Purpose

The Policy & Regulatory Committee is responsible for the Council's governance policies and bylaws and reviewing the District Plan.

In addition to the common delegations on page 10, the Policy & Regulatory Committee is delegated the following Terms of Reference and powers:

Terms of Reference:

- I. To establish, implement and review the governance policy framework that will assist in achieving the Council's strategic priorities and outcomes.
- 2. To develop, review and approve Council bylaws for consultation.
- 3. To consider and determine changes to the schedules and parking restrictions in the Public Places Bylaw 2016, including hearing any submissions relating to those proposed changes.
- 4. To hear and determine matters arising under current bylaws, including applications for dispensation from compliance with the requirements of bylaws, unless such matters are otherwise delegated by Council.
- 5. To administer the Council's District Plan in accordance with the Resource Management Act 1991.
- 6. To monitor the performance of regulatory decision-making by the District Licensing Committee2, Regulatory Subcommittee and officers under their respective delegations.

The Committee is delegated the following powers to act:

Governance Policies

- Develop and agree governance policies for the purpose of consultation/engagement.
- Recommend to Council policy for adoption, amendment or revocation.
- Monitor and review policy, including recommending amendments to any policy as and when required.

Bylaws

- Determine all preliminary matters in relation to bylaws, except where expressly reserved for Council under legislation or the bylaw itself. For clarity, this delegation includes those matters to be determined under section 155 Local Government Act 2002.
- Develop and approve the statement of proposal for new or amended bylaws for consultation.
- Make any resolution where in a bylaw the Council has specified that a matter be regulated, controlled or prohibited by the Council by resolution.
- Recommend to Council new or amended bylaws for adoption.

District Plan

- Review and approve for notification a proposed district plan, a proposed change to the District Plan, or a variation to a proposed plan or proposed plan change (excluding any plan change notified under clause 25(2)(a), Schedule I of the Resource Management Act 1991)
- Withdraw a proposed plan or plan change under clause 8D, Schedule I of the Resource Management Act 1991.
- Make the following decisions to facilitate the administration of plan changes, variations, designation and heritage order processes:
 - a. To decide whether a decision of a Requiring Authority or Heritage Protection Authority will be appealed to the Environment Court by the Council and authorise the resolution of any such appeal, provided such decisions are consistent with professional advice.
 - b. To consider and approve Council submissions on a proposed plan, plan changes, and variations.
 - c. To monitor the private plan change process.
 - d. To accept, adopt or reject private plan change applications under clause 25, Schedule I, Resource Management Act 1991.

Other Resource Management Issues

- Pursuant to Section 34(I) of the Resource Management Act 1991, to exercise all of the Council's functions, powers and duties under that Act, except the functions, powers and duties:
 - a. that cannot be delegated or that are otherwise retained by the Council under its terms of reference; or
 - b. expressly delegated to other Council committees or decision-making bodies, or officers.
- Monitor and approve submissions in relation to National Policy Statements.

Other Delegations

- Exercise all of the Council's functions, powers and duties under the Building Act 2004, the Health Act 1956, and the Food Act 2014, and the respective regulations made under these Acts, except the functions, powers and duties:
 - a. that cannot be delegated or that are otherwise retained by the Council under its terms of reference; or
 - b. expressly delegated to other Council committees or decision-making bodies, or officers.
- Approval of attendance of elected members at conferences, seminars, training or events, in accordance with Council policy.

Purpose of the report Te Take moo te puurongo

To update the Policy and Regulatory Committee on progress made on the Policy and Bylaw Review Programme since the previous report in September 2022.

2. Executive summary Whakaraapopototanga matua

Staff have worked on updating several bylaws and policies since September 2022. Policy work has focused on the Development Contributions policy review, the Strategic Property policy suite review, and working to establish plans with people leaders to further progress the review of policies under their remit. Reviews of the Public Places, Cemeteries, Freedom Camping, Trade Waste and Wastewater and Traffic bylaws have continued and are at varying stages in the review process.

Details of where each bylaw is at in the review process are in Attachment 1.

Details of where the policy review programme is at are in Attachment 2.

3. Staff recommendations

Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

THAT the Policy and Regulatory Committee receives the March Update on the Policy and Bylaw Review Programme.

4. Discussion Matapaki

Policies

Waikato District Council has 93 policies that relate to a broad range of legislation and Council activities. While some are on legislated review cycles, policies not required by legislation are usually reviewed every three to five years, or as required. Policies that are required by legislation are given higher priority than those that are not.

Bylaws

Under section 156 of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA), bylaws must be reviewed five years after they are made and every 10 years thereafter. The LGA allows bylaws to remain in force for two years after their review period (i.e. years six and seven after the first review and years 11 and 12 thereafter).

Review Process

The process of review often starts with discussion in a Council workshop to identify any issues or improvements related to the policy or bylaw. Once these have been discussed and considered by Council, staff will work through these and produce a report seeking consultation approval from the Policy and Regulatory Committee.

Consultation then occurs, as appropriate, under section 82 (principles of consultation) or 83 (Special Consultative Procedure) of the LGA. The results of the consultation are presented to the Committee who can request further changes or corrections to the policy or bylaw in response to submissions. The Committee may recommend that Council formally adopts the policy or bylaw. The adopted policy or bylaw is publicly notified, and the review is complete. The whole process can take anywhere from eight to 18 months depending on the complexities of the document and related issues.

A review may be triggered by a legislated review period or change in legislation, a political driver or an issue having been identified that requires an amendment.

Progress since September 2022

Policies and bylaws are key decision-making and regulatory monitoring documents. They need to be kept up to date so any decision or enforcement action using the bylaw or policy that is taken by Council is appropriate and consistent.

Staff seek approval to revoke the Funding for Road Closures for Community Events Policy (2009).

Policies are key decision-making documents and therefore need to be kept up to date to ensure that decisions being made are appropriate and consistent. This policy is no longer required as it is out-of-date and unnecessary.

The policy proposed to be revoked has been attached to this report.

3. Staff recommendations Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

THAT the Policy and Regulatory Committee recommends to Council:

a. that the Funding for Road Closures for Community Events Policy 2009 be revoked with immediate effect.

4. Background Koorero whaimaarama

Since late 2021, staff have been focusing on Council's policy review programme to ensure all policies are up to date and old policies are revoked. Council currently has 47 governance policies. All of these policies are either current or are being reviewed. Best practice is that policies be reviewed every three years. However, to progress the policy review programme, it has been agreed that policies will be reviewed at five-yearly intervals until three-yearly intervals become more manageable.

Discussion and analysisTaataritanga me ngaa tohutohu

A summary of the Funding for Road Closures Policy is noted below along with the reasons for revocation.

This policy outlines how Traffic Management Plans (TMPs) for community events could be funded by Council. It also outlines the event criteria and makes specific mention of the annual Koroneihana o Kiingi Tuheitia (coronation) celebrations.

Consultation has been sought internally and it was agreed that the policy could be revoked. The following points were raised regarding funding for road closures and TMPs:

- Community Boards have taken on responsibility for events such as Christmas Parades;
- Anzac Day parades are funded through the Mayoral Discretionary Fund;
- The Koroneihana Committee (a community organisation) has assumed responsibility for Koroneihana;
- The Contracts and Partnering Manager has advised that the costs for TMPs have risen significantly due to new legislation around development and approval and there are no budgets to cover any of these costs.

5.1 Options

Ngaa koowhiringa

Staff have assessed that there are two reasonable and viable options for the Committee to consider.

Option 1 - Revoke the policy

The policy is no longer required as it has been deemed to be out of date and of little to no value in its current form. Funding for road closures for community events such as Anzac Day parades, Christmas parades and Koroneihana celebrations are funded by separate budgets or organisations:

- Anzac Day Parade TMPs are paid from the Mayoral Discretional Fund;
- Christmas Parades are community led and TMPs are funded through applications to Community Boards or the Rural Ward Fund;
- Koroneihana TMPs are paid by the Koroneihana Community Committee.

This option is recommended.

Option 2- Retain the policy mentioned above

The policy could be retained, however is currently out of date and is no longer in use. The policy, as it stands, offers funding for road closures that there are no existing budgets for.

This option is not recommended.

5.2 Financial considerations

Whaiwhakaaro puutea

Use of this policy could potentially create significant costs for Council, in needing to pay for Traffic Management Plans for community events, that there are no existing Community or Roading budgets for.

5.3 Legal considerations

Whaiwhakaaro-aa-ture

Staff confirm that the preferred option complies with the Council's legal and policy requirements.

5.4 Strategy and policy considerations

Whaiwhakaaro whakamaaherehere kaupapa here

The report and recommendations are consistent with the Council's policies, plans and prior decisions.

5.5 Maaori and cultural considerations

Purpose of the report Te Take moo te puurongo

To seek the Committee's recommendation to Council to adopt the Appointment and Remuneration of Directors Policy.

2. Executive summary Whakaraapopototanga matua

The proposed Appointment and Remuneration of Directors Policy, if adopted, will replace the existing Appointing Directors and Trustees to Council Controlled Organisation Policy.

The proposed Policy has been drafted through a legislative requirements lens and seeks balance in administrative effort by broadening the application to cover appointments to all Council organisations and removing content held in other governing documents. From a risk perspective the proposed policy sets clear parameters for the appointment and remuneration of elected members and/or Council employees as directors.

The significance of this policy while required by legislation is low. The political uncertainty and potential for changes to legislative reforms may require new entities or shareholdings to be established within our region which the policy would allow for.

No engagement has taken place on the development of this policy, noting that establishment of a new entity or shareholding is required to be consulted on in full.

3. Staff recommendations Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

THAT the Policy and Regulatory Committee recommends to Council that:

- a. the Appointing Directors and Trustees to Council Controlled Organisation Policy (2014) is revoked; and
- b. the Appointment and Remunerations of Directors Policy is adopted.

4. Background Koorero whaimaarama

In 2014 Council reviewed and adopted a policy on the Appointment of Directors and Trustees to Council-controlled Organisations (CCO's). This policy was due for review in 2017, however, during the three-year period a number of changes occurred that rendered that policy vastly out of date.

Since the policy was adopted Council-controlled Trading Organisation (CCTO), Strada Corporation Limited, was wound up (currently a dormant company), the company constitution for Waikato Local Authority Shared Services Limited (trading as Colab) was updated with adjustments to the appointment and remuneration process and Council, through a Deed of Gift, transferred the assets of the Waikato District Community Wellbeing Trust to Momentum Waikato.

The Office of the Auditor General's report on the governance and accountability of council-controlled organisations was also released during this period which identified a number of weaknesses in local authority policy regarding appointment of directors to CCOs.

Discussion and analysisTaataritanga me ngaa tohutohu

The focus of the policy review has been on ensuring the following outcomes are achieved; best practice/legislative compliance, policy longevity and flexibility, and clarity of position on appointment and remuneration of elected members and/or Council employees as directors or trustees.

Legislative requirements

The legislative requirements of section 57 of the Local Government Act 2002 states the following:

Appointment of directors

- (1) A local authority must adopt a policy that sets out an objective and transparent process for:
 - a) the identification and consideration of the skills, knowledge, and experience required of directors of a council organisation; and

- b) the appointment of directors to a council organisation; and
- c) the remuneration of directors of a council organisation.
- (2) A local authority may appoint a person to be a director of a council organisation only if the person has, in the opinion of the local authority, the skills, knowledge, or experience to:
 - a) Guide the organisation, given the nature and scope of its activities; and
 - b) Contribute to the achievement of the objectives of the organisation.
- (3) When identifying the skills, knowledge, and experience required of directors of a council-controlled organisation, the local authority must consider whether knowledge of tikanga Māori may be relevant to the governance of that council-controlled organisation.

The 2014 Policy specifically addressed appointments and remuneration of directors and trustees of Council-controlled organisations. However, Council also has non-controlling interests in other organisations, typically not-for-profit bodies that promote community well-being. The proposed Appointment and Remunerations of Directors Policy covers appointments to these organisations as well as CCO's.

Boards should be made up of a diverse range of people who are able to bring relevant expertise to the organisation. Policy statements 6.2 to 6.4 outlines the skills, experience and diversity expectations and captures tikanga Maaori considerations that were not specified in the prior policy.

Policy longevity and flexibility

The proposed policy has been drafted based on a set of high-level principles. Detail contained in other governing documents (trust deeds, company constitutions etc.) is referred to in the policy but not duplicated. This safeguards Council's Appointment and Remuneration of Directors' Policy from becoming out-of-date when CO's governing documents are adjusted. Having policy statements at a high level also allows for an extension of the policy review period. The suggested timeframe has moved from three years to five years.

Noting that a local authority cannot establish or become a shareholder in a CCO without consultation taking place in accordance with section 82 of the Local Government Act 2002, the policy also sets the considerations that will need to be worked through to support the appointment and remuneration of directors of any new shareholding.

Clarity regarding appointment and remuneration of elected members and Council employees

Sometimes Council may want to appoint elected members to a CO Board. Council needs to take care when appointing elected members as directors of COs because this may:

- Create a conflict between their obligations to the CO and their obligations to the Council, and
- Create negative community perceptions of the appointment.

The proposed policy does not prohibit elected members from being appointed to COs (where Council does not have a controlling interest) but does exclude Council from appointing elected members to CCOs and/or CCTOs to protect both the elected member and Council from unmanageable conflicts arising.

The considerations for Council employees are similar, however, the subject matter expertise required for directorship of the Waikato Local Authority Shared Services Limited T/A Colab (at Chief Executive level) creates an exception to the rule of not appointing Council employees to the board of a CCO. The proposed policy does prohibit Council employees from being appointed to CCTOs.

Council employees may have additional conflicts of interest arising from:

- Their duty to follow Council policies,
- Their duty to advise the local authority on the performance of the CO/CCO, and
- The duty of confidentiality owed to the CO/CCO.

To reduce conflicts related to Colab, the policy ownership has been transferred to the Chief Financial Officer. Recommendations for appointment and /or remuneration considerations for Colab are prepared at arms-length from the Chief Executive.

Elected members and Council employees appointed as directors will not receive any remuneration for the role.

Well-being considerations

The appointment of director/s process should consider diversity and strength of skills, expertise and experience (including tikanga Maaori) to provide value to the organisation and Council, and in the case of CCTO's a financial return. These considerations are broadbased and depending on the activities of the organisation should enhance one or more of the social, economic, cultural and environmental wellbeings.

