b. expressly delegated to other Council committees or decision-making bodies, or officers.
- Monitor and approve submissions in relation to National Policy Statements and National Environmental Standards.

#### **Other Delegations**

- Exercise all the Council's functions, powers and duties under the Building Act 2004, the Health Act 1956, the Dog Control Act 1996, and the Food Act 2014, and the respective regulations made under these Acts, except the functions, powers, and duties:
  - a. that cannot be delegated or that are otherwise retained by the Council under its terms of reference; or
  - b. expressly delegated to other Council committees or decision-making bodies, or officers.

# 1. Purpose of the report Te Take moo te puurongo

To enable the receiving and hearing of submissions on the Proposed Freedom Camping Bylaw 2023.

# 2. Executive summary Whakaraapopototanga matua

During 2022 and 2023, staff reviewed the Freedom Camping Bylaw 2016, which is due to be automatically revoked on 12 September 2023, with the intent to make a new freedom camping bylaw to replace the expiring one.

The Proposed Freedom Camping Bylaw 2023 was drafted with consideration of the amendments to the Freedom Camping Act 2011 as well as the feedback received through early engagement and Council workshops.

The main changes to the Proposed Bylaw included:

- Several amendments to align the Bylaw to the Freedom Camping Act 2011.
- Amendments to some of the district-wide restrictions including the number of nights a person can freedom camp in a particular area, and a requirement to move at least 500 metres away once they have stayed somewhere for the maximum number of nights.
- Clarifying the process and requirements for applying for an exception to a prohibition or restriction.
- Providing more information on what the public can expect when Council temporarily closes an area to freedom camp.
- Changes to a number of specific prohibited, restricted or designated areas.

A Special Consultative Procedure took place between 13 July and 14 August 2023. A total of 67 submissions were received on the Proposed Freedom Camping Bylaw.

# 3. Staff recommendations Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

That the Policy and Regulatory Committee, pursuant to section 83 of the Local Government Act 2002, considers all submissions and, where requested, hears submissions on the Proposed Freedom Camping Bylaw 2023.

# 4. Background Koorero whaimaarama

In accordance with section 158 of the Local Government Act (LGA) 2002, every bylaw must be reviewed no later than five years after the date on which it was made. Any bylaw which is not reviewed within the required timeframe continues to have legal effect under section 160A of the LGA until it is automatically revoked two years after the last date on which it should have been reviewed.

The Freedom Camping Bylaw 2016 was due for review by 12 September 2021 and was not reviewed before this date, therefore will be automatically revoked on 12 September 2023.

The review of the 2016 Bylaw began in 2022, with the intent to make a new freedom camping bylaw. After a workshop with Council in September 2022, early engagement with the public was conducted from 14 September 2022 to 19 February 2023 to obtain general feedback on the current operation of the 2016 Bylaw. Subsequently, additional specific feedback was sought from Community Boards and Committees, mana whenua and other key stakeholders, from 1 May to 29 May. This feedback, along with the site assessments of the current prohibited and restricted sites in the 2016 bylaw, was presented to a Council workshop on 7 June 2023.

The Self-contained Motor Vehicles Legislation Act 2023 came into force on 6 June 2023 amending the Freedom Camping Act 2011, and these amendments have been reflected where appropriate in the Proposed Bylaw.

The Proposed Freedom Camping Bylaw 2023 was drafted with consideration of the amendments to the Freedom Camping Act 2011 as well as the feedback received through early engagement and Council workshops.

The main changes to the Proposed Bylaw included:

- Amendment of the purpose of the Bylaw to align it with the Act.
- Incorporation of key definitions found within the Act by reference to ensure the most up-to-date interpretation of key terms are able to be used by the bylaw (such as *freedom camp*, *self-contained*, and *local authority area*), and to allow for Council to respond to the two-year transition period from one certification regime to another.

- Incorporating a reference to the NZ Standard 5465:2001 to support and provide further information to the definition of self-contained.
- Clarification and amendment of the district-wide restriction to apply a maximum number of nights a person can freedom camp in a particular area (previously, three, increased to five), and setting a requirement that they move at least 500 metres away once they have stayed in an area up to that maximum.
- Clarifying the process and requirements for people who may wish to apply for an exception to a prohibition or restriction.
- Providing more information on what communications and publicity the public can expect from Council when it exercises its power to temporarily close an area to freedom camp.
- Changes to specific areas which are prohibited or restricted as summarised below:
  - Te Huinga o Ngaa Wai (The Point), Ngaaruawaahia extension of current prohibited area to include the squash club
  - Sunset Beach, Port Waikato extension of current prohibited area to include entire carpark
  - Raglan CBD –exclusion of Stewart Street from the current prohibited area and redesignation of Stewart Street as a restricted area
  - Wainui Road, Raglan (near water treatment ponds) new prohibited area
  - o Wainui Road, Raglan (near Wainui Reserve bush park) new prohibited area
  - Te Kauwhata Domain, Mahi Road, Te Kauwhata reduction of current area where vehicles that are not self-contained can freedom camp, to limit freedom camping to one end of the carpark

All submissions received are included with this report in Attachment 2.

