Re: MACAA Information Letters - Raglan Wastewater Scheme

The Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act (MACAA) establishes the legislative framework for the recognition of customary interests in the common marine and coastal area between the line of mean highwater springs and the outer limits of the territorial sea. Under the MACAA, iwi, hapū and whānau can apply to the Crown to seek agreement to recognise Customary Marine Title (CMT).

Waikato District Council (**WDC**) understands that Te Whakakitenga o Waikato has applied for recognition of Customary Marine Title, which intersects with the Raglan Harbour area.

Background




Figure 1: Current Raglan Wastewater Treatment Plant Layout

At present, the Raglan community is serviced by the existing Wastewater Treatment Plant (**WWTP**) located on Wainui Road, Raglan (as illustrated in Figure 1). The wastewater is treated at the WWTP is then discharged via an outfall in the Raglan Harbour (the approximate location of the outfall is shown in Figure 2 below).

The current discharge and coastal occupation resource consents for the existing WWTP expires on 20 February 2020.

WDC is proposing to lodge an application with the Waikato Regional Council (WRC) for short-term resource consent for the continuation of the existing WWTP (Application)

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Application and to seek your views on the same in accordance with section 62(3) of MACAA.

Application

WDC are currently investigating options for a long-term sustainable wastewater treatment and discharge solution for the Raglan community. WDC is working to develop that long-term solution in partnership with local tangata whenua and in collaboration with the Raglan community.

In order to ensure that the WWTP can continue operating while the long-term solution is investigated, WDC have elected to lodge a short-term consent. This will also allow for a proper investigation of a long-term solution and ensure that the proposed solution is acceptable to both tangata whenua and the community without interrupting the operation of the WWTP.

The Application effectively seeks a continuation of the discharge and coastal occupation resource consents for the existing WWTP and associated infrastructure.