5.1 Options

Ngaa koowhiringa

Staff have assessed that there are two reasonable and viable options for the Committee to consider. This assessment reflects the level of significance (see paragraph 6.1) and the legislative requirements. The Committee could recommend that Council adopts the policy as attached to the report, or alternatively could request changes are made before a recommendation for adoption is presented to Council.

Staff recommend the draft Appointment and Remuneration of Directors Policy is recommended to Council for adoption as attached as it addresses the legislative requirements, issues of longevity and flexibility and clarity of managing conflicts at the elected member and Council employee level.

5.2 Financial considerations

Whaiwhakaaro puutea

There are no material financial considerations associated with the recommendations of this report. When considering options for new shareholdings and the review of existing shareholdings it is worth noting the influence board appointments can have on the financial performance of an organisation. Council should ensure that the governing documents and recommended process for setting remuneration of directors is appropriate.

5.3 Legal considerations

Whaiwhakaaro-aa-ture

Staff confirm that proposed Appointment and Remuneration of Directors Policy complies with the legal requirements as per section 57 of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA).

5.4 Strategy and policy considerations

Whaiwhakaaro whakamaaherehere kaupapa here

The report and recommendations are consistent with the Council's policies, plans and prior decisions.

5.5 Maaori and cultural considerations

Whaiwhakaaro Maaori me oona tikanga

A Policy adopted under section 57 of the LGA requires consideration of tikanga Maaori.

Tikanga is a concept that incorporates practices and values from maatauranga Maaori (knowledge). It is wide ranging and spans cultural protocols, customary considerations and more. The proposed policy anticipates that the Council will consider matters of tikanga Maaori before making appointment decisions.

5.6 Climate response and resilience considerations

Whaiwhakaaro-aa-taiao

The matters in this report have no known impact on climate change or resilience for the Council. However, as each appointment of a director is made the ties to climate response and resilience considerations should be considered in terms of the activities of the particular organisation.

5.7 Risks

Tuuraru

The proposed policy statements are aimed at mitigating the main risks associated with appointing directors. This is achieved via specifying the skills, expertise and experience necessary, removing conflicts of duties for elected members and Council employees and hopefully reducing reputational risk. The policy require appointed directors to comply with the provisions of the New Zealand Institute of Directors' Code of Ethics, and outlines the dismissal process.

6. Significance and engagement assessment Aromatawai paahekoheko

6.1 Significance

Te Hiranga

The decisions and matters of this specific report are assessed as of low significance in accordance with the Council's <u>Significance and Engagement Policy</u>. However, with legislative reform and political policy announcements in the lead up to the election there is potential for new CCOs to be created, at which time the assessment of significance could shift to moderate or high significance based on the need to consult with the community.

Introduction

Council owns shares in a number of organisations that are defined as Council Controlled Organisations (CCO) by the Local Government Act 2002. These are:

Strada Corporation Limited (100% owned by Council).

This company delivers civil engineering and open space management services. The Council has the right to appoint all directors.

The Strategy & Finance Committee of Council monitors the performance of Strada Corporation Limited.

His Worship the Mayor is our Shareholder representative as he holds all the shares.

Waikato Regional Airport Limited

Council owns a 15.625% shareholding. This company manages and operates the Hamilton International Airport. Other shareholders of this company are:

- Hamilton City Council	50.000%
- Matamata-Piako District Council	15.625%
- Waipa District Council	15.625%
- Otorohanga District Council	3.125%

Council must co-operate with the other shareholders for the appointment of directors.

The Strategy & Finance Committee of Council monitors the performance of Waikato Regional Airport Limited.

The Council's shareholder representatives are His Worship the Mayor and, in his absence, the Deputy Mayor. Council must co-operate with the other shareholders for the appointment of directors.

Local Authority Shared Services Limited (LASS)

Council holds an equal shareholding with 11 other Waikato local authorities. The Council has the right to appoint one Director.

The performance of LASS is monitored by the Chief Executive and reported on a six-monthly basis to the Strategy & Finance Committee.

Council is also involved in the Waikato District Community Wellbeing Trust.

This Trust was formed out of proceeds from the winding up of the Waikato Foundation Trust. The Trust invests its funds and provides grants to the community.

Council appoints Trustees and the performance of the Trust is monitored by the Strategy & Finance Committee on an annual basis.

Objectives

To outline Council's policy on appointments and remuneration of Directors and Trustees of Council Controlled Organisations.

Policy Statements

1.0 APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

I.I General

Council considers that persons to be considered for directorship must have the skills, knowledge and experience to:

- i) guide the organisation given the nature and scope of its activities
- ii) contribute to the achievement of the objectives of the organisation
- iii) deliver a financial return on shareholder investment

1.2 Skills Required

Council considers any person that it appoints to be a director of a Council Controlled Organisation should, as a minimum, have the following skills:

- i) effective governance experience
- ii) either business experience or other experience that is relevant to the activities of the organisation (or both)
- iii) sound judgement
- iv) a high standard of personal integrity
- v) the ability to work as a member of a team
- vi) ability to drive performance and financial return
- vii) proven record of success in business growth and development

1.3 Recruitment and Appointment Process

Council will not appoint elected representatives as directors of Council Controlled Organisations.

When vacancies arise in each Council Controlled Organisation, the Council will undertake the following process:

a) Strada Corporation Limited

The Council will identify potential directors through various sources, such as the Institute of Directors and knowledge in the community. These people will be approached to establish their interest in being a director.

A Council appointed sub-committee comprising of His Worship the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor, the Chairperson of the Strategy & Finance Committee and the Chief Executive will then undertake the recruitment process. Any proposed appointments will be confirmed by the Council.

b) Waikato Regional Airport Limited

The appointment of directors is undertaken jointly with the other four shareholding councils. The Council has delegated authority to a Waikato Regional Airport Limited sub-committee comprising His Worship the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor, the Chairperson of the Strategy & Finance Committee and the Chief Executive to approve future director appointments to the Waikato Regional Airport Limited Board having followed due process and ensuring compliance with the requirements of the Local Government Act. Any proposed appointments will be advised to the Council.

c) LASS

Council's representative will be the Chief Executive subject to having the suitable skills, knowledge and experience for the director role.

1.4 Final Appointment of Directors

Public announcements of the appointments will be made as soon as practicable after the Council and/or shareholding Councils have made a decision.

1.5 Waikato District Community Wellbeing Trust

The Council will identify potential trustees through various sources, such as the Institute of Directors and knowledge in the community. Any suitable candidates identified will be approached to establish their interest in being a trustee of the Trust.

A Council appointed sub-committee comprising His Worship the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor, the Chairperson of the Discretionary & Funding Committee, the Chairperson of the Strategy & Finance Committee and the Chief Executive is responsible for undertaking a recruitment process for the appointment of trustees. Any proposed appointments will be confirmed by the Council.

2.0 CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

The Council expects that directors of CCOs will avoid situations where their actions could give rise to a conflict of interest. To minimise these situations the Council requires directors to follow the provisions of the New Zealand Institute of Directors' Code of Ethics. All directors are appointed 'at the pleasure of the Council' and may be dismissed for breaches of this code.

3.0 REMUNERATION

Remuneration of directors of CCOs is a matter of public interest.

In the case of **Strada Corporation Limited**, the Council will set the directors' remuneration by resolution at the Annual General Meeting. On reaching a view on the appropriate level of remuneration for directors for Strada Corporation Limited the Council will consider the following factors:

- i) the need to attract and retain appropriately qualified directors
- ii) the level and movement of remuneration in comparable organisations the Council will seek professional advice on this issue
- iii) the past performance of Strada Corporation Limited
- iv) the financial position of Strada Corporation Limited.

In the case of the **Waikato Regional Airport Limited** the setting of directors' remuneration will follow the same process set out above, acknowledging that the Council is only a minority shareholder in this organisation and therefore must seek the co-operation of the other shareholders prior to finalising the directors' remuneration.

The Council will set or agree on the total quantum of remuneration and leave it to the individual boards to determine the appropriate split of those fees amongst individual directors.

In the case of LASS and the Waikato District Community Wellbeing Trust, no remuneration is payable.

Policy Review

This policy will be reviewed as deemed appropriate by the Chief Executive, or at least once every three years.

I Introduction

I.I Local Authorities must have an objective and transparent process for appointing directors to a Council organisation. Appointing directors is an important role, because it is one of the Council's principal means for influencing the performance of Council organisations.

For a board to be fully effective, it should comprise directors with a range of complementary skills and experience to ensure that ideas are challenged and tested, and that decision-making is robust.

2 Purpose

- 2.1 The purpose of this policy, as per section 57 of the Local Government Act 2002, is to provide an objective and transparent process for:
 - The identification and consideration of the skills, knowledge and experience required of directors of Council organisations;
 - The appointment of directors to Council organisations; and
 - The remuneration of directors of Council organisations.

3 Definitions

The following definitions provide guidance. The detailed definitions are contained within Section 6 of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA)

Company: Means a body corporate.

Council: Includes any committee, sub-committee or community board to which Council has delegated authority.

Council organisation (CO): Is an organisation in which Council controls any voting rights or the right to appoint directors.

Council-controlled organisation (CCO): Is CO in which Council controls, directly or indirectly, 50% or more of the voting rights or can appoint 50% or more of the directors.

Appointment and Remuneration of Directors Policy

Council-controlled trading organisation (CCTO): Is a CCO that operates a trading undertaking for the purpose of making a profit.

Directors: Includes company directors, trustees, managers and office holders of an organisation (s6(3)(b), LGA).

Governing document: Is a document of an organisation or company that sets out the purpose and describes its structure and internal procedures such as a trust deed or company constitution.

LGA: Local Government Act 2002.

Organisation: Includes partnerships, trusts, arrangements for sharing profits, unions of interest, corporations, joint ventures and similar arrangements.

4 Application

4.1 This policy applies to all appointments of directors by Council to Council Organisations, Council-controlled Organisations and Council-controlled Trading Organisations.

5 Strategic Criteria

- 5.1 Before appointing a director(s) to any organisation, Council will assess its involvement against the following strategic criteria:
 - The organisation's goals and objectives which must fit with Council's direction as stated in strategic planning documents.
 - Any appointment must add value to the organisation and to Council.
 - The benefits of appointing a director(s) must outweigh other methods of achieving Council's objectives.

6 Policy statements

Appointment of Directors and Trustees

6.1 General

Council considers that persons to be considered for directorship must have the skills, knowledge and experience to:

- guide the organisation given the nature and scope of its activities,
- contribute to the achievement of the objectives of the organisation,
- deliver a return on shareholder investment.

6.2 Skills Required

Council will seek the following skills and attributes in CO directors:

- Knowledge and experience relevant to the position,
- Understanding of governance issues,
- High standard of personal integrity,

Appointment and Remuneration of Directors Policy 2023

- Sound judgement,
- Ability to appreciate the wider public interest.

For CCO and CCTO appointments Council will seek the following additional skills and attributes:

- Effective governance experience,
- Ability to drive performance and financial returns (where applicable),
- Proven record of success in business growth and development.
- 6.3 When identifying the skills, knowledge and experience required of directors Council must consider whether knowledge of tikanga Maaori may be relevant to the governance of that CO, CCO, or CCTO.
- 6.4 Consideration will be given to the mix of skills and experience, complementing and reinforcing existing skills, reducing known skill gaps and increasing diversity where necessary.

Recruitment and Appointment Process

- 6.5 Council will not appoint elected members as directors of CCOs or CCTOs.
- 6.6 Council will not appoint Council employees as directors of CCTOs.
- 6.7 Authority to appoint directors is covered within the governance structure approved at the start of each triennium.
- 6.8 For existing organisations, Council will follow the appointment process stipulated by the CO, CCO and/or CCTO's governing document or that prescribed by the majority shareholder.
- 6.9 For new shareholdings in a CCO and/or CCTO, Council will ensure that the following is included in the organisations governing document and/or majority shareholder's appointment policy:
 - The process for identifying candidates,
 - The process for assessing candidate's skills,
 - The composition of the appointment panel,
 - The role of the Chair, and
 - The process for setting director remuneration.
- 6.10 Public announcements of appointments will be made as soon as practicable after the Council and/or shareholding Councils have made a decision.

7 Conflicts of Interest

The Council expects that directors of COs, CCOs and CCTOs will avoid situations where their actions could give rise to a conflict of interest.

To minimise these situations the Council requires directors to follow the provisions of the New Zealand Institute of Directors' Code of Ethics.

Appointment and Remuneration of Directors Policy 2023

8 Dismissal of Directors

All directors are appointed 'at the pleasure of the Council' and may be dismissed by way of Council or relevant Committee resolution.

9 Remuneration of Directors

Directors appointed by Council will receive the remuneration (if any) offered by that organisation, with the following exceptions:

- Elected members appointed by Council to CO's may not receive the remuneration (if any) offered by that CO,
- Council employees (including the Chief Executive) appointed to a CO or CCO may not receive the remuneration (if any) offered by that organisation.

10 Policy review

This policy shall be reviewed at five yearly intervals or as otherwise required by the Chief Executive or Chief Financial Officer.

1. Purpose of the report

Te Take moo te puurongo

To make a recommendation to Council to approve the amended schedules of the Speed Limits Bylaw 2011.

2. Executive summary Whakaraapopototanga matua

A review of the Speed Limits Bylaw 2011 occurred in 2021 and was adopted by Council at their meeting on 23 May 2022. Installation of the new speed signs were scheduled at the end of 2022. When the new speed signs were implemented several errors in the schedules were found. Those errors are mainly administrative and primarily relate to the speed limits outside of schools. This report seeks recommendation to amend the schedules under section 5 of the Waikato District Council Speed Limits Bylaw pursuant to section 151 of the Local Government Act 2002, allowing Bylaw schedules to be amended by Council resolution.

3. Staff recommendations

Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

THAT the Policy and Regulatory Committee approves and recommends to Council:

a. adoption of the amendments to the Speed Limits Bylaw 2011 schedules.

4. Background Koorero whaimaarama

A review of the Speed Limits Bylaw was undertaken and adopted by Council on 23 May 2022. Over 300 speed limit amendments were approved and during the installation of over 700 signs, errors in the schedules were found. These errors primarily relate to the speed limits proposed outside of schools.

