# MEMORANDUM OF COUNSEL FOR AMBURY PROPERTIES LIMITED IN RELATION TO REBUTTAL EVIDENCE

### **24 AUGUST 2020**

#### Introduction

- 1. Counsel for Ambury Properties Limited ("APL") respectfully refers to the memorandum of counsel dated 9 July 2020 which provided an overview of the 22 statements of evidence filed on behalf of APL on 9 July 2020.
- 2. Following that (and taking account of adjustments to the hearing timetable), on 13 August 2020 six other submitters and further submitters filed the evidence of 14 expert witnesses.
- 3. APL has produced 14 statements of rebuttal evidence to put the concerns raised by those parties into perspective.
