7.1. Andrew Wilson, WRC Manager

Public Transport

Presented the Bus Service Tenders would be awarded the coming week for the seven-day service (buses two-hourly) servicing three townships (via Pokeno / Tuakau / Buckland / Pukekohe). A three-hourly service would operate at weekends. December is the preferred start date or by 10 January 2021.

Customer Services will issue timetables imminently to the community. All buses will have wheelchair access. The service is a WRC commitment to a three-year period.

7.2. Ross Bayer, WDC

Proposed Roading Works Pokeno

The LTP process for WDC has some 250 projects on the go. Ross explained that WDC needs to prioritise these projects and an updated prioritised list would be provided by WDC to the communities. For Pokeno, this means in the short-term, restructure from Helenslee Road, past the School to the town centre on Great South Road. This work is to commence soon. In the next three weeks a plan is to be provided for the update of Pokeno Road.

ACTION: PCC to ensure that they put into Council, for LTP funding of roading projects by NZTA/WDC, for work to commence in the next construction period i.e. October 2021. Important this is done in next three weeks, so projects can be prioritised. It is ideal PCC identify and prioritise projects that are 'safety' orientated.

Helen has requested from WDC the road traffic plan for when the supermarket (Countdown) opens. What is the plan and is there one? What is happening around the truck stop, HGV, service vehicles and usage of Wellington Street? Safety is a big concern for 'all' road users. Ross Bayer communicated to Helen that he would arrange a walk by, to view the issues around the truck stop. Ross also informed the PCC that the car park between the truck stop and the shops would be resealed by/in December.

Parks - Munro Road Sports Park

The Contractor establishment is complete at the site. An Iwi blessing was held on Tuesday 29 October and some testing was carried out to identify areas of unsuitable site material during the rest of that week. Earthworks are now underway.

Works are on hold while options are identified, costed, and discussed with the community. A memo has been circulated to the PCC, Cr Church, and Cr Henderson.

Cemeteries - Whangarata Cemetery Development

In order to accelerate the programme for this project, negotiations are underway with the contractor currently constructing the Munro sports park stream diversion earthworks. If an acceptable price can be agreed on the contractor will establish directly to the Whangarata site at the completion of the Munro earthworks in December. This would enable a January commencement of works.

The pavement components of the project would then be incorporated into a contract with similar work types.

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