The original consultation proposed for all urban schools to have permanent speed limit reductions to 40km per hour within their vicinity and Rural schools were proposed to have a variable speed limit of 60km during specified times of 8am–9am and 2.30-3.30pm only. Following feedback and hearings, through the deliberations process, the decision was made to install variable speed limits outside of both urban and rural schools between 8am–9am and 2.30-3.30pm.

Section from Adoption report at P&R Meeting 3 May 2022.

Rural Schools

The following options were identified based on feedback and Option 2 was selected during deliberations.

Option 1	Keep the proposed school hours (variable 8am-3pm) with minor extension in afternoon to 3:30pm, 60km/h other times
Option 2	Keep the proposed school hours variable to school start and end only 8am-9am and 2:30-3:30 pm, 60km/h other times
Option 3	Make the School Zone speeds permanent (all hours)

Urban Schools

The following options were identified based on feedback and Option 2 was selected during deliberations.

Option 1	Keep the proposed urban school speeds (Permanent 40km/hr)
Option 2	Variable 40km/hr speed past schools during school hours only 8am-9am and 2:30-3:30 pm, 50km/h other times

During the approval process the permanent speed limits that were in the original schedules for urban school roads were not removed and this has resulted in sections of road within school zones having both a lower permanent speed limit and a variable speed limit for the same road.

These administrative errors were not picked up until the signage installation process began and this report seeks to amend those errors by updating the schedules.

Roading Staff are recommending retracting some of the variable speeds from around some of the urban school roads making them permanent 40km speed limits as per option 1 in the original proposal.

These changes are recommended as being more practical on those roads based on locality and usage. Staff are confident that amending these roads to be permanent speed limit of 40km aligns with the consultation that was proposed to the public.

In addition, staff have also identified minor changes to other school roads, addressed in the discussion and analysis section of this report.

Discussion and analysisTaataritanga me ngaa tohutohu

There are over 700 speed sign changes occurring through the Bylaw across the District. Only a small number of changes have created issues.

Signage has been progressively implemented over the last few months by the Waikato District Alliance (WDA) supply partner, DirectioNZ. Most of this has now been completed, except for that around schools where the speed bylaw schedules are conflicting (see further detail below for schools).

These roads have been identified as being more practical to be permanent 40km reduced speed limit roads due to their low traffic volumes, limited through traffic and/or primary access function of the road. Although these amendments conflict with the decision made by Council in May 2022,

the consultation that went to the public aligns with this and technically both speed options were adopted through the Bylaw schedules. Staff are confident these recommendations are within the legislative scope able to be made by resolution.

5.1 Options

Ngaa koowhiringa

Staff have identified the following options for Council.

Option one: Approve the amendments to the Bylaw schedules included in attachments 1 and 2 as per section 5 of the Bylaw pursuant to section 151 of the Local Government Act 2022.

Option two: Do not approve the schedule amendments and require further information from staff to approve at a later date.

Staff recommend Option one to progress the speed sign implementation, streamline speed limits around our schools and ensure a correct speed limit transition to the national register.

5.2 Financial considerations

Whaiwhakaaro puutea

As this report is a tidy up of decisions made prior, there are no direct financial options to consider, however the 2022 Speed Limits review did not address the additional costs associated with providing variable speed limit signs for urban school areas. The signs come at a considerable cost and around \$400,000 may be required. Financing the signs could be delayed until the next Long Term Plan, however, given potential safety issues and expectation of changes prompted by the changes to the speed limit bylaw, it is recommended that an immediate funding solution is explored by Staff. There is potential for some of the variable speed sign stock to be repurposed, which may reduce this cost, but this needs further analysis and audit of existing sign stock.

A report in the coming months will be presented to Council regarding financing options.

5.3 Legal considerations

Whaiwhakaaro-aa-ture

A legal review of this report has been undertaken and staff confirm that the recommendation in this report complies with the Council's legal and policy requirements. Section 151 of the LGA allows Councils to amend Bylaw schedules and this is confirmed in section 5 of the Waikato District Councils Speed Limits Bylaw 2011.

5.4 Strategy and policy considerations

The report and recommendations are consistent with the Council's policies, plans and prior decisions (refer <u>Adoption recommendation report at Policy & Regulatory Meeting 03 May 2022</u>).

5.5 Maaori and cultural considerations

Staff consider there are no direct impacts on Maaori from the recommendations in this report. Staff do acknowledge that the Waikato District has a high Maaori population and therefore speed safety and consistency is important to Maaori and community members.

5.6 Climate response and resilience considerations

Whaiwhakaaro-aa-taiao

The matters in this report have no known impact on climate change or resilience for the Council. Previous speed limit reports have addressed the importance of speed reduction to lower CO_2 emissions. The recommendations in this report do not directly affect climate change.

5.7 Risks

Tuuraru

Staff have assessed the recommendations in this report against Council's risk assessment tool and have identified that the recommendations are of low-med risk.

Higher risk is predicted if the Bylaw schedules are not amended as it could lead to speed limit confusion with too many changes in short lengths of road and a delay in implementing the new and variable speeds around schools in the district.

6. Significance and engagement assessment Aromatawai paahekoheko

6.1 Significance

7. Next steps Ahu whakamua

In May 2022, Waka Kotahi amended their 'Setting of Speed Limits Rule 2022'. This is the mechanism of how Councils set their speed limits. A key change to the rules will require all Speed Limit Bylaws to be revoked and for Councils to transfer their speed limit data to a National Speed Limit Register (NSLR) and to adopt a Speed Management Plan.

This report forms part of the speed limit data requirements where a tidy up and alignment of speed limits will ensure a smoother migration to the NSLR. The WDC Speed Limit Bylaw has legal effect until 1 July 2024 when the use of Speed Management Plans will be mandatory.

The next step for the recommendations of this report is sign implementation. As mentioned previously, the purchase and implementation of variable speed signs will require a financial decision to be made by Council. Other options are also being explored such as static variable signs currently under trial with Waka Kotahi which would come at a much lower cost, however at the time of writing this report, a decision has not yet been made on their legality to implement.

Staff are also in the process of drafting the Waikato District Council Speed Management Plan. This will be an opportunity to amend Speed Limits around the district and elected members will be involved in this process through workshops, discussions and decision making. This will also be presented to elected members over the coming months.

WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCIL SPEED LIMITS BYLAW 2011

I Introduction

Pursuant to Section 684(I)(13) of the Local Government Act 1974, the Local Government Act 2002 and Land Transport Rule 5400I: Setting of Speed Limits 2017 the Waikato District Council makes this bylaw to set speed limits as specified in the Schedules attached.

1. Short Title, Commencement and Application

- 1.1 The title of this bylaw is the "Waikato District Council Speed Limits Bylaw 2011".
- 1.2 The bylaw shall apply to the Waikato District
- 1.3 The bylaw shall come into force on I June 2011

2 Interpretation

"Road" includes (a):

- (i) a street; and
- (ii) a motorway; and
- (iii) a beach; and
- (iv) a place to which the public have access, whether as of right or not; and
- (v) all bridges, culverts, ferries, and fords forming part of a road or street or motorway, or a place referred to in (iv); and
- (vi) all sites at which vehicles may be weighed for the purpose of the Land Transport Act 1998 or any other enactment;

and

(b) includes a section of a road

"Speed limit" means:

(a) the maximum speed at which a vehicle may legally be operated on a particular road but does not mean the maximum permitted operating speed for classes or types of vehicles specified in any Act, regulation or rule;

- (b) for a minimum speed limit, the minimum speed at which a vehicle may be legally operated in a specified lane of a road;
- (c) an urban, rural, permanent, holiday, temporary, variable, or minimum speed limit.

"Urban traffic area" means an area designated under this rule that consists of one or more specified roads or a specified geographical area, to which the urban speed limit generally applies.

3 Speed Limits

The roads or areas described in the schedules specified in paragraph 7 or as shown on a map referenced in the schedules are declared to have the speed limits specified in the attached schedules and maps, which are part of this bylaw.

4 Schedules

Schedule I: Roads that have a speed limit of 20 km/h.

Schedule 2: Roads that have a speed limit of 30 km/h.

Schedule 3: Roads that have a speed limit of 40 km/h.

Schedule 4: Roads that have a speed limit of 50 km/h.

Schedule 5: Roads that have a speed limit of 60 km/h.

Schedule 6: Roads that have a speed limit of 70 km/h.

Schedule 7: Roads that have a speed limit of 80 km/h.

Schedule 8: Roads that have a speed limit of 90 km/h.

Schedule 9: Roads that have a speed limit of 100 km/h.

Schedule 10: Roads that have a Variable Speed – School Zone

Schedule 11: Roads that have a Variable Speed – Intersection Speed Zone



SCHEDULE 10: ROADS WITH A VARIABLE SPEED LIMIT – SCHOOLS

The roads or areas described in this Register or as shown on a map referenced in this Schedule are declared to have a variable speed limit as specified in this Register. School zones marked on the map entitled "Waikato District Speed Limits as at 06 May 2020", and identified in the legend as having a variable speed limit of 40km/h, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The speed limit is 40 km/h when the variable speed limit signs are operating and the numerals "40" are displayed.
- 2. The times during which the variable speed limit signs are permitted to operate are limited to:
- (a) 35 minutes before the start of school until the start of school;
- (b) 20 minutes after the end of school, commencing no earlier than 5 minutes before the end of school;

- (c) 10 minutes at any other time during a school day when at least 50 children cross the road or enter or leave a vehicle at the roadside.
- 3. The speed limit is the posted speed limit at all times when the variable speed limit signs are not operating

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

WAIKATO DISTRICT COUNCIL SPEED LIMITS BYLAW 2011

I Introduction

Pursuant to Section 684(I)(13) of the Local Government Act 1974, the Local Government Act 2002 and Land Transport Rule 5400I: Setting of Speed Limits 2017 the Waikato District Council makes this bylaw to set speed limits as specified in the Schedules attached.

1. Short Title, Commencement and Application

- 1.1 The title of this bylaw is the "Waikato District Council Speed Limits Bylaw 2011".
- 1.2 The bylaw shall apply to the Waikato District
- 1.3 The bylaw shall come into force on 1 June 2011

2 Interpretation

"Road" includes (a):

- (i) a street; and
- (ii) a motorway; and
- (iii) a beach; and
- (iv) a place to which the public have access, whether as of right or not; and
- (v) all bridges, culverts, ferries, and fords forming part of a road or street or motorway, or a place referred to in (iv); and
- (vi) all sites at which vehicles may be weighed for the purpose of the Land Transport Act 1998 or any other enactment;

and

(b) includes a section of a road

"Speed limit" means:

(a) the maximum speed at which a vehicle may legally be operated on a particular road but does not mean the maximum permitted operating speed for classes or types of vehicles specified in any Act, regulation or rule;

- (b) for a minimum speed limit, the minimum speed at which a vehicle may be legally operated in a specified lane of a road;
- (c) an urban, rural, permanent, holiday, temporary, variable, or minimum speed limit.

"Urban traffic area" means an area designated under this rule that consists of one or more specified roads or a specified geographical area, to which the urban speed limit generally applies.

3 Speed Limits

The roads or areas described in the schedules specified in paragraph 7 or as shown on a map referenced in the schedules are declared to have the speed limits specified in the attached schedules and maps, which are part of this bylaw.

4 Schedules

Schedule I: Roads that have a speed limit of 20 km/h.

Schedule 2: Roads that have a speed limit of 30 km/h.

Schedule 3: Roads that have a speed limit of 40 km/h.

Schedule 4: Roads that have a speed limit of 50 km/h.

Schedule 5: Roads that have a speed limit of 60 km/h.

Schedule 6: Roads that have a speed limit of 70 km/h.

Schedule 7: Roads that have a speed limit of 80 km/h.

Schedule 8: Roads that have a speed limit of 90 km/h.

Schedule 9: Roads that have a speed limit of 100 km/h.

Schedule 10: Roads that have a Variable Speed – School Zone

Schedule 11: Roads that have a Variable Speed – Intersection Speed Zone

Schedule 12: Map of speeds limits

5 Setting of Additional Speed Limits on Council Controlled Roads

Pursuant to Section 151(2) of the Local Government Act 2002, the Waikato District Council may from time to time by way of resolution set additional speed limits for additional Council controlled roads.

6 Date bylaw made

This bylaw was made pursuant to a resolution passed by the Waikato District Council on 26 April 2011.

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

1. Purpose of the report

Te Take moo te puurongo

To seek approval from the Policy and Regulatory Committee to undertake formal consultation on the Proposed Cemeteries Bylaw.

2. Executive summary Whakaraapopototanga matua

Staff are seeking approval to consult on the draft Waikato District Council Cemeteries Bylaw 2023 (Bylaw). The proposed Bylaw is a review of the 2016 Bylaw with two clauses added and one removed. The changes were made to reflect current practice and enhanced burial options. Two workshops were held with Council and early engagement undertaken with stakeholders and the public. The Bylaw applies to Council Controlled Cemeteries – not private cemeteries or Urupa.

Approval was given by Council at a workshop on 14 June 2022 to undertake early engagement. Early engagement was open between 18 July 2022 and 18 August 2022 and available to the public and stakeholder groups to provide feedback. Those stakeholder groups included Mana whenua, Taupiri Urupa Trustees, Community Boards and Committees, Funeral Directors and Monumental Masons. The feedback was presented to Council at a second workshop on the 14 September 2022 and as a result of the early engagement and Council's feedback, a new bylaw has been drafted and is proposed for formal consultation.

The key changes proposed in the draft Bylaw are to include a provision for natural burials and to allow dogs on leads in cemeteries. The prohibiting of backfilling a burial site has been removed to allow whaanau to backfill if they wish.

If approved, this report will allow formal consultation to be undertaken from 15 March 2023 to 16 April 2023.

3. Staff recommendations Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

THAT the Policy and Regulatory Committee:

- a. confirms that, in accordance with Section 155 of the Local Government Act:
 - i. a Bylaw is the most appropriate way of addressing the perceived problem;
 - ii. the proposed Bylaw is the most appropriate form of Bylaw; and
 - iii. the proposed Bylaw does not give rise to any implications under the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 2002.
- b. adopts the Statement of Proposal (contained in Attachment 2); and
- c. approves the commencement of formal consultation in accordance with section 83 of the Local Government Act 2002 on the Proposed Cemeteries Bylaw.

