Amber (pictured above) was found in the Maramarua Forest with serious injuries. She had wounds on her face and legs and ended up needing approximately 20 stitches after her surgery.

Our Animal Control team put her into a foster home so she could recover and relax, before advertising her for adoption. A lovely couple from Waiuku came to meet her and they fell in love. Here's what her mum Morag said:

"Adopting Amber was the best decision we have ever made! Our first week together was a bit trying as she settled into her new home and routines, and we got used to having a fur baby. Her past experiences, we realised, have affected her a lot, but after destroying a crate and an outdoor run in the first two days, things started to settle down. She has now really become part of the family and we couldn't imagine life without her. She absolutely adores our cat (even though she is still confused when he doesn't want to play fetch). She has accompanied us on two holidays which we all thoroughly enjoyed, even coming to cafes and restaurants for tea. Amber did not have the easiest start to life but we are committed to make the rest of her life as perfect as she deserves"

SMALL INCREASE TO REGISTRATION FEE

PAY YOUR DOG REGISTRATION ONLINE

If your dog has been registered before and you simply need to pay the next year's fee, you can do it all online.

You'll need to know your dog ID number and owner ID number. This is found on your dog registration notice.

Note: It may take some time for your new dog tag to arrive in your mailbox. Please allow up to 8 weeks for processing time and postage.

Page 2 Dog ID number

if you are paying for more than one dog, use the first dog ID number.





USING YOUR

CREDIT / DEBIT CARD



If you're using a debit card it will need online capabilities (i.e Visa Debit or Debit MasterCard)

Go to www.waikatodistrict.govt.nz/payit Select payment type: Animals

Enter your dog ID number into the Reference Number field

Enter the amount to pay and submit your payment

Send your signed dog registration form to Waikato District Council, Private Bag 544 Ngaruawahia or scan and email it to dogs@waidc.govt.nz and we'll post your dog tag to you

Please note: There is a 2.49% fee charge by the bank for making a credit / debit card payment. This fee is set by the bank, not by Council


BANKING
