Hi David,

I am assisting the combined Poultry Industry Group in its submissions on the Proposed Waikato DP. One of the issues that has come up is they way in which the WPDP defines poultry farming and intensive farming. We want to ensure that both breeder farms and hatcheries are not caught in the intensive farming rule as that will require them to get resource consents. Some of these activities might need consent triggered by the amount of sheds but we don't see them creating the same amenity effects as meat chicken or egg laying operations.

We have indicated to the s 42A writer that neither hatcheries nor breeder farms require a WRC air discharge consent because there are few adverse effects of these activities however it is very much our word on that issue.

We are hoping that you can provide an email confirming that neither breeder farms nor hatcheries normally trigger the need for a WRC air discharge consent within the Waikato. Is that possible?