4. Background Koorero whaimaarama

The Waikato District Council Cemeteries Bylaw 2016 (Bylaw) was due for review on 19 July 2021. The 2016 Bylaw continues to have legal effect under section 160A of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA) until it is automatically revoked on 19 July 2023. The 2016 Bylaw has been reviewed and staff propose minor amendments and new clauses to better reflect current practices and enhance burial options. This Bylaw applies to Waikato District Council controlled cemeteries.

A Council workshop was held on 14 June 2022 seeking general feedback from elected members on the 2016 Bylaw and specifically sought on including new clauses relating to natural burials and allowing dogs to be on-lead in Waikato District Council (WDC) cemeteries.

Council requested that early engagement be undertaken to obtain public sentiment and feedback prior to the formal drafting of clauses for the Bylaw. The public was asked to provide comments on natural burials and dogs on lead in cemeteries, as well as any general feedback about the Bylaw.

Natural burials

Natural burials, or 'eco-burials,' are the interment of a body in soil undertaken in a manner that does not slow down the decomposition process allowing the body to decompose naturally (without the embalming process). The body is prepared naturally and interred using eco-friendly options such as flax, cardboard, untreated timber or cloth.

Due to concerns around environmental effects, natural burials are becoming a popular option of individuals and families. During early engagement 137 submitters provided feedback on natural burials, with 128 in support, 6 against and 3 unsure. Waikato District Council has not set any land aside for natural burials however, Whatawhata cemetery and Taupiri cemetery have been identified as possible site options.

Dogs in cemeteries

Consultation on the Dog Control Bylaw and Policy review occurred between 1 December 2021 and 26 January 2022. During that consultation submitters commented they want Council to allow dogs in cemeteries. Staff identified the best way to address this issue was to consult on it through the Cemeteries Bylaw.

The question was asked during the early engagement with 138 submitters providing feedback. The early engagement showed 110 submitters were in support of allowing dogs in cemeteries on a lead, 23 were not in support and two were unsure. The comments varied from dogs needing to always be on lead, to the importance of 'man's best friend during times of grief', to dogs amongst deceased humans being disrespectful.

Council agreed due to the overwhelming support of allowing dogs in cemeteries through the early engagement feedback, the matter would be included in the draft Cemeteries Bylaw for open consultation.

Backfilling burial sites

After consulting with Mana Whenua who suggested allowing backfilling of the grave by whanau in the presence of Council contractors, staff are proposing to remove clause 19.3 that previously prevented this.

Early engagement outcome

The feedback received was overwhelmingly in support of providing natural burials as an option and allowing dogs on lead in WDC cemeteries. The results were presented to Council at a second workshop on 14 September 2022. At this workshop, Council gave feedback on the proposed clauses and to remove the backfilling restrictions.

5. Discussion and analysisTaataritanga me ngaa tohutohu

The proposed Bylaw is a continuation of the 2016 Bylaw with amendments proposed to improve readability and new clauses added to reflect common practice in WDC Cemeteries, provide more burial options for individuals and families, and to allow dogs into cemeteries. The key proposed amendments and new clauses to the Bylaw are outlined in the tables below and the 2016 Bylaw, containing tracked changes, is provided in Attachment 3.

Inclusion of natural burial clauses

		Consultation on the Dog Control Bylaw and Policy 2022 as well as the early engagement undertaken indicates there is a preference by the community for the current prohibition of dogs in cemeteries to be removed. This change reflects this preference from the community.

5.1 Options

Ngaa koowhiringa

The following options have been identified:

Option 1: Accept the recommendations in this report and begin formal consultation on the proposed Bylaw from 15 March 2023 to 16 April 2023.

Option 2: Do not accept the recommendations to begin formal consultation and require staff to make amendments to the proposed Bylaw and postpone consultation to a later date.

Staff recommend option 1 as early engagement has occurred and two workshops have already been held. The proposed Bylaw includes input from staff, Council, mana whenua and the public and is ready to be consulted on. Option 1 allows for the proposed Bylaw to be adopted in a timely manner in early 2023, prior to the lapsing of the 2016 Bylaw on 19 July 2023.

5.2 Financial considerations

Whaiwhakaaro puutea

There are no material financial considerations associated with the recommendations of this report. However, financial support will be required to obtain the necessary land to accommodate natural burials and a future review of any additional fees and charges will need to occur. Staff will undertake assessments and provide more detail to Council once this is done.

If dogs on lead are to be permitted in WDC Cemeteries, financial support would also be required to provide signage for cemeteries indicating dogs are permitted on-lead only and rubbish bins to dispose of droppings. Staff anticipate this cost would be covered by existing budgets.

5.3 Legal considerations

Whaiwhakaaro-aa-ture

Section 145 of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA) gives Council the power to make bylaws for one or more of the following purposes:

- a) Protecting the public from nuisance;
- b) Protecting, promoting, and maintaining public health and safety;
- c) Minimising the potential for offensive behaviour in public places.

Additionally, Section 16 of the Burials and Cremation Act 1964 gives Council specific authority to make bylaws for the purpose of maintaining and regulating Council-owned cemeteries.

The Bylaw must be adopted by 19 July 2023 to avoid automatic revoking of the current Bylaw and Council being left without the necessary means to regulate activities and operations for WDC cemeteries.

Upon adoption, the draft Bylaw will revoke the 2016 Bylaw and will become the new Bylaw.

In accordance with their delegated authority, the Corporate Planning team have determined, under section 155 of the LGA, that the proposed Bylaw:

- a) Is the most appropriate way of addressing the problem or perceived problem.
- b) Is the most appropriate form of Bylaw.

Legal counsel has confirmed that, in accordance with section 156 of the LGA, the proposed Bylaw does not give rise to any implications under the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990.

5.4 Strategy and policy considerations

Whaiwhakaaro whakamaaherehere kaupapa here

The report and recommendations are consistent with the Council's policies, plans and prior decisions.

5.5 Maaori and cultural considerations

Whaiwhakaaro Maaori me oona tikanga

Staff have considered Māori tikanga (values) regarding the tapu (sacredness) surrounding burial of the tūpāpaku (deceased) and the processes involved. During the period of early engagement, a hui was held with representatives of Waikato Tainui and Taupiri Maunga urupā trustees to discuss any queries, concerns, and feedback they had on the Bylaw.

Waikato Tainui is supportive of the inclusion of provisions for natural burials as it supports the preservation of the health of Papatūānuku. They voiced their support of a minimum depth cover of 800mm as shallower burial allows for the tūpāpaku to decompose naturally further supporting the preservation of Papatūānuku.

Waikato Tainui also questioned whether whanau could dig and backfill the grave. Staff advised that the current clause, which prohibits this, is currently included due to health and safety concerns and ensuring graves are dug in the correct plot location. The approach of backfilling of the grave by whanau, in the presence of Council contractors, is supported by staff. As a result of this hui, clause 19.3 preventing this has been proposed to be removed. Staff also propose including whanau in the preparation of the grave after it has been dug with the collection and laying of fern fronds in the grave site.

5.6 Climate response and resilience considerations

Whaiwhakaaro-aa-taiao

The decisions sought by, and matters covered in, this report are consistent with the Council's <u>Climate Response and Resilience Policy</u> and <u>Climate Action Plan</u>. Policy 9.3 of the Climate Response and Resilience Policy states 'Ensure that low emission, climate-resilient development is adopted as a key tenet into development and land-use decisions.'

Natural burials allow for decomposition to occur at a more natural rate and having as minimal environmental impact as possible. Allowing natural burials in WDC cemeteries provides families and individuals the opportunity to consider a low-emission burial option.

5.7 Risks

Tuuraru

The decision being sought through this report is of low to moderate risk using Councils risk assessment tool. However, if the Committee does not recommend consultation on the Bylaw be undertaken for the specified period, delays in adoption of a new Cemeteries Bylaw prior to the automatic revoking of the 2016 Bylaw could result. Council would then have no bylaw enabling it to regulate and set standards for the operation of Council cemeteries.

6. Significance and engagement assessment Aromatawai paahekoheko

6.1 Significance

Te Hiranga

The decisions and matters of this report are assessed as of moderate significance, in accordance with the Council's <u>Significance and Engagement Policy</u>.

The following criteria are particularly relevant in determining the level of significance for this matter:

- The proposal or decision will affect a large portion of the community.
- The likely impact on present and future interests of the community, recognising Maaori Tikanga (culture values) and their relationship to land and water.
- The community interest is likely to be high.
- There is a legislative requirement to consult.

6.2 Engagement

Te Whakatuutakitaki

Early engagement was undertaken with the public between 18 July 2022 and 18 August 2022, seeking feedback on the bylaw generally, as well as in relation to natural burials and dogs on-lead in cemeteries. Approximately 93% of respondents were in favour of having natural burials as an option in WDC cemeteries. Approximately 81% of respondents were in favour of permitting dogs on-lead in WDC cemeteries.

Identified stakeholders will be notified that the draft Bylaw is out for consultation and provided with the opportunity to make a submission. These include Community Boards and Committees, Mana Whenua, and Funeral Directors and Monumental Masons in the Waikato District and those who provided feedback during early engagement.



BACKGROUND

We are reviewing our Cemeteries Bylaw. The Bylaw is made by Council under the Local Government Act 2002 and the Burials and Cremation Act 1964.

The Bylaw enables Council to regulate activities and sets standards for Council Controlled Cemeteries Note: The Bylaw does not apply to private cemeteries or Urupa.

Early engagement on the Bylaw was undertaken between July-August 2022 seeking guidance from the public on two specific topics; providing for natural burials and allowing dogs on-lead in cemeteries. The feedback received during this period helped draft the proposed Bylaw we are now consulting on.

This Statement of Proposal outlines the:

- Reasons for the proposal;
- Summary of changes between the 2016 Cemeteries Bylaw and the draft Bylaw

Council welcomes your feedback on the proposed Bylaw with consultation open from 15 March to 16 April 2023.

Reasons for the proposal

- To provide an environmentally friendly burial option (natural burials)
- To allow people to be accompanied by their dogs onlead when visiting grave sites of loved ones
- To allow family and friends to back-fill graves.

KEY CHANGES WE'RE PROPOSING TO MAKE



Council believes that the Bylaw is operating well, however acknowledges there are improvements to be made to enhance its effectiveness. A summary of the key changes are noted below:

Key change 1 Inclusion of natural burials clauses.

.Key change 2 Allowing dogs on-lead to enter cemeteries.

Key change 3 Remove the clause that prevents family and loved ones from backfilling graves.



KEY CHANGE 1

Inclusion of natural burial clauses

What we're doing now

Council cemeteries allow for standard burials, typically involving embalming of the body and burial in a standard, treated wood casket. We also allow for interment of ashes in a plot. Plots can be pre-purchased and Councilapproved headstones and memorials can be installed.

What we're proposing

To provide an environmentally friendly burial option in the Waikato District. Natural burials, or 'eco-burials,' are the interment of a body in the soil undertaken in a manner that does not slow down the decomposition process and allows the body to decompose naturally (without embalming). Early engagement undertaken between July-August 2022 showed considerable support for providing for natural burial sites in Council cemeteries.

The clauses in the following table are propopsed, incorporating the specific requirements for a natural burial that must be adhered to, according to Natural Burials New Zealand. There are specific requirements around memorials, caskets, and burial depth that must be followed, as well as the prohibition of embalming. The intention behind this burial type is to have as little environmental impact as possible when someone is buried. Natural burial sites have not been identified and should this clause be adopted into the Bylaw, work will be undertaken to identify suitable sites.

This Bylaw of the Waikato District Council is made pursuant to the Local Government Act 2002 and the Burial and Cremation Act 1964 and their respective amendments and all other relevant powers, hereby makes the following bylaw.

Introduction

1.0 Short title, commencement and application

- 1.1 The bylaw shall be known as the 'Waikato District Council Cemeteries Bylaw 2016' 2023'.
- 1.2 The bylaw shall apply to the Waikato District.
- 1.3 The Bylaw shall come into force on the date of adoption.

2.0 Revocation

The following bylaws are hereby revoked from the day this new bylaw comes into force: 'Waikato District Council Cemeteries and Crematoria Bylaw 2008' and 'Franklin District Council Cemeteries Bylaw 2008'.Bylaw 2016

3.0 Purpose

To The purpose of this bylaw is to enable the Council to regulate activities and set standards for the operation of cemeteries under the control of the Council.

4.0 Definitions

For the purposes of this Bylaw, the following definitions shall apply, unless inconsistent with the context:

Authorised Officer means any person appointed by the Council to act on its behalf and

- 5.1 Before a burial may take place, an application for interment must be lodged with the Council.
- 5.2 The application must be accompanied by:
 - a) a medical certificate or coroner's authorisation, as applicable;
 - written permission from the owner of the exclusive right of burial in respect of a plot, where applicable;
 - c) payment of the burial fees set by the Council.
- 5.3 Burials must take place:
 - a) in a specific plot in respect of which an exclusive right of burial has been purchased; or
 - b) in a plot chosen by the Council if no exclusive right of burial has been purchased.

6.0 Exclusive right of burial

- 6.1 An exclusive right of burial may be sold by the Council and may be held for sixty years. The Council will not re-purchase any presold plots.
- Any person is entitled to purchase an exclusive right of burial for no more than two plots.

- 6.3 Where doubt of ownership of an exclusive right of burial exists, the Council may satisfy itself, that the use of the respective plot is authorised.
- 6.4 The Council will not sell the exclusive right of burial in respect of any plots located in cemetery areas reserved exclusively for the burial of deceased persons who have served in Her Majesty's Forces.

7.0 Notification of burial

- 7.1 Interments may take place between the hours of 10.00am and 3.30pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and between 10.30am and 2.30pm on Saturdays. On Sundays and public holidays, cemeteries are closed for all interments.
- 7.2 Burials may take place outside these times by prior arrangement with Council.
- 7.3 Notification of an intended burial must be given to the Council not less than eight working hours prior to the time of burial. If less notice is given, an extra charge may be imposed by the Council.

8.0 Plots and graves

- 8.1 Only the Sexton is authorised to dig a grave.
- 8.2 The Council requires prior notification if a person, or persons, wish to fill any grave.
- 8.3 The minimum depth of cover for any casket must be not less than 800mm.
- 8.4 A maximum of two deceased persons may be buried in any one plot, excluding natural burial plots.
- 8.5 A grave may be reopened for subsequent burial(s) where consent is given by the Council and:
 - a) by the owner of the exclusive right of burial, or their representative; and
 - b) the relevant prescribed form is provided to the Council.

