Community Projects Team - Project Update

Tuakau Library Extension

The project timeline for the construction is on track and although the team are having some minor procurement issues with supply of building materials, the schedule for completion is still the end of May.

The project is tracking to budget and scheduled inspections have been passed with no additional works required. Some contract variations have been issued due to unforeseen circumstances with minimal impact on the project.





Tuakau Library extension

Tuakau Skatepark

The multi-party funding agreement is in the process of being signed by TYST and WDC.

Project Manager has received the detailed design and will schedule to advertise the construction tender in May. Due to the time frame of getting the approved design back and going out to tender, the build will not take place until next summer.

Whangarata Cemetery

Earthworks is 90% complete with the water services installed, tested, and connected to the main supply.

Accessway construction has commenced with aggregate being placed over subgrade. Subsoil drains have been placed along edge of accessway alignment and further subsoil drains within the proposed location of the burial plots are to commence.

Minor delays due to recent wet weather with the earthworks contractor targeting the week of the 19 April for completion of their work.

Waikato District Alliance are to complete the pavement and kerbing scheduled from the end of April.

Dr Lightbody Reserve Car Park

The design is underway. The construction will be carried out by the Waikato District Alliance.
