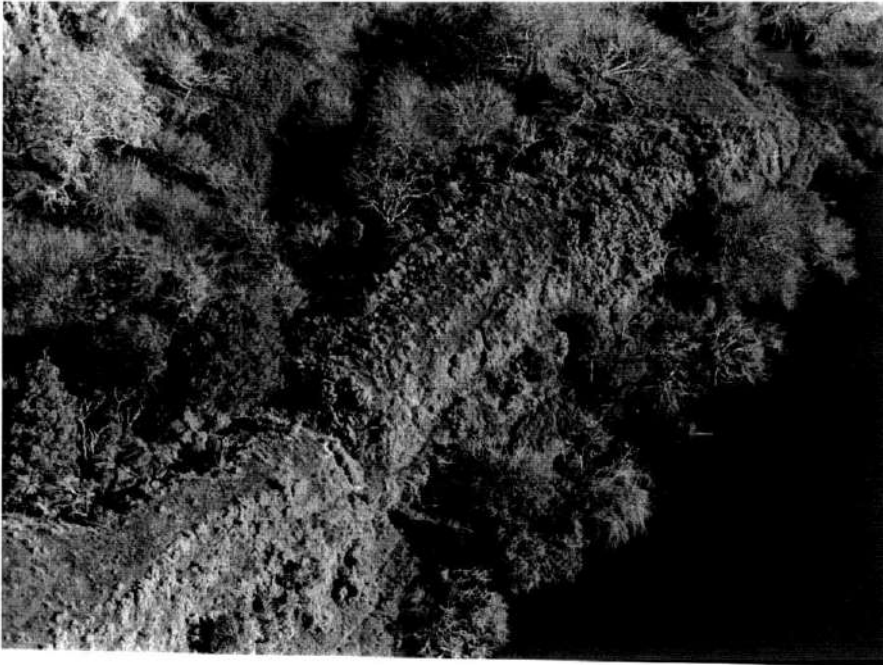

Aids to relocation: On the north bank of the south bank of a branch of an unnamed stream (other branches Mangaharakeke and Mangaone). From Newell Road turn east onto Birchwood Lane, drive to the end of the Lane, turn left into 161F. From the house walk west 100 meters to the pa.

Description of Site: Gully Pa, long peninsula of land with deep gully's. Had a deep eastern defensive ditch, now rounded and filled. The main surface of the pa is flat with natural terracing at the western end where it extends down to the stream. The stream branches at the western end of the pa and a high prominent cliff face is evident across the stream and northwest of the western tip of the pa. The western tip would have provided good canoe access to the pa. The location of the western defensive ditch identified in the 1968 /1977 record of the pa could not be confirmed. A hole was identified in the approximate area noted on the records sketch map. A large rectangular depression was evident toward the western end of the main area of the pa. This may represent Maori occupation or more recent farming activity. (It is believe the depression relates to Maori occupation since it would seem unusual for a farmer to take a large area of his paddock out of use and establish a shed at the end of his farm). See attached sketch plan and photographs.

Current site condition: fair to good, modified over time for farming and ditches filled in.

Current land use: grass paddock, deer fencing along gully edges

Proposed Land Use: Proposed subdivision consent for construction of a house between the existing house and the pa. The sketch map is not to scale but there appears to be sufficient land to construct a house outside the eastern ditch of the pa. The area east of the pa consists of a hummocky landscape, that configuration, paired with the deep gully's on either side suggests that the existing stream cut across this area prior to establishing it's current channel.