9.0 Ashes

- 9.1 A maximum of eight urns containing ashes that may be buried in any burial plot, or a maximum of two urns may be buried in an ashes plot.
- 9.2 Ashes may not be scattered in any cemetery.

10.0 Disinterments

- 10.1 The disinterment of a body, or remains of a body, must be conducted in accordance with sections 51 and 55 of the Burial and Cremation Act 1964.
- 10.2 If a grave has become empty due to disinterment, and there is no exclusive right of burial, that plot will revert back to the Council and the Council will not make any refund of the cost of that burial plot.

11.0 Memorials and adornments

- 11.1 Prior to the installation of any memorial, an application for a memorial must be submitted to the Council, together with:
 - a) proof of an exclusive right of burial for the respective plot; and
 - b) payment of the relevant fee set by the Council.
- 11.2 Memorials must:
 - a) cover no more than two plots, provided the respective exclusive burial rights are owned by the same owner;

- b) limit inscriptions to the front of the memorials for double beam-berm areas;
- c) be set in a way approved by Council.
- 11.3 Memorials and the associated plots must be kept in good order and repair by the holder of the exclusive right of burial, or their successor.
- 11.4 Only a Monumental Mason who complies with the Council's Health and Safety requirements, and preferably a member of the New Zealand Master Monumental Masons Association may undertake work associated with any monument.
- 11.5 Subject to the provisions of the Burial and Cremation (Removal of Monuments and Tablets) Regulations 1967, the Council may remove any installation of any kind that falls into a state of decay or disrepair.
- 11.6 No above-ground memorials, including railing or fencing, must be placed in grounds designated as lawn cemeteries.
- 11.7 Removal of any memorial must be approved by the Council using the relevant prescribed forms and accompanied by proof of exclusive right of burial for that plot.
- 11.8 The Council may remove any unauthorised memorials from the Cemetery.
- 11.9 Adornments, including wreaths and floral tributes, may be placed on a plot for up to twenty-eight days following an interment. After this time, all adornments will be relocated to the concrete beamberm. Any adornments added after this time must be duly placed in approved receptacles, or on the concrete beamberm.
- 11.10 Adornments must not inhibit the proper maintenance of the Cemetery or other graves.
- 11.11 Breakable jars, vases or receptacles must not be used as flower containers.
- 11.12 The Council may remove unapproved receptacles, ornaments or memorabilia from graves at any time to facilitate the maintenance of those graves.
- 11.13 In areas set aside as a lawn cemetery, a plaque must be placed centrally on the beam berm opposite the associated plot.
- 11.14 All foundations for kerbs, tombstones, headstones, monuments, vaults and any other above-ground structure, must be constructed to the satisfaction of the Council and in compliance with the New Zealand Headstones and Cemetery Monuments NZS 4242:1995 or its subsequent amendments or replacement, subject to the following restrictions:
 - a) No memorial stone, fence or enclosure must exceed 1200mm in height.
 - b) In any areas that are designated as Services Cemeteries all monuments and headstones must be constructed in accordance with the requirements of Veterans' Affairs New Zealand.
- 11.15 Any headstone or other monument, which in the opinion of the Council is offensive, may be removed at the direction of the Council.
- 11.16 No Monumental Mason or other person must remove any kerb, headstone, monument or tablet from any Cemetery without permission from the Council.
- 11.17 Any authorised person erecting or repairing any headstone or monument must remove all excess materials, tools and equipment from the cemetery on completion of the works and leave the site in a tidy state.

12.0 Natural Burials

12.1 The Council may set aside an area of a cemetery specifically for the purpose of accepting natural burials. Natural burials will be carried out in accordance with Council's procedures and are subject to prior approval from an Authorised Officer.

12.2 Plot reservations are not permitted for natural burials.

- 12.3 In areas of cemeteries set aside for natural burial, the following provisions shall apply (and such other provisions as the Authorised Officer may require):
 - (a) All plots are for single interment.
 - (b) Embalming of the interred is not permitted.
 - (c) A casket or shroud of biodegradable material consistent with natural burial guidelines is required.
 - (d) Memorials including containers for flowers or other items are not permitted on a natural burial grave site and may be removed by an Authorised officer. Native vegetation chosen from Council's list of approved plant species and varieties shall mark the site of a natural burial and will be provided by the Council in accordance with the cemetery burial plan, planted by or under the direct supervision of the Authorised Officer.
 - (e) The Authorised Officer will place a discreet marker to identify the location of natural burial graves and may also place a biodegradable marker.
 - (f) The location of all natural burial graves will be recorded by the Council using Geographical Positioning System (GPS) co-ordinates
- 12.4 All monument markers on plots designated for natural burials must consist of untreated biodegradable wood or wood treated to at least the H3 standard. No non-biodegradable tributes are permitted.

- 7.1 Interments may take place between the hours of 10.00am and 3.30pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and between 10.30am and 2.30pm on Saturdays. On Sundays and public holidays, cemeteries are closed for all interments.
- 7.2 Burials may take place outside these times by prior arrangement with Council.
- 7.3 Notification of an intended burial must be given to the Council not less than eight working hours prior to the time of burial. If less notice is given, an extra charge may be imposed by the Council.

8.0 Plots and graves

- 8.1 Only the Sexton is authorised to dig a grave.
- 8.2 The Council requires prior notification if a person, or persons, wish to fill any grave.
- 8.3 The minimum depth of cover for any casket must be not less than 800mm.
- 8.4 A maximum of two deceased persons may be buried in any one plot, excluding natural burial plots.
- 8.5 A grave may be reopened for subsequent burial(s) where consent is given by the Council and:
 - a) by the owner of the exclusive right of burial, or their representative; and
 - b) the relevant prescribed form is provided to the Council.

9.0 Ashes

- 9.1 A maximum of eight urns containing ashes that may be buried in any burial plot, or a maximum of two urns may be buried in an ashes plot.
- 9.2 Ashes may not be scattered in any cemetery.

10.0 Disinterments

- 10.1 The disinterment of a body, or remains of a body, must be conducted in accordance with sections 51 and 55 of the Burial and Cremation Act 1964.
- 10.2 If a grave has become empty due to disinterment, and there is no exclusive right of burial, that plot will revert back to the Council and the Council will not make any refund of the cost of that burial plot.

11.0 Memorials and adornments

- 11.1 Prior to the installation of any memorial, an application for a memorial must be submitted to the Council, together with:
 - a) proof of an exclusive right of burial for the respective plot; and
 - b) payment of the relevant fee set by the Council.

11.2 Memorials must:

a) cover no more than two plots, provided the respective exclusive burial rights are owned by the same owner;

- b) limit inscriptions to the front of the memorials for double berm areas;
- c) be set in a way approved by Council.
- 11.3 Memorials and the associated plots must be kept in good order and repair by the holder of the exclusive right of burial, or their successor.
- 11.4 Only a Monumental Mason who complies with the Council's Health and Safety requirements, and preferably a member of the New Zealand Master Monumental Masons Association may undertake work associated with any monument.
- 11.5 Subject to the provisions of the Burial and Cremation (Removal of Monuments and Tablets) Regulations 1967, the Council may remove any installation of any kind that falls into a state of decay or disrepair.
- 11.6 No above-ground memorials, including railing or fencing, must be placed in grounds designated as lawn cemeteries.
- 11.7 Removal of any memorial must be approved by the Council using the relevant prescribed forms and accompanied by proof of exclusive right of burial for that plot.
- 11.8 The Council may remove any unauthorised memorials from the Cemetery.
- 11.9 Adornments, including wreaths and floral tributes, may be placed on a plot for up to twenty-eight days following an interment. After this time, all adornments will be relocated to the concrete berm. Any adornments added after this time must be duly placed in approved receptacles, or on the concrete berm.
- 11.10 Adornments must not inhibit the proper maintenance of the Cemetery or other graves.
- 11.11 Breakable jars, vases or receptacles must not be used as flower containers.
- 11.12 The Council may remove unapproved receptacles, ornaments or memorabilia from graves at any time to facilitate the maintenance of those graves.
- 11.13 In areas set aside as a lawn cemetery, a plaque must be placed centrally on the berm opposite the associated plot.
- 11.14 All foundations for kerbs, tombstones, headstones, monuments, vaults and any other above-ground structure, must be constructed to the satisfaction of the Council and in compliance with the New Zealand Headstones and Cemetery Monuments NZS 4242:1995 or its subsequent amendments or replacement, subject to the following restrictions:
 - a) No memorial stone, fence or enclosure must exceed 1200mm in height.
 - b) In any areas that are designated as Services Cemeteries all monuments and headstones must be constructed in accordance with the requirements of Veterans' Affairs New Zealand.
- 11.15 Any headstone or other monument, which in the opinion of the Council is offensive, may be removed at the direction of the Council.
- 11.16 No Monumental Mason or other person must remove any kerb, headstone, monument or tablet from any Cemetery without permission from the Council.
- 11.17 Any authorised person erecting or repairing any headstone or monument must remove all excess materials, tools and equipment from the cemetery on completion of the works and leave the site in a tidy state.

12.0 Natural Burials

- 12.1 The Council may set aside an area of a cemetery specifically for the purpose of accepting natural burials. Natural burials will be carried out in accordance with Council's procedures and are subject to prior approval from an Authorised Officer.
- 12.2 Plot reservations are not permitted for natural burials.
- 12.3 In areas of cemeteries set aside for natural burial, the following provisions shall apply (and such other provisions as the Authorised Officer may require):
- (a) All plots are for single interment.
- (b) Embalming of the interred is not permitted.
- (c) A casket or shroud of biodegradable material consistent with natural burial guidelines is required.
- (d) Memorials including containers for flowers or other items are not permitted on a natural burial grave site and may be removed by an Authorised officer. Native vegetation chosen from Council's list of approved plant species and varieties shall mark the site of a natural burial and will be provided by the Council in accordance with the cemetery burial plan, planted by or under the direct supervision of the Authorised Officer.
- (e) The Authorised Officer will place a discreet marker to identify the location of natural burial graves and may also place a biodegradable marker.
- (f) The location of all natural burial graves will be recorded by the Council using Geographical Positioning System (GPS) co-ordinates
- 12.4 All monument markers on plots designated for natural burials must consist of untreated biodegradable wood or wood treated to at least the H3 standard. No non-biodegradable tributes are permitted.

13.0 Ground maintenance

- 13.1 The holder of an exclusive right of burial or must ensure that:
 - a) memorial placed on the respective are maintained and secure;
 - b) memorials do not inhibit regular maintenance of the Cemetery.
 - c) kerbs and enclosures are kept in good order.
- 13.2 No person must plant any tree, shrub, plant or other vegetation in the Cemetery.
- 13.23 The Council may cut or remove any vegetation planted in the Cemetery at its discretion.
- 13.4 Any person installing or attending any work in a cemetery must withdraw for the duration of a nearby funeral service, or at the direction of the Council.
- 13.5 Any person using a footpath or roadway in the Cemetery for the purpose of mixing cement or mortar must do so on a proper mixing board or in a manner approved by the Council.

14.0 Records

14.1 The Council will keep plans showing areas available for burial and burial plots available for purchase. These plans may be inspected at the Council's offices during office hours or on the Council's website.

15.0 Poor persons

15.1 Where application is made to the Council for the interment or of any deceased poor person, the applicant shall, on making such application, provide to the Council a duly signed certificate certifying that such deceased person has not left sufficient means to pay the ordinary charge of interment or cremation fixed by this part of the bylaw, that the cost of burial is not covered by any Accident Compensation entitlement and that his/her relatives and friends are unable to pay the same.

16.0 Vehicles in Cemeteries

- 16.1 Vehicles must use designated roadways and car parks within a Cemetery.
- 16.2 Vehicles may only access cemeteries from:
 - a) 7.00 am to 8.30pm during the months of October to the end of March;
 - b) 8.00am to 5.00pm during the months of April to the end of September;
- 16.3 The speed limit in all cemeteries is 20km/hr unless notified otherwise.

17.0 Dogs and Horses

- 17.1 No person must take horses into a Cemetery.
- 17.2 Dogs are permitted on-leash at all times within a Cemetery.

18.0 Nuisance

- 18.1 No person shall, in or near any part of a Cemetery, prevent, interrupt or delay a burial.
- 18.2 No person shall, in or near any part of a Cemetery, cause a nuisance or annoyance to persons who are lawfully in Cemetery, or who are approaching a Cemetery for a lawful purpose.

19.0 Advertising

- 19.1 No person shall within any Cemetery advertise or solicit any order or custom from any person for any work in connection with a Cemetery or for the sale preparation, or supply of any article, material, or thing to be set up, affixed, placed or used in a Cemetery.
- 19.2 No person shall without the consent of a funeral director, or a special permit in writing for the occasion from the Council, take any photographs or moving images at a funeral.

20.0 Safety

- 21.1 All persons, whether Council employees or staff of funeral directors, shall take all necessary steps to ensure that any Cemetery is a safe site at all times, and particularly during any funeral or burial.
- 21.2 All necessary warning signs, protective barriers and other protective means shall be put in place prior to the commencement of any funeral or burial.

21.0 Fees and Charges

- 21.1 The Council may prescribe fees and charges for burials and disinterments, the purchase of exclusive rights of burial, headstone erections and other services. These fees will be included in the Council's Fees and Charges Schedule. A copy of fees and charges will be available from the Council's website, office or any customer service centre.
- 21.2 No burial warrant will be issued until all fees have been paid or satisfactory arrangements have been made for the payment of fees.

22.0 Offences

23.1 Any person who commits an offence against this bylaw is liable to a fine not exceeding \$20,000.00

24.0 General

24.1 Any resolution of the Council may be amended, rescinded or reinstated by a further resolution of the Council.

138 responses were received during the early engagement period open from 18 July to 18 August. Natural Burials

137 responses were received on Natural Burials with 128 in support of natural burials, 6 not in support and 3 unsure.

Dogs in Cemeteries

135 responses were received on allowing dogs in cemeteries. 110 in support,23 not in support and 2 unsure. The comments varied about dogs only being allowed on a lead, the importance of 'man's best friend during times of grief' and others thought having dogs amongst deceased humans was disrespectful.