# 5. Discussion and analysis Taataritanga me ngaa tohutohu

A Special Consultative Procedure was undertaken between 13 July and 14 August 2023 to advise the public of the proposed changes from the 2016 bylaw and invite submissions on the proposed new bylaw. Staff used the following communication methods:

- Media release;
- Public notice;
- Online engagement tools;
- Emails to Community Boards and Committees, mana whenua, and other key stakeholders;
- Council's Facebook page.

Shape Waikato is Council's main portal for engagement with the community. The Freedom Camping Bylaw page on Shape Waikato received 1,184 views and 1,063 individual visitors. In total, Council received 67 formal submissions. Fifteen submitters have requested to be heard although this number may decrease as hearings scheduling progresses.

Social media (Facebook) data and comments received on the posts about the Proposed Bylaw are presented in Attachment 3. Please note that these are not considered to be formal submissions, however Council can choose to have some regard to these comments during deliberations.

# 5.1 Financial considerations

These hearings comply with section 83 of the Local Government Act 2002 and its relevant subsections.

2. These rules should not be a substitute for "common sense" nor should they result in "red tape" and an excess of "paperwork".

3. Visitors to the Waikato are unlikely to be aware of requirements for Freedom Camping in the district unless the Council has prominent and visible signs for them to see as they pass through the District.

4. Tamahere is not specifically referred to in the proposed Freedom Camping Bylaw 2023.

5. Rule 7.0 "Prior consent from Council" is poorly written and should be reviewed and the requirement for an application to be made 30 days prior to the proposed date to start camping, is designed for Council convenience not the convenience of the Applicant as a member of the Public. TCC seeks the following decision from the WDC:

- Rule 7.0 "Prior consent from Council" should be reviewed and rewritten. For example:

7.1 A person may Freedom Camp in a Restricted Area if granted prior consent from the Council and complying with any conditions for that consent.

7.2 Consent may be granted by the Council if, prior to the Freedom Camping activity:

a. It is applied for in writing, with payment of any relevant fee, and

#### Hi Lisa,

I just wanted to email with my concerns over the proposed changes to the freedom camping bylaw 2023 – in particular the proposed change for Stewart Street. I have lodged via the website, however, it stated 15<sup>th</sup> August on Facebook which was an error as it was meant to be the 14<sup>th</sup> August. So please do share my concerns with the relevant people. As a resident of Stewart Street for 13 years, I believe it is crucial to address certain aspects of the bylaw (zoning a selection Stewart Street) that could potentially impact our neighborhood.

Firstly, I would like to draw attention to the fact that Stewart Street is primarily a residential area with families & individuals as well as being home to church, the old school art centre, vulnerable people at the stewart street village and an early childcare center. Seriously what were they thinking that this could even be considered! It really doesn't need an explanation as to why this is unsuitable – but here is one:

I have listed the general concerns below, however, highlight that last year we had a stabbing with a screwdriver on a freedom camper, we have rubbish left on the street, the church is used as a toilet, we are kept awake, often feel unsafe especially on weekend drunken nights, parking issues for the church and market, and not forgetting this is a residential street with children, furthermore, it has a child care meters from the proposed location!!

My concerns above align with some of the well-documented issues associated with freedom camping in residential areas:

Noise and Disturbance: Residential streets should provide a peaceful environment for families and children. Introducing freedom camping will result in increased noise disruptions during late hours or early mornings, which will adversely affect the quality of life for our residents and the operation of the early childcare center and church.

Environmental Impact: Maintaining the cleanliness and environmental integrity of our neighborhood is essential. Without proper waste disposal facilities, freedom campers will inadvertently contribute to littering and pollution, damaging the natural surroundings – flowing directly into the harbour!

Sanitation and Hygiene: The lack of appropriate sanitation facilities for freedom campers will lead to unsanitary conditions that impact the health and well-being of both campers and local residents.

