This report examines the level of compliance of Waikato District Council with the selected conditions of the resource consent.

2 BACKGROUND

The Matangi wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) was installed by Innoflow and consists of 110m³ septic tank and a 55m³ recirculation tank with sand filters and a dripper line system disposal to land within the site boundary. The WWTP serves the local community of Matangi and is operated on behalf of that community by Waikato District Council.

The Matangi area is flat land and has a shallow groundwater table which can cause issues with land disposal options during the wetter winter months. Climate change is likely to exacerbate this issue in years to come.




The consent holder states in their annual report submitted to Waikato Regional Council that: *The Matangi plant has exceeded the maximum daily discharge volume for this compliance year.*



Council has investigated the reasons for the high plant inflow and have determined that there is infiltration and ingress occurring within the boundaries of private properties that discharge to the WDC sewerage system.

The residents who discharge to the WDC system have inground septic tanks that then discharge to the WDC reticulation system. Several septic tanks were uncovered to assess the condition of the septic tanks and all the tanks were cracked. The Matangi area has a high water table especially during winter and therefore ground water enters the system.

Waikato District Council (WDC) have entered into a commercial agreement where Watercare Services Ltd (WSL) this will see WSL providing all Councils waters management services to WDC under the guidance of a Waters Governance Board (WGB). This contract will be effective from 1 October 2019. WSL will begin the process to review and get an understanding of the wastewater plants but will continue planned or reactive works as identified in the current Council Long Term Plan 2018-2028 any new initiatives or changes will be limited to budgets and works already identified for the next 21 months.

A letter of direction was issued to Waikato District Council on the 25 February 2019 (doc #13858170). Waikato Regional Council provided a site improvement program for all sites in May 2019 (doc #14288037). The improvement programme included the following for Matangi WWTP:

- investigate operation of disposal fields & refurb? ensure maintenance of dripper fields being undertaken;
- investigate network I&I and ensure programme for resolution
- follow up on Matangi School commitments to flow reduction. Investigate discharge for pool filtrate.

Minor issues identified are administrative and relate to reporting of data.