Purpose of the report Te Take moo te puurongo

The purpose of this report is to inform the Policy and Regulatory Committee (the Committee) of the submission that was lodged on 18 November 2022 to the Ministry of Primary Industries (MPI) on the National Direction for Plantation and Exotic Carbon Afforestation discussion document, and the submission that was lodged on 16 December 2022 to the Waikato Regional Council's (WRC) Change 1 to the Waikato Regional Policy Statement.

2. Executive summary Whakaraapopototanga matua

National Direction for Plantation and Exotic Carbon Afforestation

A submission was made to the Discussion Document on the National Direction for Plantation and Exotic Carbon Afforestation (the Discussion Document), which indicates intentions for the management of exotic carbon forestry's environmental (biophysical) effects. The questions outlined in the Discussion Document focused on vital areas of exotic forestry concerning carbon afforestation.

The Discussion Document explained the current system and posed questions about the new system. Waikato District Council (WDC) did not fully assess the Discussion Document. However, responses were made to most of the questions relevant to the district. Other submitters have conducted a more comprehensive analysis, including Waikato Regional Council (WRC), other district councils, Local Government New Zealand (LGNZ) and Federated Farmers.

Change 1 to the Waikato Regional Policy Statement

A submission was made on Change 1 of the Waikato Regional Policy Statement ("RPS"), which seeks to incorporate the requirements of the National Policy Statement on Urban Development 2020 ("NPSUD") and to reflect recent changes to the Future Proof Strategy 2022. A governance-approved submission and an officer-level submission on Change 1 to the Waikato Regional Policy Statement were lodged on 16th December 2022. The submission was overall in support of Change 1.

3. Staff recommendations Tuutohu-aa-kaimahi

THAT the Policy and Regulatory Committee receives the Submission on Consultation on National Direction for Plantation and Exotic Carbon Afforestation AND Submission(s) on Change 1 to the Waikato Regional Policy Statement Report.

4. Background Koorero whaimaarama

National Direction for Plantation and Exotic Carbon Afforestation

The release of the Discussion Document shows some progress in acknowledging indigenous vegetation as an alternative long-term carbon capture opportunity. However, WDC and others are concerned with how this may work, given the lack of concrete examples of the processes and systems involved in facilitating carbon sequestration through indigenous plantings.

WDC concerns relate to the increased cost of carbon credits, particularly as farming carbon has the potential to become more profitable than agriculture, e.g. dairy farming and cropping. Impacts are already being felt in other agricultural categories (beef and lamb farming) throughout New Zealand (NZ). This has the potential to radically alter NZ's terrestrial land use and habitats and our international food production capability.

MPI has acknowledged this risk, and WDC supports their assertion that "Widespread afforestation still presents risks for land-use change – but we think this a lower risk due to the lower financial returns from carbon storage in indigenous forests". WDC lodged a submission approved by the Submission Forum¹ on 18 November 2022 (Attachment 1).

¹ Submissions and legislation

a . The Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Chairpersons of the Infrastructure, Sustainability & Wellbeing, and Performance & Strategy Committees (together, 'the Submission Forum') may jointly approve a submission.

b. Officers will circulate the submission to the Submission Forum for approval, providing at least 24 hours for the review of the submission. All Committee members must be notified of the submission so as to enable feedback to be provided via the Submission Forum.

The submission was tested with a small councillor-led reference group (Cr Eyre, Cr P Thomson, Cr Turner and Cr Matatahi-Poutapu) to get the appropriate themes and content. Once a draft was formulated, this was circulated to all councillors for additional comments.

Key points in the submission note that WDC is located within the Waikato Region, and the submission provides a specific district-level view of the Discussion Document. Planting indigenous native vegetation as an alternative to exotic carbon afforestation or transitioning to native vegetation is preferred. WDC is concerned with how exotic carbon forestry was allowed to occur at scale and cause the loss of substantial sustainably productive farms across NZ.

The direction of this discussion document requires that the central government devolve the identification and amount of carbon farming to the local government. This would assist in identifying appropriate areas for exotic carbon forestry and its long-term administration but lose the overall centralised understanding of land conversion. WDC have concerns that it is not the most cost-effective and efficient way of dealing with the rapid conversion of productive land, particularly due to the following:

- Exotic forestry for carbon capture can negatively impact adjacent land with ecological risks from pests, fire, biosecurity and damaging native habitats for native species.
 Shading and loss of production on adjoining land was also an unforeseen risk if plantings were taken up to boundaries of non-forestry lots.
- In the case of production forestry, these potential adverse environmental impacts need to be considered alongside the positive economic benefits. Production forestry is a significant employer, helping to grow local trades and providing work for businesses while being an export earner. Exotic carbon afforestation has none of these benefits.
- There are many biodiversity threats from the short lifespan of exotic forestry for carbon capture compared to well-managed indigenous forests. These include pests, weeds, and wilding pines moving out onto adjacent land
- Incentivising permanent indigenous afforestation is a good way forward. This would be a great alternative for unproductive or challenging-to-reach land that has the potential to be retired.

c. Each member of the Submission Forum will confirm by response whether they approve the submission or have any feedback on the submission.

d. Where possible, a consensus of the Submission Forum members should be sought. If required, a majority view will prevail.

e.. Any submission approved via this process must be presented to the next relevant committee meeting for noting. If the submission is of a technical and operational nature only, the submission can be approved by the Chief Executive (in consultation with the relevant committee chairperson prior to lodging the submission).

- The future changes proposing that district councils identify and manage areas for exotic carbon afforestation are concerning. WDC considers a better approach should be identification and management at a national or regional level, whereby exotic carbon forestry could be spatially mapped and administered nationally or regionally, with an overview across the country of agricultural land change to exotic carbon afforestation so that overall limits can be better set.
- Small portions of land (5-10%) could be converted to indigenous forestry, with suitable
 trees in the right places. These small, planted areas could then be added together on
 a catchment basis monitored by the district council(s). The carbon credits would be
 spread appropriately throughout the districts rather than converting whole farms to
 forestry, with the potential to impact the economics of districts and regions negatively.
- For the above to occur, there need to be incentives, good communication with landowners and upscaling in propagation and native planting operations (possibly catchment orientated) to make it cost-effective.
- Carbon capture opportunities for land owners, esplanade and wetland areas should also be considered further.

Change 1 to the Waikato Regional Policy Statement

The Future Proof Strategy 2022 (the Strategy) is a 30-year growth management and implementation plan specific to the Hamilton, Waipa, Waikato and Matamata-Piako subregion within the context of the broader Hamilton-Auckland Corridor and Hamilton-Waikato Metropolitan areas. The Strategy provides a framework to manage growth collaboratively for the Future Proof sub-region, both from a community and physical perspective.

The Strategy has recently been updated to reflect the provisions in the NPSUD. All partners have put significant resources into the Future Proof update, including central government. The Future Proof partners are satisfied that the updated Strategy reflects the direction set in the NPSUD to ensure sufficient capacity and contribute towards well-functioning urban environments. It is important that Change 1 to the Waikato Regional Policy Statement is completed to reflect the NPS-UD and the Strategy. A governance-approved submission on Change 1 of the Waikato Regional Policy Statement (Attachment 2) was approved by Waikato District Council's Submission Forum and lodged on 16 December 2022.

A matter was raised by an internal staff member regarding a provision proposed in Change 1 of the Waikato Regional Policy Statement, which was not addressed in the governance approved submission. It was noted that the wording of Provision 4.2 UFD-P12 in Change 1 of the Waikato Regional Policy Statement did not reflect the wording in the Future Proof Strategy 2022, and therefore changed the intent of the overall provision.

The Future Proof Strategy 2022 (page 94) states the densities and targets in the Strategy are to be achieved **'over time'**. Change 1 of the Waikato Regional Policy Statement deletes these words from Provision UFD P12. Waikato District Council staff considered that the words 'over time' need to be reinstated to be consistent with the Future Proof Strategy 2022. Therefore, the officer-level submission seeks an amendment to Provision 4.2 UFD-P12 as follows:

Future Proof territorial authorities shall seek to...

In doing so, development provisions shall seek to achieve <u>over time</u> the following net target densities (dwellings per hectare in defined locations...

And any such further, alternative or consequential relief as may be necessary to fully achieve the relief sought in the submission. The officer-level submission was produced in a short-period of time and due to the tight-timeframes was not able to be reviewed by the Submissions Forum. This being said, the intent of the officer-level submission aligned with the governance-approved submission. The officer-level submission was also lodged on 16 December 2022 (Attachment 3).

5. Next steps Ahu whakamua

Waikato District Council staff will inform Council on the outcome of the Ministry of Primary Industries on the National Direction for Plantation and Exotic Carbon Afforestation.

Additionally, Waikato District Council staff will inform Council on the decision on Change 1 of the Waikato Regional Policy Statement when notified.

1. Executive summary

Submission to the Ministry for Primary Industries on Consultation on National direction for plantation and exotic carbon afforestation proposals to change forestry settings in the National Environmental Standard - Plantation Forestry (NES-PF).

A discussion Paper on National direction for plantation and exotic carbon afforestation Discussion Paper No: 2022/10

Waikato District Council (WDC) appreciates the opportunity to submit on the National direction for plantation and exotic carbon afforestation Discussion Paper No: 2022/10 (the Discussion Paper). WDC notes that the Discussion Paper has highlighted an imbalance of allowing exotic carbon forestry (frequently Pinus radiata, an exotic monoculture species) to alter traditional sustainably productive land use. There is a concern that the short timeframes (18 November 2022) has meant that WDC has not been able to consult with our iwi/Māori partners, key stakeholders and our communities. The Discussion Paper proposes adding new settings for exotic carbon forests with options for national-led or devolved change to local government.

The Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) is effectively seeking feedback on changing the current system around afforestation and its implementation due to the unintended consequences of whole farms with conversions to exotic carbon forestry. The ongoing loss of sustainably productive pastoral farms or none of the benefits of production forestry and its active management. The Discussion Paper poses several questions about which options would work and what areas need to be focused on. This submission primarily covers the preferred options of the Discussion Paper and answers some of the questions related to the proposed changes, how they might limit whole farm conversions to exotic carbon forests, and the possible implications for the Waikato District.

This submission provides a specific district-level view of the Discussion Paper. We request the following changes to minimise whole farm conversions to exotic carbon forestry. Opportunities to integrate exotic and indigenous forestry within sustainable pastoral farming and allow some carbon sequestration offset as part of this process:

- Exotic forestry for carbon capture can negatively impact adjacent land with ecological risks
 from pests, fire, biosecurity, shading and damaging native habitats for native species. In the
 case of production forestry, however, these potential negative environmental impacts are
 considered alongside the positive economic benefits. Although less preferred productive
 forestry is a significant employer, grows local trades, provides work for businesses and is an
 export earner.
- There are biodiversity threats from the short lifespan of exotic forestry for carbon capture compared to existing pastoral land or well-managed long-term indigenous forests.
- What happens when the faster-growing exotic carbon forest begins to die off, especially in steep, rugged terrain? There is potential to have dramatic downstream impacts, like debris, and erosion to waterways, exacerbated by drought and flooding.
- Incentivising permanent indigenous afforestation integrated into sustainably productive
 pastoral farming might be a better way forward. This would be attached to mainly
 unproductive parts or challenging-to-reach land that has the potential to be retired.

- WDC is concerned about the options proposed around District councils identifying areas for
 forestry. WDC considers it should occur at a national or regional level through the Resource
 Management (RM) reforms, which could be spatially mapped and administered by councils.
 The main issues come back to resourcing these options and the ongoing regulatory
 processes that district councils would have to contend with, from identifying land areas to
 monitoring and management over decades.
- Please explore the opportunities around small portions from bigger land holdings of land (510%) being converted to indigenous forestry, integrated into the farm with suitable trees in
 the right places. These small, planted areas could then be added together on a catchment
 basis monitored by the council(s). The carbon credits spread appropriately through districts
 rather than converting whole farms to forestry and losing sustainable, productive land and
 the associated communities.
- For the above to occur, there need to be incentives, good dialogue with landowners and
 upscaling in native propagation and planting operations (possibly catchment orientated) to
 make it cost-effective. Carbon sequestration is not well understood for small forestry versus
 large-scale operations. Put in a temporary solution until this research is completed. Start
 now, don't wait.
- Protection of waterways, native bush and cultural sites from large-scale exotic carbon forestry must also be at the forefront of the changes. As carbon capture opportunities for landowners, Esplanade and wetland areas should be considered further.

The Discussion Paper indicates the direction of the updated NES-PF. The questions in the Discussion Paper focus on new regulatory systems to manage exotic carbon forestry with little detail on how this could be rolled out and the resourcing and expertise required to protect and enhance our rural communities.

As noted, rather than providing enough detail, the Discussion Paper contains explanations and options of the system and then poses various questions and options about the new system. WDC does not intend to assess the Discussion Paper fully and reply to all the questions, but responses have been made to most of them. Other submitters have carried out that exercise, including Waikato Regional Council (WRC), other district councils, Local Government New Zealand (LGNZ) and Federated Farmers.

This submission's key focus will be setting the scene for the Waikato District and some constructive examples of how WDC views the importance of indigenous vegetation and the potential for indigenous forestry in carbon sequestration in the right location needed to protect productive agricultural land from exotic forestry

2. Background

Background: Waikato District and its Proposed District Plan

The Waikato District spans more than 400,000 hectares between Auckland City and Hamilton City. It comprises six towns (the largest being Huntly with approximately 7800 people) and multiple villages of various sizes. The Waikato District has substantial social and economic relationships with Hamilton City and Auckland City. WDC, as a regulator, manages large rural and significant ecological environments and recognises the importance of the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) and how it helps manage the Waikato District's social, economic, environmental, and cultural values.

Waikato District and part of the former Franklin District amalgamated in 2010 as part of the Auckland amalgamation. Since then, the Waikato District Plan has comprised two distinct sections (i.e., the Waikato Section and Franklin Section) with varying objectives, policies and rules. In 2014, the council undertook a district plan review. From that point, significant investment has been made in financial expenditure, staff time and other resources. This process has culminated in the recent decisions version of the Proposed District Plan (PDP) on 17 January 2022, after 46 hearings over almost two years. The new plan uses the National Planning Standards Framework and zones the district accordingly. Going back and asking our iwi/hapū, landowners and community to identify appropriate areas for exotic carbon forestry would be expensive, time-consuming and distressing.