Traffic and Parking: this is some of the main parking in raglan town - residential streets are not designed to accommodate the increased traffic that freedom camping might bring. This could lead to congestion, hinder emergency vehicle access, and strain the available parking spaces, causing inconvenience for both residents and campers.

Security Concerns: security concerns for residents and the early childcare center, which is particularly concerning.

Amenity Usage: could be overused by freedom campers, limiting the availability of these amenities for those they were intended for.

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Given these potential issues, I kindly request that the council carefully consider the impact of the Freedom Camping Bylaw on Stewart Street. It is important to strike a balance between providing opportunities for adventure and preserving the tranquility, safety, and quality of life for residents, children / families at the early childcare center, and locals who use the facilities such as the market and church.

I would greatly appreciate an opportunity to discuss these concerns further and to explore possible solutions that could address the challenges raised by introducing freedom camping to our residential area.



Onewhero Reserve : In order for Freedom Camping to be successful there needs to be adequate infrastructure in place, along with adequate monitoring of compliance. The Onewhero Reserve has had numerous issues since Freedom Camping was first permitted there. These issues include the dumping of belongings and rubbish, regular breaking in to the Onewhero Rugby Clubrooms to gain access to hot showers and cooking facilities and the refusal of some campers to use the excellent WDC toilet facilities at the reserve, preferring to us the reserve as their toilet. Other issues include campers using the cold shower that WDC kindly installed for campers, and then parading around the clubroom area naked. While this may amuse some people, our children's playground is with 100m of the shower area so it is absolutely inappropriate. Freedom camping is not appropriately named. It may be free to the campers, but it certainly comes at a cost to WDC, and ultimately the rate payer. It also comes at a cost in this case to the Onewhero Rugby Club who end up cleaning up the dumped belongings, repairing their facility from ongoing efforts to break in and keeping the reserve neat and tidy for all its users. We support freedom camping in principle however to date the monitoring, compliance and rubbish facilities are not adequate. If camping is to continue to be permitted at the Reserve we urge that these three areas be significantly improved.

# WDC Proposed Freedom Camping Bylaw 2023 Submission

It was bought to the attention of the Raglan Congregational Church governing body by a church member that the Council intended to amend the Freedom Camping Bylaw 2016. This proposed Bylaw directly effects the Raglan Congregational Church which is located 1-5 Stewart Street. With this knowledge representatives of the Church attended the Community Board meeting on Tuesday 25 July and it was confirmed at that meeting that the western end of Stewart Street was currently a prohibited area and that plans were afoot to allow some restricted parking directly in front of the church and hall.

We understand from the above meeting and sourcing information on line that the Western end of Stewart Street, Map Reference no. WDC\_2016\_28, [Raglan CBD] parking area adjacent to 1 to 5 Stewart Street, is a prohibited area. The proposal is that this area be changed to a 'Restricted' area allowing self-contained vehicles parking in that location.

At our Church Leaders Meeting on 2 August 2023 this proposal was discussed and it was agreed that I write on behalf of the Church and oppose any change to the current parking arrangement.

# The reasons the church management oppose any change to site WDC\_2016\_28 [Raglan CBD] on Stewart Street are:

- 1. We wish to protect the area and the historic church that is erected on it. The church building itself represents 128 plus years of service to the community providing spiritual connection to the Lord Jesus Christ and Creator God, with the large grassed area providing peace and the presence of Holy Spirit, God's comforter. This area is always open to the public to stroll, refresh and reflect. It has within its confines water taps that have been seen to provide moisture to the parched strolling person and dog. However the church is fitted with Council water metres and must pay for all water consumption. We currently provide and pay for the water for the many people who use our facilities and our property but would be adverse in wanting to supply all the vans with water at our cost as they filled their containers from our accessible taps. Securing access to these taps for the churches use would be costly and would disadvantage those who use it at our cost now.
- 2. We wish to protect access to the area. Currently the property is unfenced and it is managements desire to have it remain unfenced so that the public can appreciate the park like grounds and have the freedom to enjoy them. Cost to fence our property would be horrendous and be contrary to what we want to offer the community. It is often used as a children's playground and for summer picnickers. People, who want to take their evening stroll in the grounds, could feel threatened by the vans that could proliferate the area in the evenings. Many of the vehicles being used as sleeper vans, generally rentals, are covered in graffiti that are insulting to the general public and totally opposed to the doctrine and spiritual values of the Bible and the Christian Church.
- 3. We wish to protect the safety and health of the people in the area. Some small sleeper vans even though classed as self contained, in contrast to the larger self-contained vehicles that do, often choose to use the outside areas for their bathroom habits. History has proven that our

