5.Cr Bech Report – (circulated)

- Xtreme Zero Waste on hold post lockdown.
- Tamahere Park Update Lions picnic tables x 2 awaiting installation. A further 3 seats have been ordered.
- Fitness trail location selected, price and options after lockdown.
- E Charger at commercial hub still working on this.
- Shovel ready projects government sponsored projects post lockdown. Gully restoration and shared paths submitted for consideration.
- WDC governance temporary governance structure in place during lockdown. WDC has welfare team in place for vulnerable residents.

Action Point: Committee would like to see a Plan of the location of the proposed Fitness Trail, prior to it being 'locked in' as there was no 'written plan' at the walk around and many members were not able to be present. Cr Bech can you ask for this for us please.

<u>6. Service Delivery Report - Jacob Quinn (circulated). Noted this is not complete due to Covid 19 and staffing assignment.</u>

- Horse poo in public places bylaws outlined. Comments; Happy for horses on berms or paths - not road. Tamahere a 'Country Living Zone' and many own horses. Expect riders to show etiquette and collect poo.
- Tamahere Park planting plan, rubbish bin locations, cars out, removing farm fence covered.

7. Tamahere Forum Payment

Comments: Multiple responses agree the Forum is a great source of community information. Two respondents question how effective it is and how widely distributed, how it connects with other social media forums, how to increase content. Statistics on usage requested under general review.

8. Connectivity Sub-Committee report – James Yearsley (circulated)

Comments: Multiple members support contacting those appropriate that can help with getting a better understanding of the numbers on the eastern side of the expressway that are likely to use the crossing. James to send a copy of the presentation to Tamahere School and Eventide Home and get

the usage numbers. Further comment - report request should be for the whole roundabout area, particularly movement across the roundabout from Tamahere Drive to Devine Road.

Resolution

- That TCC approaches NZTA to understand the feasibility and detailed analysis regarding all the proposed crossing options over the on and off ramps for State Highway 1 (SH1) including the TCC preferred option of an underpass for the on-ramp near the intersection of Devine Road and the SH1 on ramp.
 - It is understood that NZTA commissioned such a report from Beca as part of the Cityedge Alliance work
- That TCC asks WDC to review the One Network Plan and provide an update to the TCC incorporating issues relevant to the southern Hamilton/Tamahere roading, footpaths, bus routes and cycleways including.:
 - Newell Road and Divine Road closures (plan and timeframe)
 - Emergency planning options for a closure of expressway at the Tamahere Interchange.
 - To include reasonably predictable future numbers of School children that could use the crossing
 - Assess the impact of increased usage by mobility scooters from the Eventide and Tamahare Country Club
 - Assess the impact of the completion of the Southern Links on the One Network Plan.
- TCC respectfully asks the Tamahere Ward Councillor Aksel Bech to approach the MPs, Tim van de Molen and Jamie Strange to push this on behalf of the Tamahere Community

9. WDC/Te Awa works report – Luke McCarthy (circulated)

- All work has been halted by the Level 4 lockdown. Tamahere Drive to Hooker Rd almost complete.
- Detailed design being finalised for Riverglade Newell Devine Wiremu Tamihana section. Liaising with NZTA regarding funding application.
- A further question to Luke regarding the markings on the Devine Rd Birchwood Lane intersection suggesting a roundabout, resulted in him saying that WDC were going to trial a temporary roundabout there. There was no response to the question raised about whether there were traffic problems there.

Comments: TCC should be part of decision process with regard to where Te Awa goes. Through the Piazza to Birchwood seems logical to avoid vehicle areas.

Action Point; Sue to further discuss with Luke McCarthy.

10.Walkways Subcommittee – Leo Koppens (circulated)

TCC MOU concept with landowners has been with WDC since September. Track work funder no longer available.

Action Point: Requested that Cr Bech continue work on this.

11. Fitness trail subcomittee

TCC members have walked the proposed trail route.

<u>Comments:</u> Would like to see a "paper version" of the proposed route and features, plus proposal as to design, cost and timetable to construct. <u>Action see above.</u>