3. Discussion

The release of the Discussion Paper shows some progress in acknowledging indigenous vegetation and its alternative as a long-term carbon capture opportunity or transitioning to indigenous vegetation. However, WDC is concerned with how exotic carbon forestry was allowed to occur at scale and cause the loss of substantial sustainably productive farms. The direction of this issue is now sent back to the local government to identify appropriate areas for this type of forestry and its long-term administration.

The cost rises for carbon credits are concerning as farming carbon has the potential to become more profitable than Dairy (farming milk), with impacts already being felt in other agricultural categories (Beef and Lamb, productive forestry) throughout New Zealand (NZ). This would radically alter NZ's terrestrial land use, native habitats and security of our national and international food production capability. Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) has acknowledged there is a problem and developed options. WDC supports the identification of the problem but is concerned about transferring this problem to the district or regional councils and requiring another resource management plan regime similar to what is occurring in the freshwater area.

In the previous submission, WDC asked that the definition for exotic forestry be removed from the 'permanent forests' category, which by definition of the MPI are "forests that are not intended to be clear-felled for at least 50 years, although they can be partially logged before then". Problems with this terminology include:

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- 1. In ecological terms, 50 years cannot be described as permanent in terms of a forest, so the terminology is misleading and will likely be misinterpreted by most.
- Carbon sequestration is only valuable as long as it remains sequestered. As soon as a piece
 of wood is harvested, some or all of its sequestered carbon is lost back to the atmosphere,
 thereby reducing or negating its carbon sequestration value. The act of harvesting itself
 produces carbon emissions and other short and long-term effects (sedimentation and
 forestry slag). This has not been carried through.
- 3. Once the wood has been harvested, its final use will become increasingly important from a Circularity perspective. Harvested wood (depending on quality) utilised as pulp and paper is more likely to transfer a portion of its carbon back to the atmosphere, depending on its disposal. Better resource use would be 'wood-based textile and building materials; this may need some tracking of the products and circularity principles applied. Locking up the carbon for more extended periods can be more sustainable than other building materials (concrete and steel) and is closer to a net-zero asset.

Waikato District Council are concerned with the proposals to:

"A guidance and implementation support programme would be developed to assist councils with capacity constraints."

This would mean that councils manage forests that consist of exotic species (such as Pinus radiata, other non-native conifers, or hardwoods) over the long term and potentially have to transition them into native forestry. Further work needs to be completed on "increasing incentives to plant permanent indigenous forests" as part of a holistic, integrated farm (mixture of pastoral and forestry), which has a range of flow-on effects other than Carbon sequestration (social, economic, cultural and environmental). As noted by Minister Nash, this should be "the right tree in the right location" and not at the expense of good productive agricultural land.

4. Summary/Conclusion

Afforestation is an essential tool for exotic carbon sequestration, but it needs to be sustainable and cognisant of the environment in which it is proposed. Locking land into exotic carbon forestry has seen a decline in rural production and a loss in rural communities economically, culturally and socially. The Waikato District has a range of soils, from high-class (LUC 1, 2 and 3) to less productive ones. Mass forestry planting would be a waste of their long-term production and put food security at risk.

The environmental impacts of exotic carbon forestry have been a loss of indigenous habitat and biodiversity (flora and fauna) and a rise in biosecurity issues from increased pests to wilding pines. Incentivising indigenous forestry provides for proper permanent indigenous forestry that is sustainable in perpetuity if maintained. It will raise flora and fauna (native birds, lizards and bats) and be more adaptive to climatic and resilience conditions (drought and flooding).

The proposal to give local authorities more power to decide where exotic forests should be planted under the RMA is concerning. This is a shift away from the centralised planning system proposed under the NBEA. Rather than further consultation, MPI could undertake national spatial planning to determine regions and districts where exotic forests might be considered and let unitary, regional, and district councils interpret this information. Alternatively, incentivise small forestry blocks of exotic or native vegetation integrated into wider whole sustainably productive farms. Include riparian plantings in this mix as natives should be planted close to waterways, wetlands and coastal areas to support Māori and iwi aspirations around kaitiakitanga of our environment. This could increase climate change resilience and offset greenhouse gas emissions for sustainable agricultural land use.

A key message of the council is that new technologies offer new solutions to managing and monitoring natural environments, particularly tracking indigenous afforestation. This includes how we monitor and gather information to guide decision-making to promote better the well-being of people and communities and well-functioning rural environments. Spatially capturing land information, monitoring and analysis enable the opportunity for agile and faster decision-making to support the afforestation of indigenous flora, the associated benefits and the management of risks to the natural environments.

Given that much of the afforestation will occur on land, we question whether it should be administered or overseen by district councils without appropriate support from MPI. Please see the link below to a system that has shifted land maintenance (mowing of pastoral land) and monitoring. From a policy/statistic/physical monitoring system to the technology of satellite and AI to analyse the mowing of fields (as landowners are required to do to qualify for a subsidy) in close to real-time. The system can also identify vegetation types, so the opportunities for adding AI to our monitoring systems have great potential. There is potential for something similar to manage indigenous and exotic forestry. The benefit is this information can be stored nationally, open sources and protected in perpetuity because it is centralised rather than distributed amongst lots of councils.

Questions and Answers

Part A Managing the environmental (biophysical) effects of exotic carbon forestry

Q A1 Do you agree with the problem statement set out above? Y/N Are there other things we should consider?

The loss of whole farms to exotic carbon forests is a real concern to the Waikato District Council. Productive, sustainable agriculture is a preferable use of the rural land located in the district because of the associated and long-term benefits to our communities and related businesses. There is no consideration under the problem statement that highlights the recognition of small forestry, protection of native bush lots and riparian planting undertaken by our agricultural sector in the

Waikato District. Rather than enabling a whole farm conversion, an integrated exotic and native forestry located on less usable parts of agricultural land may provide an opportunity to offset climate change emissions.

Q A2 Have we accurately described the environmental effects of exotic carbon forests (Table 2)? Y/N What other environmental effects (if any) need to be managed that are different to those of plantation forests? Please provide evidence on the impact of these effects.

Consideration needs to be given to more than the environmental effects (which are significant) and to include economic, social and cultural impacts. The loss of sustainable agricultural land and all the external inputs, including employees and associated support services, versus exotic carbon forests, which have very little oversight and support services input once planted. This would dramatically change the environment in the Waikato District, which is predominantly a productive, sustainable agricultural district, where the rural economy supports our local townships. Please consider future proofing the changes against the Resource Management (RM) reforms which shift from an effects-based regime to an outcomes-based approach.

Q A3 Do you agree that the environmental effects of exotic carbon forests should be managed through the NES-PF? Y/N Why?

We already have a Forestry Act that looks after productive exotic forestry and allows a permitted activity regime subject to meeting certain criteria and appropriate conditions. The NES-PF and the changes proposed, although focused on adding exotic carbon forestry, will create a regulatory regime that puts more pressure on district and regional councils to manage exotic carbon forestry with limited resources and knowledge across the country. Consider amending the definition of Plantation Forestry to include exotic carbon forests.

Q A4 The right-hand column of Table 2 sets out possible new regulatory controls. Please indicate if you disagree with any of these potential controls or feel we have missed anything, and explain or provide evidence.

We agree with the risks identified, and their need to be managed over the whole of the forest's lifecycle, from an ecosystem services perspective or outcomes-based approach. There is a need to distinguish between plantation Forestry for production and exotic carbon plantation Forestry related to the Emissions Trading Scheme.

Q A5 Do you agree with option 2 for managing the environmental effects of exotic carbon forestry (amend the NES-PF to include exotic carbon forests)? Y/N Why?

Promoting non-productive exotic carbon forestry to the detriment of all other land use, is a major concern in the Waikato District and wider Waikato region. It locks up land long-term, allowing very limited support services (employment and economic benefits) and a loss of community unity. It needs to be managed appropriately, but not by district and regional councils, as there would be a piecemeal approach across the country, where similar issues will arise (high pricing that forces out

certain land uses). Rationalising the rules that can be used nationally, and appropriate resourcing of councils is the preferable outcome.

Q A6 Do you agree that a National Environmental Standard should manage [choose one]:

(a) the environmental effects of exotic carbon forests only? Y/N or (b) environmental effects and forest outcomes, including transitioning from predominantly exotic to predominantly indigenous species? Y/N Why?

WDC respond that if you need to have the rules in the NES-PF mitigating the environmental effects of exotic carbon forestry, a transition mechanism to predominately indigenous forestry is required. For the long-term environmental benefits of New Zealand, regions and districts.

Q A7 Do you agree with the proposal in option 2 (amend the NES-PF to include exotic carbon forests) to add wind effects as a matter of discretion to Regulation 17, to manage potential instability as a result of wind for all forests on red zone land? Y/N What benefits or drawbacks would there be from adding wind effects?

Yes, exposed areas will have greater mortality on plant species (both exotic and native). Consideration needs to be given to shading impacts exotic forestry will have on adjacent native bush and pastoral land, loss of growth potential on neighbouring land needs to be factored in. Local examples of long-term forestry in the Waikato District show the benefit of buffer strips between the edges of the trees through to the boundary (maximum height of the tree, slope orientation), so the adjacent land (pastoral or native bush) is not shaded and loses productivity. This shading equation should be included in the new NES-PF.

Q A8 How effective would option 2 (amend the NES-PF to include exotic carbon forests) be in managing the environmental effects of exotic carbon forestry? [select from a range/scale not effective – highly effective] **30** Why?

Thought should be given to a national and/or regional process (Environmental Protection Agency or future Natural Built Environment Plans for regions) where appropriate resourcing can be identified and managed. Creating a whole new regulatory framework that may change in the 50-year growth cycle at a district level seems counterintuitive if it is to be replicated over and over again throughout New Zealand. District Councils could help manage exotic carbon forests but they need to be resourced and have central government support e.g. an exotic carbon forest registered and managed on LINZ.

Q A9 What implementation support would be needed for option 2 (amend the NES-PF to include exotic carbon forests)?

Consider spatial (GIS) layers across the country accessible by all. Create a pool of national-level funded expertise in forestry, monitoring and management, pest and weed control accessible to regional and district councils. Councils will need more than just guidance; training and technology solutions (centralised portal) are needed to log and check forestry over time. Funding and resourcing will be critical to protecting the environment.

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Q A10 Do you agree with option 3 for managing the environmental effects of exotic carbon forestry (amend the NES-PF to require forest management plans for exotic carbon forests)? Y/N Why?

Give some thought to a technical solution that templates the Forest Management Plans (FMP) and tracks them over time¹. The plans should be consistent across the country and housed in one database/portal. Given the length of time that will be needed having them spread across different local government departments would be of concern. Who would develop these FMPs? Does it create another consultancy-led process, or can a knowledgeable industry complete it with government support?

Q A11 Do you agree that forest management plans should manage [choose one] (a) environmental effects only? Y/N or (b) environmental effects and forest outcomes, including transitioning from predominantly exotic to predominantly indigenous specie(s)? Y/N Why?

Exotic forestry has a finite lifespan and does nothing to improve indigenous biodiversity, which is in decline. If possible, there needs to be a transition to predominantly indigenous species (eco-sourced from the areas). Funding will need to be provided to scale up native plant propagation at a district level. There could be several partnership opportunities with local nurseries, iwi, hapū and marae to facilitate this both the propagation, maintenance, and monitoring of native forestry habitats. Consider access and management aspects to rural areas before confirming this, e.g., it might be better to go straight to indigenous biodiversity in some locations, particularly small integrated forestry in farming areas, which arise an option not considered in the changes proposed but needs to be.

Q A12 Based on your answer to the previous question, what content should be required in forest management plans?

It will depend on the landowner and the location of the site. The location, soil type, contours, area of forest to be managed, proximity to waterbodies, and type of vegetation, e.g., all exotic, all native or a mixture of both will need to be considered. Furthermore, consideration of boundaries of other properties, the proximity of native vegetation (SNAs and Conservation covenants), land contours, soil type, cultural sites, legal status and how the land might adjust to extreme weather events (drought and flooding). Additionally, consideration should be given to the identification of fire breaks and buffer areas at the boundaries and around any key infrastructure on the property (cell phone towers, transmission lines, gas lines etc.

Q A13 How effective would option 3 (amend the NES-PF to require forest management plans for exotic carbon forests) be in managing the environmental effects of exotic carbon forestry? [select from a range/scale not effective – highly effective] **50** Why?

There would be an improvement, but it would be better to make this process as simple as possible for landowners integrating forestry into wider farming blocks. The key will be implementing and

having appropriate resourcing, expertise and guidance to help manage and monitor the forestry over time.

Q A14 What implementation support would be needed for option 3 (amend the NES-PF to require forest management plans for exotic carbon forests)?

WDC will need a high level of central government support, including a national database mapping all the exotic carbon forestry. Consider a constraints mapping exercise to identify no-go areas. Reasonable national standards around good practice including setbacks or buffers from boundaries, conservation areas, and infrastructure (telecommunications, power and roads) where shading might impact. If not a national approach, at least a regional one. Consider a stock take of all areas within regions, opportunities for less productive land to be retired rather than full farm conversion—national incentives to undertake a small portion of land retirement.

Part B Controlling the location of plantation and exotic afforestation to manage social, cultural and economic effects

Q B1 Do you agree with the problem statement set out above? Y/N Are there other things we should consider?

Open up marginal through to good productive land to being locked up for long terms as exotic carbon forestry. There are some merits to this, but you lose productivity from your rural economy, food security, etc. Consideration of the emissions pricing scheme and whether the loss of our productive land to exotic forestry is appropriate given our landowners are some of the most efficient and sustainable globally Are we shifting the climate effects to less productive areas? Other factors must be considered to understand if they are a socially (local communities) culturally, economically and environmentally appropriate.

Q B2 Have we accurately described the social, cultural, and economic effects of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation at a community level (Appendix D refers)? Y/N What other social, cultural or economic effects should we be aware of? Please provide evidence of the impact of these effects.

This seems to be a one size fits all approach, which will have unintended consequences. It seems to ignore the potential to have small pockets of well-managed forestry (exotic and native) on farms integrated with agriculture. These small pockets need to be added to the national sequestration equation. Even if we don't have the numbers that stack up internationally will, in time and in the interim, we still retain the majority of our land productivity.

Q B3 Do you agree that the social, cultural and economic effects of plantation and exotic carbon forests should be managed through the resource management system? Y/N Why?