property has been used in the past to urinate or defecate on. This has been sighted by Church members. It is bad enough picking up after the lazy dog owner without subjecting our congregation to this. Our grounds are used by the local community in the warmer/dryer months for the local Growers Market, a weekly evening event that requires not only the use of our grounds but available parking in the evening. The street is well used by people walking to and from school, to and from the play centre/kindergarten operating two doors up from the proposed location and the health and safety of all who walk the street coud be compromised. Then there is the aspect of rubbish disposal. The church wrote to the Council and requested a rubbish receptacle in February 2009 as our mail box gets used as a rubbish bin on a regular basis, with our mail being contaminated with general rubbish, soiled disposable nappies and used condoms. Always a 'treasure' to deal with for church members tasked with clearing the mail. Currently a health and safety issue, without it being exaggerated by allowing a row of campervans to park there legally. As an aside Council wrote to the church declining the request to provide a rubbish receptacle in the area at that time. Copy of letter available if required.

4. Great effort went in to opposing this in 2016. On reading the submissions from 2016, I am amazed that Council should choose to revisit opening this area up to restricted parking in the middle of a prohibited parking area in the CBD. I provide one quote from submitter No 39, David Hall on behalf of the Police. "The proposed areas on Wainui Road and Stewart Street are within the Liquor Ban area for the town. There is potential for campers to breach the liquor ban whilst living in their caravans. The proximity of the campers is too close to the CBD that in turn possess potential safety risks for persons moving to and from the CBD and licensed establishments. There are also potential risks to campers if they come in to contact with intoxicated persons leaving licensed premises at night......."

Church management oppose extending these approximately 13 parks for Freedom Camper Van Parking on Stewart Street.

The Raglan Congregational Church management request the site Western end of Stewart Street, Map Reference no. WDC\_2016\_28 parking area adjacent to 1 to 5 Stewart Street, allowing restricted parking be removed from the Proposed Waikato District Council Freedom Camping\_Bylaw\_2023 document.

We do not want such eye sores on the main thoroughfares. AS secretary of the Union Parish I often find rubbish stuffed in to the Church Letterbox. This would only become more frequent if freedom camping was allowed there. Xtreme waste trucks would have to service the areas daily (twice daily in summer), adding to congestion in already busy carparks.

3. The definition for freedom camp in this proposed by law 'means to camp (other than camping ground) within 200m of a motor accessible area using one or more of the following: (a) a tent or other temporary structure: (b) a caravan: (c) a car, campervan, house truck or other motor vehicle". This means that campers can now avoid the time-honoured way of camping at the local camping ground, and put their tents up etc. at the side of the fire station car park, and on the Church grounds. Why should they not pay the camping fees as others are prepared to do at camping grounds? What happens if a helicopter needs to land and there are tents all around the copter pad?

4. Freedom campers will be asked to vacate the area by 8am. How many freedom campers are going to observe this rule and be away by 8am? Already the parking area at the fire station is near full by 9am on weekdays, and the overflow is increasingly going on Stewart Street about that same time. It is much the same at weekends, especially on the monthly craft market Sunday operating as well as the Church Service. Who is going to police that these freedom campers would leave on time? Also campers can only park in

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these areas from 8pm onward. On wet, dark winter nights how many will want to park and get settled earlier? And then along comes some locals to attend an evening meeting at the fire station or Church/Hall only to find there is no parking for them. That is not right. And again, who is going to monitor this?

5. Freedom campers need to be near a shower, toilet facility, and running water and neither venue provides these.

Our proposals are as follows:

1. That Council: A) rescind the present bylaw venues at the Fire Station carpark and Stewart Street.

B) allow freedom campers to use the Kopua Domain where there are shower/toilet and running water facilities, a grey water disposal sump, as well as rubbish containers with space for Xtreme Waste trucks to turn, and/or

C) that Council purchase a suitable piece of fenced land, and erect the needed facilities, to be known exclusively as a freedom campers domain.

D) that Council re-word its present bylaw to allow 'freedom camping' only vehicles with current self-contained warrants displayed, who could then camp at (b) and (c) above. And that Council approach the Kokiri Marae Camping authorities, who have suitable facilities and minimal charges already in place, to advertise that they have camping for non-self-contained vehicles for the price of 'two cups of coffee'- that's not asking too much, surely.

