This report examines the level of compliance of Waikato District Council with the selected conditions of the resource consents listed above.

2 BACKGROUND

Waikato District Council (WDC) has entered into a commercial arrangement with Watercare Services Limited (WSL) to operate their stormwater systems throughout the Waikato district. WSL has employed a dedicated stormwater compliance person to improve the recording and reporting of stormwater operations on behalf of the consent holder.

Historically stormwater compliance has not featured highly in the priorities of district or regional councils, however this is now changing in response to an increased focus by central government on the three waters including stormwater. Subsequently the consent holder in conjunction with WSL has improved the level of annual reporting and also reviewed and submitted an updated stormwater management plan for the whole district.

This regime (REG612189) encompasses all the consents that pertain to 13 villages throughout the district along with one rural subdivision. This audit will assess compliance for these villages stormwater systems in a combined report as their consents condition schedules are identical. The annual report (doc ref 17579585) submitted by the consent holder covers all these separate stormwater systems and similarly the new revised SMP (doc ref 17914021) covers all the above sites as well.

3 COMPLIANCE ASSESSMENT

Unless otherwise specified in this document this assessment covers the period from 1 July 2019 to 30 June 2020.

This compliance assessment has been undertaken based on the submitted annual report by the consent holder, monitoring data supplied throughout the compliance period and any site inspections undertaken. Some administration, duplicate or irrelevant conditions have been omitted for brevity.

Please note that a description of the classification system used to describe compliance status is given in Appendix 1 of this report.

The conditions for every individual consent and village/site are included in the submitted annual report and I won't replicate them all in this report. The individual sites have a few specific site related conditions however the vast majority must comply with the conditions of schedule A which applies to all WDC stormwater sites.

It is not possible to fully assess compliance with many of these condition as they are aspirational and relate to planned works and upgrades that may or may not have yet been undertaken. Some conditions relate to when the consent was first granted and have time limits for action which have now passed.

The complaints section of the annual report is useful as most of the complaints about stormwater assets or flooding are recorded in the WDC complaints system (CRM) and the follow up actions and resolutions are well documented. Any significant stormwater related issues also tend to be notified to WRC either by the complainant themselves or by WDC/WSL.

Sampling is limited under the current consents and sampling has not always been undertaken as required. The new SMP recommends improved sampling methods and locations to improve the information that can be gained from the samples that are taken.

The asset register for all WDC stormwater sites is outdated and incomplete and this has been a major focus for the current compliance officer at WSL to ensure that the assets on the register is up to date and accurate.

Liaison with local stakeholders is also improving and any mandatory consultative groups are being contacted and meetings set up as required by conditions of the consents.

5 DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSIONS

The recording, sampling and reporting of stormwater activities has improved significantly during this compliance period. There is limited information available from previous compliance periods from which to assess historical compliance. It has been demonstrated that the consent holder is making significant improvements to compliance reporting and record keeping and therefore I have recommended a compliance status of "high level of compliance" is given for this current compliance period.

I consider that by the next audit the items that have yet to have been supplied will be made available to enable a full assessment of all conditions to be made. A full audit assessment will be made when the next annual report is submitted in September 2021.

I also recommend that these sites are kept as focus area 1 sites for the 2020-21 compliance period and assessed again next year to ensure that the remaining items proposed by the consent holder are completed and submitted to WRC as planned.
