TCC response to 3 Waters reform - Cr Bech

5. SH21 Underpass Update - Matt Kofoed (Downers)

- Progressing well despite covid restrictions.
- Pre cast panels for southern side have been delivered. Northern side in 1/12.

6. Safety and Connectivity Report – Sarah Loynes

There are two main recommendations for safe pedestrian crossing of the SH21 on ramp following research and public consultation;

- 1. The Subway underpass wass determined to be the best solution but funding would not be available for at least 5 years. Therefore the 2nd best option, an at Grade crossing signaled on the northbound onramp is recommended as it has strong benefits, is lower cost, can be funded immediately and the benefits will be available soon.
- The Subway alternative is noted as the best solution and the operation of the roundabouts and traffic will be monitored and situation reviewed once the outcome of the proposed Southern Links roading project is determined. The At Grade crossing may be progressed to an underpass in the future.
- The entire SH 21 roundabout system and ramps need to change to reduce speeds.
- Bigger picture of proposed Southern Links Bypass, its timeframe and new demands from Peacockes Development, expectations and changes related to climate change and traffic movements in the interim needs investigation.
- Next steps NZTA to finalise business case, TCC input on design of At Grade solution required, consider what will trigger progressing to an underpass.
- Timing as soon as processes are worked through.
- James to continue to liase with Waka Kotahi.
- Location of bus stops on the on and off ramps under review.

7. <u>Cr Bech Report - circulated</u>

Tamahere Park/Piazza Update

• Remaining 2 benches to block field vehicle access plus another for shade area have been ordered. Fitness pad being progressed.

Consultations

- Future proof consultation submissions close November 12th. **Action**; Lyn, Sue and Charles to work on a submission
- Expressway speeds under consultation
- Initial targeted rate discussions had with TCC and Hall Chairs.

Birchwood Lane

• Alfred Main Drive now open as access to Cherry Lane and Bollard Rds with traffic using Birchwood Lane until the on and off ramps open. Locals report excess speed. 'Your Speed' sign to be installed.

Total Mobility

• New initiative allowing personalized door to door transportation for registered persons with a temporary or permanent disability at a 50% discount up to a maximum fare. The provider claims the remainder from WDC. No limit on trip numbers nor any criteria for the purpose of a trip. Will launched in Level 2.

3 Waters

• Proposal now mandated by Government.

• The 28 years yet to run in a 30 year WaterCare contract will require some thinking around.

<u>8. Service Delivery – Tamahere Community Committtee Issues Report - Circulated Footpaths</u>

- Woodcock Rd footpath not approved as part of a subsudised program by NZTA for the current LTP period. However changes to the NZTA subsidy mean staff are working through a revised roading and footpath program for the LTP.
- The footpath extension on Devine Rd by Li'l Pumpkins will be completed within the current financial year.
- Bates Rd footpath upgrade request by a resident resident has been advised by TCC to lodge a request with WDC

Tamahere Park - Fitness Trail

• Ponding issues and broken fence panels along the path are being addressed.

Tamahere Park - Pavillion

- 3 tenders being evaluated before the contract is awarded.
- TCC asks when costs will be available. Geoff to follow up.

Annebrook Road

- SH1 access closed off, new Matangi Rd access open.
- Tidy up work will be completed as weather improves.
- Base Civil will complete the turning head by the end of November.

Tamahere Park Toilets

- Final design details being worked through. BCD will be submitting plans for comments for multiple toilets across the district.
- Construction scheduled to start in early February following consultation with key stakeholders.

8. Resident Daniel Wood – Temporary Events

Prefers to discuss this in person when covid levels change.

9. Other Business

Speed Limit Proposals

- Proposed that new expressway north of Hampton Downs to south of Tamahere is 110kph.
- On and off ramps at Tamahere proposed at 80kph.
- Discussion resulted in a decision that the limits proposed will not be challenged.

CCTV Subcommittee

- Alltech Solutions have submitted a confidential final proposal with costings.
- As Alltech has consulted with SaferCities after consultation with NZ Police, a second quote from SaferCities is deemed unnecessary.
- Following a 111 call, police will have immediate access to footage.
- Community lead project then vested to WDC
- Hub Building owner and tenants supportive in principal.
- WDC advised new toilet block will require camera mounts and wiring.
- Potential playground shading will need to be considered regards camera mounts.
- WDC has indicated some funding is available for the initial purchase. WDC will cover ongoing monthly fees.
- Funding to be covered by WDC, tenants, landlord and residents.

Motion;

TCC accepts the proposal from Alltech Solutions subject to securing funding from WDC, tenants, landlord and residents.

TMRT Report

- Lockdown continues to limit activity.
- In person meeting tomorrow.
- Continuing to wait for the health and safety plan from WDC which is holding up weed management.

Targeted Rates

• Discussion continues on use of the available funds when the hall loan is paid off.

Tamahere School Pool

• School is struggling to fund on going costs.

Action; Andrea to come back with what is needed to open the pool to the public

<u>Village Growth</u> – for next meeting.

Playground Shade

- Public consultation of the 3 options in Level 2
- Could benefit from the targeted rate

Dog Rules for Tamahere

- Current or possible options; Te Awa Lane (river erosion problems, distant from Hub), New cultural reserve off Alfred Main Drive (Geoff King WDC to check whether appropriate), Old truck wash site beside Tamahere Reserve (good but difficult car access), area along Devine Rd beside Tamahere Community Hall (close to walking tracks, central, could be fenced with agility equipment).
- General sentiment; Prohibit dogs on all playgrounds, skate park, playing surfaces eg; playing fields.

TCC Facebook proposal

• Draft guidelines have been circulated and agreed on.

That the TCC secretary be authorized to set up a Facebook page for TCC subject to the guidelines.