Freedom Camping Report Greg Wiechern – Ngaruawahia Community Board

What exactly is freedom camping and what does it mean to ratepayers?

The camper/motorhomes: Freedom campers come in all shapes and sizes, whether it is a \$5000 van that has been converted to meet the Certified self contained standard NZS 5465, or a \$500,000 self contained professionally built motorhome. To meet this standard, the vehicle must have water and waste water systems to last the certified number of occupants for a minimum of 3 days.

The occupants: It is important to understand the variety of people who travel and stay at freedom camping zones.

1) Young travellers in simple camper vans, often from overseas. These travellers will generally be moving through New Zealand, staying in freedom campsites, often for a single night at each. These travellers may stay occasionally in camp grounds and Department of Conservation camps. Generally these young people will be travelling on a tight budget, with spending limited to food, fuel, running expenses and money for entrance fees to tourist attractions along the way. Camp grounds will generally be too expensive for them to stay at apart from the occasional night as they will be travelling for an extended period.

2) Overseas travellers in rental camper vans and motorhomes. These travellers will generally be moving through New Zealand, occasionally staying in freedom campsites, often for a single night at each. These travellers are more likely to stay in camp grounds and Department of Conservation camps as they will be travelling in our country for a shorter period, often only a month or less, and their budget is likely to be a lot larger. Sometimes they will be returning travellers who have come to New Zealand previously and bring their families with them, so want the comfort and security of commercial camp grounds.

3) New Zealanders in their own camper vans, caravans and motorhomes.

a) Members of the New Zealand Motor Caravan Association. These travellers are likely to use a mix of NZMCA member only camp grounds, Private park over properties, Department of Conservation camps, freedom camp sites and some commercial camp grounds.

b) Other New Zealand travellers. These travellers are likely to use a mix of Department of Conservation camps, freedom camp sites and some commercial camp grounds.

4) People and families in tents. Unfortunately this group are poorly catered for with many freedom camp sites being unavailable. Tents cannot be issued with self containment, although the vehicle that they travel in can be. For some families, the cost of commercial campsites and Department of Conservation camps are prohibitively expensive.

Why do people freedom camp:

1) Because the campsites have no charge

2) Many freedom campsites are in spectacular positions, on reserve areas adjacent to rivers, lakes and beaches that can't be used for other purposes and give access to walking tracks, bike trails and local attractions.

3) The enjoyment of selecting a spot away from other people that commercial camp grounds are unable to provide, yet close enough to others for security.

4) Being able to travel without booking

The benefits of the motorhome life:

1) Self contained campers generally have a small environmental foot print. Due to the size of their camper/caravan/motorhome tanks they use only a small quantity of water. (Personally we use about 35 litres of water per day for two people, including cooking, washing and showering) Due to the size of the vehicles, heating requirements for warmth is minimal.

Many campers/motorhomes have enough solar panels to be self sufficient for most of the year 2) For the 'Grey Nomads', (semi or retired people) there is 'Adventure before Dementia'. a) For some, they have a permanent property somewhere in the country and they will travel for weeks or months in different parts of New Zealand before returning home.

b) For some, their motorhome is their home and they will live in it full time while they are physically capable. For some this is by choice, for others, it is due to financial considerations.

3) There are valuable social considerations, especially for solo travellers. These include people who have lost a partner due to death or separation.

4) The freedom of living in a motorhome anywhere where internet is available, for people who can work online,

# The cost to ratepayers:

Motorhomes have a small environmental footprint. Most Councils and some businesses provide fresh water and dump stations. Generally quantities of rubbish and recycling are minimal.

#### The benefits for ratepayers:

1) Spending within the locality by the campers, including purchase of food, fuel, repairs, laundromats, items from small businesses. Spending is likely to be similar or greater than similar sized households and some local sports and social clubs get a boost to their funding from providing overnight parking.

The NZMCA alone has over 60,000 members, a valuable resource for local businesses and clubs within the Waikato District if promoted properly.

# Other Councils:

Many Councils support freedom camping for both motorhomes and some also have areas for people with tents.

There are 58 towns within New Zealand that promote themselves as Motorhome friendly.

Local Motorhome friendly towns include Paeroa, TeAroha, Morrinsville, Cambridge and Matamata. There are none in the Waikato District.

South Waikato District provide free hot showers in some of their freedom camp areas, although this is exceptional.

#### In conclusion:

Our district is large and hospitality for freedom campers is relatively inexpensive. Freedom camping allows more people and families to get out and about in our beautiful country and the benefits are much greater than can be shown on a financial spreadsheet.
