<u>REPORT</u>

<u>Hearing for Proposed Amendments to the Waikato District Council Keeping of Animals Bylaw</u> 2015

The Chairperson summarised the process for the hearing.

The following submissions were presented, and submitters responded to questions from the Committee:

Mr Whyte on behalf of the Huntly Community Board (Submission Page No. 120)

The Huntly Community Board Chairperson presented a powerpoint presentation on behalf of the Board (Doc I) and the following matters were discussed:

- Concern was raised that 60 days for the keeping of lambs was too short and should be extended to 90 days.
- Moveable chicken tractors/cages be included as an acceptable way to have chickens in the urban area.
- The Huntly Community Board approved the number of chickens to be kept as recommended in the bylaw.

Mr Whyte on behalf of the Ohinewai Area Committee (Submission Page No. 123)

Mr Whyte presented a powerpoint presentation on behalf of the Ohinewai Area Committee (Doc 2) and the following matters were discussed:

- Honeybee numbers were not declining in New Zealand. Hives had tripled in the last 3 years.
- Impact of large numbers of hives in the rural/urban area.
- Concern was raised on the amount of bee excrement on houses in a residential area.
- Possible bee attacks close to schools and residential areas.

Ms Taylor (Submission Page No. 67)

Ms Taylor presented a powerpoint presentation (Doc 3) and the following matters were discussed:

- An individual horse did not require 2 hectares of land. Request that "2 hectares" be amended to "2 acres".
- Definition of "urban" required clarification.

Ms Sclater on behalf of the New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders Association (Submission Page No. 106)

The following matters were discussed:

- An individual horse did not require 2 hectares of land. Request that "2 hectares" be amended to "2 acres".
- The thoroughbred industry is a key contributor to the Waikato economy.
- The definition of "urban spread" and the affect on small breeding units.
- Equine welfare is a matter of high importance to New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing. There are standards/rules that trainers must abide by.

Cr Gibb left the meeting at 10.27am.

The meeting adjourned at 10.27am and resumed at 10.46am.

Ms Cooper, supported by Ms Sclater, on behalf of the New Zealand Trainers Association (Submission Page No. 110)

The following matters were discussed:

- The Racing Integrity Unit monitored the licensing of horse racing trainers, racing facilities and non compliances.
- The Equine Health Association recommended all horses be micro chipped.

Cr Gibb re-entered the meeting at 10.47am during discussion on the above submission.

Mr Giltrap (Submission Page No. 20)

The following matters were discussed:

- Definition of "country living" required clarification.
- Pigeons for racing should not be included under poultry numbers.
- Moveable chicken tractors/cages be included as an acceptable way to have chickens in the urban area.
- The restriction of 6 birds should have the word "adult" added to the description.

Mr Nicholson (Submission Page No. 40)

The following matters were discussed:

- Mr Nicholson and Ms Wadham owned a lifestyle block behind the Te Kauwhata Village centre that was zoned business/commercial. It had been identified as future town centre development and is currently used as a lifestyle block.
- Definition of "country living" required clarification.
- Request that "2 hectares" be amended to "I acre".

Cr Lynch left the meeting at 11.40am.

The meeting adjourned at 11.40am and resumed at 12.30pm.

Ms Conroy (Submission Page No. 28) (via audio visual conference)

The following matters were discussed:

- Impact to horses and landowners of the 2 hectares of land requirement.
- Horse manure clarification was required on the definition of "nuisance".
- Danger of riding horses on the road.
- Animal welfare was essential.

Use of mobile tractors to be placed in the bylaw document.

<u>Lambs</u>

Keeping of lambs to be for a 90 day period.

ACTION: Urban definitions to be removed from the bylaw.