Creating another regulatory process that devolves problems down to councils (under-resourced to manage them) is not the best option from WDC's view. We have forestry legislation that is permitted subject to meeting the criteria. This could continue if the resourcing, oversite and monitoring are implemented. We liken the situation to speculative aquaculture, where there was a rush to put in

applications for space without the associated groundwork or innovative alternatives, e.g., integrating forestry and riparian planting into existing farms on a wide scale.

Q B4 What is your preferred option for managing the social, cultural, and economic effects of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation? Select from the list: Option 1 (a local control approach); Option 2 (a consent requirement through national direction); No preference; I do not support either of these options. Or no preference. Why?

Option 1: The control appears to shift the responsibility onto local or regional councils. Option 2: is slightly more preferred, given you can apply it nationally, but we are unsure whether a consenting framework is the best outcome. It still focuses on large-scale conversion and misses the opportunity for small pockets of forestry (exotic and native) for carbon sequestration, integrated and rewarded without losing whole farms and productive land.

Q B5 How effective would option 1 (a local control approach to managing the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation) be in managing the social, cultural and economic effects of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation? [select from a range/scale not effective – highly effective] **20** Why?

It is difficult to rank the answer without more detail. But as with question B4 shifting more policy work, plan changes, consenting and compliance work to local councils, with no additional resources or understanding of the local realities is no ideal.

Q B6 What impact would option 1 (a local control approach to managing the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation) have on the rate and pattern of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation?

It may slow it down initially, but you first must set in operative rules, as well as time and cost implications for achieving that and vested interests may challenge this approach and draw it out further.

Q B7 What are the benefits of option 1 (a local control approach to managing the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation)?

It is difficult to answer without more detail. Potentially local communities get to decide on the mix of agriculture to forestry. It might be better for Mana whenua to convert marginal land.

Q B8 What are the costs or limitations of option 1 (a local control approach to managing the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation)?

Replicating the process across most rural councils in New Zealand will have cost and time implications. At a minimum WDC will need to consult well and get the right mix between iwi/Māori, farmers, ,the agricultural sector and carbon farming investors and industry, i.e. cost estimates to

develop variations or plan changes could run into hundreds of thousands of dollars as well as resourcing this at the same time.

Q B9 If option 1 (a local control approach to managing the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation) is progressed, would making plan rules to manage the social, cultural and economic effects of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation by controlling its location be a priority for your community or district? Choose from a range Not a priority to high priority Why?

It is difficult to rank the answer, as we do not think the responsibility of mapping the future forestry areas should sit with local government.

Q B10 What implementation support would be needed for option 1 (a local control approach to managing the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation)?

Standardization of processes and rules to allow for small forestry (native and exotic) to be considered for sequestration. Consider small-scale integrated forestry to whole farms where landowners receive a percentage of the benefits even if it is agglomerated as a catchment for accounting purposes.

If option 2 (a consent requirement through national direction to control the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation) is further developed:

Q B11 Are the variables outlined above (type of land, scale of afforestation, type of afforestation i.e., plantation, exotic carbon, transitional) the most important ones to consider? Y/N What, if any, others should we consider?

A simplified mechanism. All forestry at cross-scale is subject to buffer areas, shading (adjacent productive land and roads etc.) fire control, and pest and weed control. Consider natural hazards and the impacts of climate change (more flooding and droughts).

Q B12 Which afforestation proposals should require consent? (Please consider factors such as the type of land, the scale of afforestation, the type of afforestation (plantation, exotic carbon, transitional) and other factors you consider important).

Requiring land use consent for whole farm conversion to exotic carbon forestry is of concern to WDC. But the bigger issue is the loss of sustainable productive land. Is another complex regulatory approach requiring landowners to engage specialty expertise to proceed with exotic carbon forestry going to solve this problem. If consent is required councils will need to respond where this capability is thin on the ground. Future legal action if activities are not approved, impacts on neighboring land, compliance and monitoring. We must consider alternative methods and opportunities to run an online fast-track process. These may include the use of drone or aerial information, national guidance, possible survey certification, and annual reviews.

Based on your answers above:

Q B13 How effective would option 2 (a consent requirement through national direction to control the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation) be in managing the social, cultural and economic effects of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation? [select from a range/scale not effective – highly effective] **60** Why?

Look at the current productive Forestry provisions; these are permissive (excluding slash management). Subject to the formal requirements of well-managed forestry, it is a permitted activity. It would be good if this continued. Slash management has not always been dealt with appropriately in this system and has caused major environmental impacts due to extreme weather events.

Q B14 What impact would option 2 (a consent requirement through national direction to control the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation) have on the rate and pattern of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation? Please explain or provide evidence.

That there is a clear and level playing field for all Forestry (productive and exotic carbon), everyone knows the rules, and they are consistent. There maybe an opportunity for regional and district tweaks around the landscape, natural and cultural features and nationally significant infrastructure. There needs to be more opportunities for the integration of agriculture and forestry rather than one or the other.

Q B15 What are the benefits of option 2 (a consent requirement through national direction to control the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation)?

Is there potential to do a national spatial analysis of existing and identify the most appropriate locations for new forestry areas plus their long-term management and monitoring? This would give local council's a national perspective and allow local government to weigh the loss of productive land to marginal land and the benefits of carbon sequestration against economic productivity and food security.

Q B16 What are the costs and limitations of option 2 (a consent requirement through national direction to control the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation)?

With Option 2, there is a need for a wider national assessment or at least organizing input from key local government areas. The limitations are we lose the fine granular information from councils, iwi/hapū and communities on the ground.

Q B17 What are the most important and urgent social, cultural and economic effects of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation that you would like to see managed under the resource management system? Where and at what scale do these effects need to be managed?

The rapid loss of whole farms to exotic carbon afforestation without the checks required in plantation forestry. This will result in the break-up of rural communities and those key pastoral support systems. WDC are concerned at the potential long-term environmental impacts of exotic carbon afforestation if they are just left in perpetuity. Who picks up the pieces when they reach the end of life and start to cause environmental effects from pests, wilding pines, debris captured during flooding, erosion etc.? Do we need bonds or land titles put up as collateral to be a good forestry manager?

Q B18 Should this be done now under the RMA, or later under the proposed National Planning Framework and NBA plans?

I would recommend a moratorium on new whole-farm conversions, particularly to Overseas Investment Opportunities. Consult with iwi/hapū, productive forestry and rural communities, but minimise RMA involvement and defer it to the National Planning Framework, Natural Built Plans and the Spatial Planning Act. Acknowledgement there is a spatial aspect to this on where farm conversion could be appropriate. Work needs to happen around smaller forestry areas (exotic/native) integrated into the farm(s), with smaller targets and less productive land loss.

Q B19 Would standards in an amended NES-PF need the support of national policies and objectives? Y/N Why?

Yes. Otherwise, regions and districts will have to develop objectives, policies and methods separately and defend them. This is not effective or efficient planning.

Q B20 What implementation support would be needed for option 2 (a consent requirement through national direction to control the location of plantation and exotic carbon afforestation)?

A national approach that mapping of all forestry areas. Help develop consistent objectives and policies for new Natural Built Plans, largely for each region to plug and use with the ability to have specific exceptions. Some examples might include ONLs, ONFs, cultural sites, ecological sites, flood plains, waterbodies and geothermal areas etc.

Part C Improving wildfire risk management in all forests

Q C1 Do you agree that wildfire risk management plans (WRMPs) should be included in the NES-PF? Y/N Why?

Yes to ensure Environmental, Social, Cultural and Economic Risk Reduction.

Q C2 Do you agree that the role of councils in monitoring the WRMP should be limited to ensuring that a plan has been developed? Y/N If not, what should the role of councils be?

It should not be council's role to ensure a plan has been developed but we believe that one is required. This role should sit with FENZ to facilitate submission review and ensure existing compliance as they are the expert body.

Q C3 Do you agree that a five-year review requirement is appropriate for WRMPs? Y/N Why?

At a minimum but this is best advised by FENZ.

Q C4 Do you agree that a module for a WRMP that is consistent with farm plan templates could be used for farmers with forests to plan for managing wildfire risk? Y/N If no, please provide reasons.

Q C5 What implementation support would be needed for this proposal?

Additional resources would be required across FENZ if this was to go ahead to oversee these compliance aspects. Better information with a forestry layer nationally (including small exotic and native areas).

Part D Enabling foresters and councils to better manage the environmental effects of forestry wilding conifer risk management

Q D1 Do you agree with Proposal 1 for managing wilding risk (update the Wilding Tree Risk Calculator and guidance, and require the submission of a standardised worksheet assessment to councils at least six months prior to planting)? Y/N If not, please explain why.

Consider a risk-based approach over a long period of time, with built-in reviews, given ecosystems change over time and climatic conditions will continually alter.

Q D2 Do you agree that extending the notification period for wilding conifer scores to no sooner than six months and no later than eight months before afforestation begins is an appropriate length of time? Y/N If not, what timeframe would you suggest and why?

See D1

Q D3 Do you agree with Proposal 2 for managing wilding risk (require all forests to assess wilding tree risk at replanting)? Y/N If not, please explain why.

See D1

Q D4 Do you agree that changes to regulation 79(6) will clarify the intent and avoid confusion over property access rights? Y/N Why?

Require forestry owners or managers to remove wilding pines from adjacent properties where a landowner identifies them, set distance from the boundary, prevailing wind and wildlife drop.

Slash management

Q D5 Do you agree with each of the proposed amendments to the NES-PF in relation to slash regulations set out in Table 4? Y/N If not, please identify any you disagree with by referencing the number in the left-hand column of Table 4 and explain why you disagree.

At a minimum, there needs to be provisions for slash management close to water bodies. For example, WDC would not like to see slash or old decayed forestry washed into the Waikato or Waipa rivers or their tributaries at any time or during a flood event.

Q D6 What information about slash risk and management do you or your organisation require? What is the best way for you to receive this information?

Discuss with forestry experts and refer to councils with this expertise.

Q D7 What tools or information do you use to assess operational requirements for the 5 per cent annual exceedance probability (AEP) requirement?

Discuss with forestry experts and refer to councils with this expertise.

Initial alignment with NES-Freshwater

Q D8 Do you agree with the proposed changes to align the NES-PF with the NES- Freshwater, set out in Table 5? Y/N If not, please identify any you disagree with by referencing the number in the left-hand column of Table 5 and explain why you disagree.

WDC has concerns over the level of detail required by landowners to cross-check this legislation and make appropriate land management decisions. The process should be simpler, particularly for small-area forestry options (exotic and native) used to sequester carbon and offset farm emissions.

Q D9 Do you anticipate any unintended consequences from this proposal to align parts of the NES-PF with the NES-Freshwater?

As with the shading of adjacent land, roading, and native bush areas, consideration must be given to the unintended consequences of mass forestry. Buffers or setbacks must be adjacent to all water bodies and courses. Consider appropriate native plantings to protect and mitigate future flood damage in these areas.

Operational and technical issues

Q D10 Do you agree with each of the proposed changes to the NES-PF to address operational and technical issues set out in Table 6? Y/N If not, please identify any you disagree with by the number in the left-hand column of Table 6 and explain why you disagree.

In some cases, we have not proposed an amendment but are seeking further information, as follows:

Q D11 Temporary structures for river crossings (row D5d of Table 6): Do you agree that this type of river crossing could be permitted under certain conditions? Y/N What conditions should be applied to the crossing as a permitted activity?

Q D12 Dual culverts (row D5e of Table 6): Is there a need to include double culverts in the regulations? Y/N If so, what permitted activity conditions should apply to these river crossings?

Q D13 Culvert diameters (row D5g of Table 6): Is a 325mm minimum internal diameter specification for stormwater culverts for forestry roads or forestry tracks in green, yellow and orange zones with a land slope of fewer than 25 degrees an appropriate minimum?

(Think about the availability of culverts of this size and the products you commonly use or require). Y/N If not, please explain why.

Q D14 Notice periods (row D7a of Table 6): Do you agree that notice periods could be reduced or waived for earthworks, quarrying and harvesting in green and yellow zones? Y/N Please explain your answer with evidence to support your position. If you think notice periods could be reduced what would you suggest is an appropriate notice period?

Q D15 Notice periods (row D7d of Table 6): Where you have experience of annual notice periods (either positive or negative) please provide your views on whether annual notifications are working well or whether changes to the regulations are required. If you consider changes are required, please indicate what environmental risks will be better managed through change.

Q D16 Indigenous vegetation (row D9b of Table 6): If the definition of indigenous vegetation is changed to that used in the National Policy Statement for Indigenous Vegetation do you foresee any practical or operation issues for plantation forestry and enforcement of the regulations? Y/N Why? WDC prefers consistency of the terminology.

Q D17 Vegetation clearance (row D9c of Table 6): Do you think there will be any negative consequences of amending the definition of vegetation clearance in the NES-PF to clarify that part (b) of the definition does not authorise any vegetation clearance but that a forest crop should generally be harvestable within the constraints of the regulations?

Y/N Please provide evidence to support your views.

Not at this stage.

Q D18 Incidental damage (row D9d of Table 6): Please provide any evidence you have that the definition of incidental damage is causing issues for users and the nature of those issues. Do you have suggestions for how the definition could be less subjective while still achieving the intent of allowing minor damage to indigenous vegetation under limited circumstances?

No comment.

Q D19 Health and safety (row D12a of Table 6): What additional information or resources could help foresters and councils make decisions that balance environmental outcomes with worker safety when managing slash?

Discuss with forestry experts and refer to councils with this expertise.

Capacity and capability of local authorities to implement the NES-PF

Q D20 What sources of information or training do you currently use to inform your decisions for forestry?

None

Q D21 What areas of forestry practice required by the NES-PF do you need more information about or training in?

All of it, but greater knowledge of Exotic Carbon Forestry, its management, maintenance and monitoring over time. How we ensure that transitional provisions from exotic to native forestry occur without any or limited environmental damage? Mechanisms to indemnify landowners to undertake good forestry operations and management.

Q D22 What are the best forms of delivery for that information or training? This may include a range of delivery methods or forums.

Nationally, given the small pool of expertise in forestry management. The expertise of forestry over the long term is limited, so rather than councils via this small pool, it should be organised at a national level and the information disseminated amongst those affected.

4. Conclusion
