#### **REPORTS**

**Upper Northern Waikato Station Indicative Business Case**, presented by Andy Lightower and Phil King

Clive Morgan advised before hearing about the business case that funding needs to be sourced for LTP 2024 and is not guaranteed at this stage

Phil spoke about Te Huia – expectation of 100000 passengers in 2023. A big increase in passengers travelling to Auckland

4 services Monday to Friday and 2 services on Saturday and Sunday in conjunction with bus services to Papakura

Andy said that the preferred option is Tuakau with a detailed business case for Pokeno in next 2-3 years. Stations on either side of the rail tracks. Cost for Pokeno requires overbridge between stations. Not required for Tuakau or Te Kauwhata as stations are close to railway road crossings.

They advised that we cannot rely on electrification of lines south of Pukekohe. Kiwirail has a business plan in place for electrification all the way to Hamilton Te Huia has end of life late 2020's and it will be required to look at new rolling stock which may be either full electric or battery

Source for populations is Waikato University on behalf of WDC Regarding funding, Waikato District Council, Waikato Regional Council and Waka Kotahi involved in LTP 2024. Subregional strategic planning – Futureproof

### Councillor's report

He has spent 22 days in council in the last month in workshops including Rail Strategy and said it is quite possible that stations at both Tuakau and Pokeno will be built. He mentioned that some of the rail link to Hamilton is single lane and will need to be upgraded to 2 tracks in the future Also discussed LTP for council property, freedom camping etc

Ric Odom advised that PCC is an interested party in the various appeals to the Waikato District Plan for Pokeno. He said that provided the stipulations the PCC has put in place, it will probably withdraw from the appeals.

### **Wellington Street**

Now completed. However sealing to laneway behind shops has not been done as the laneway is privately owned

### **Pokeno Sports Park**

Earthworks have been delayed again due to weather, but hopefully all works, including carpark, will be completed by the end of December. There are no play areas for older children apart from Mark Ball Drive and Harriet Johnson Drive which are geared to small children so this needs to be completed as soon as possible

Joel McKinley was asked about easement/right of way from Helenslee Road to the sports park. He is waiting for WDC to contact him so will follow up

#### **New Toilet Block**

WDC now has a contractor and works should be completed by 31 December 2023. There are 5 toilet blocks around the district which are to be upgraded

### Main Street upgrade

This is due to commence in November 2023. Summer construction will include pedestrian crossing with traffic light

Roundabout at Great South Road and Pokeno Road will be built at the same time. This will substantially reduce speeds coming into the main street and around the Gull service centre

#### **Speed limits**

These are being reviewed as there are anomalies around the town which need to be sorted out

#### Marae site

This is to be reviewed. Preferred site is Pokeno Domain and the Dogpark in Avon Road. However this has to be decided as there Is very little spare land owned by the council in Pokeno

**New School site** has to be determined as Pokeno School is now at capacity.

#### **COMMUNITY PATROL**

Doug Rowe advised that they had their AGM on 27 August and now have a new administrator. They now have 40 patrollers but are still looking for new members.

He also advised that a fake \$50 was passed at the Pokeno Dairy today and it looks almost identical to a real one so be aware

He told the Committee that Adam Baillie (son of committee member Janet) won a gold medal at the Deaf Games in the UK and suggested that an achievement award be given to him

He also offered thanks for the nomination for himself and Marion for the Mayor's award


#### **Pokeno Hall**

Hall committee had their AGM recently and now have 1 new member. Helen advised that it will cost about \$300000 to replace the roof which is not viable so new spouting will be put on the roof which will mitigate the overspill causing the flooding. The ceiling in the supper room will be replaced with new insulation installed

3 new urinals have been installed in the Men's which will reduce the water use.

# **SH1 Papakura to Drury**

## Project overview:

- A \$655 million project being delivered as part of the NZ Upgrade Programme.
- Includes an additional lane in each direction; wide shoulders for future bus services; a shared walking and cycling path; interchange improvements; improved access across SH1; improved safety, environmental and amenity features.
- Consenting completed in three stages.
- Construction ongoing until late 2027 at least.




# **Project Stages**



# Stage 1A Construction progress


- Completed Southbound pavement widening, south of Papakura Interchange
- Completed Papakura Southbound loop on-ramp rebuild
- Phase 3 traffic layout installed in Sept all lanes shifted to the east. Northbound lanes now separated by central median barrier
- Continuing box culvert and stormwater works on northbound side
- Northbound road widening works ramping up now there's more space
- Beach Road (Papakura) utility services and shared path construction works begun.

# North Island Main Trunk (NIMT) bridges

- Three replacement bridges being built in advance of main Stage 1B1 works (ahead of KiwiRail electrification going live)
- Concrete decks on all three bridges in place
- Final works involve completing stitching the concrete barriers located on both sides of each bridge - and installing handrails and rail protection screens.
- Following this, activity pauses on bridges until the main Stage 1B1 works get underway.


# Stage 1A coming up

- Continue building the new Papakura (Beach Road) southbound on-ramp
- Continue staged works on Beach Road between Elliott/Chichester intersection and the motorway overbridge
- Continue northbound road widening, and stormwater & culvert works
- Complete current NIMT bridge works.

1.	Pokeno Road Layby – the layby near the new traffic lights – Cecelia has had a few complaints re safety of the road. From those who live on Pokeno Road, coming from Tuakau. There are two entries a top one and the bottom one. The entrances are hard to see.  Action: 3 May 2022 Consider options to increase safety/visibility of entry/exit into layby. ### **Capital Projects Update** (As at 10 October 2023)

#### Pokeno Sports Park - Bulk Earth Works and Carpark Construction

Bulk Earthworks will recommence onsite, weather dependent, in the next few weeks.

There is around 8,000m<sup>3</sup> of fill material left to import to site, and 6,000m<sup>3</sup> in a stockpile on site ready to be placed as structural fill. Top soiling and grassing will be undertaken following the completion of the fill placement. It is anticipated that the bulk earthworks will be complete by the end of November.

The carpark works are fully designed and on track to commence late October with an 8-week construction period anticipated. WDC have been required to obtain a District Council Land Use Consent for these works inclusive of a Traffic Impact Assessment required by the Development Engineers to ensure safe access off Munro Rd.

### **Pokeno Toilet Replacement**

The toilet manufacturing and installation contract was awarded to Modern Build Solutions, a local modular builder in Ngaruawahia. They will start construction on the toilet blocks required district-wide including Pokeno effective immediately.

These will take 6 – 8 weeks to build and we should start to see these be delivered to site in December depending on site works.

#### **Munro Road Resilience Improvement**

Upgrading the culverts beneath Munro Road between Pokeno Rd and Huia Rd, and raising the road to enhance its resilience against potential floods.

Resource consent applications have been submitted.

#### Pokeno Road - Bridge to Munro Rd

Upgrade of the road corridor to connect to the school, and to install a pedestrian footbridge. Scheduled to be finished July / August 2024.

Half of the roading and footpath stretch is scheduled to be completed this summer, and is reliant on a resource consent being granted. The pedestrian footbridge will be starting in the next summer (2024/25) if funding is confirmed.

#### **Great South Road and Pokeno Road Intersection Upgrade**

Intersection transformation with a roundabout.

We are working through value engineering and pricing with the contractor and are still on track to start physical works in November, budget permitting.

### **Pokeno Skate Park**

The skate park for Pookeno is just entering consultation stage at present as we analyse what is possible to deliver and what external funding may be available, so no design has yet been completed until consultation has taken place.