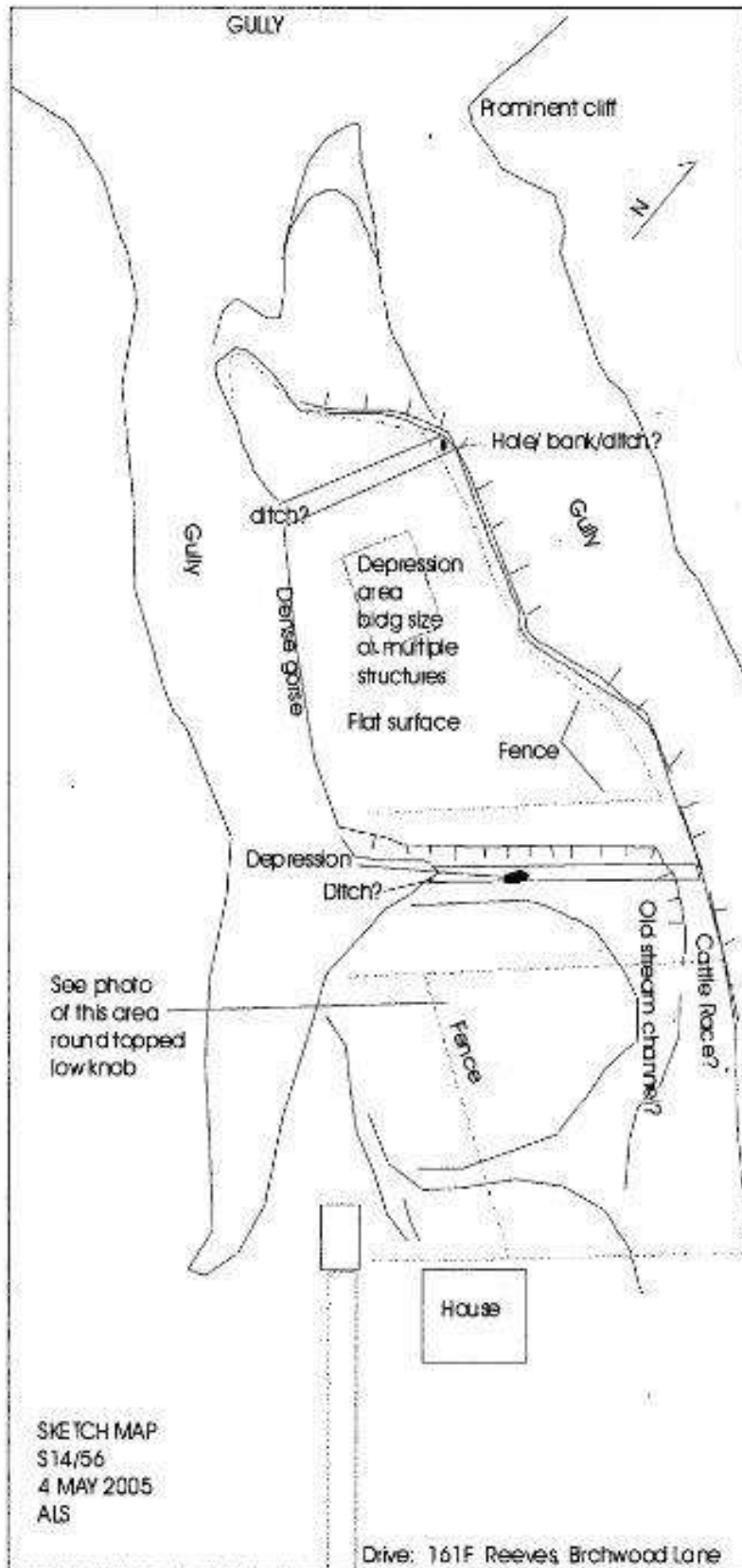

Updated: 30/05/2010, Visited: 11/03/2009 - New grid reference (E1774261 / N5870232), taken on Garmin GPS 76 ± 5.2m, on Tihi. As described by Felgate in 2006, however I disagree with his interpretation, I believe it to be a small pa and that the small infilled ditch at the eastern end is real. The slopes below the pa are very steep. Only has possible flanking terraces (the hill it is located upon is actively eroding and slumping, making it difficult to define which are natural and which are built terraces; it would appear there are both - most are on the northern side) immediately below the ridge and would have required minimal defences to defend it. The size of the pa suggests it was only defended by a few families or perhaps a small hapu. The southern slopes have eroded significantly since Matthew Felgates visit in 2006 and a large amount of midden is exposed in slips that are more extensive than those shown in his photo. I agree with Felgate that it was possibly a lookout point to defend the river, possibly associated with a larger pa in the area.

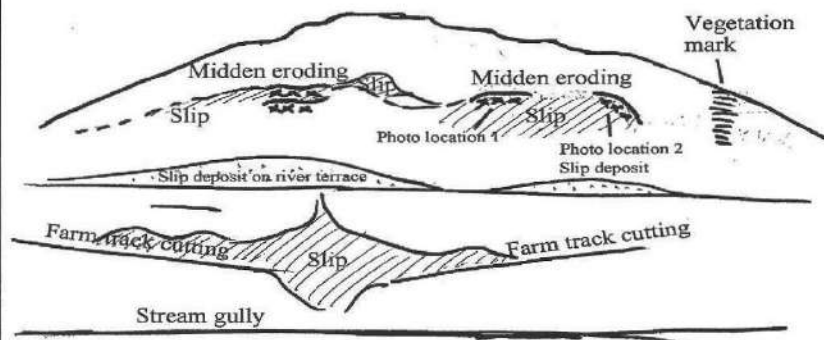

The site was not revisited in 2018, however desk-top research at DoC and the Waikato Museum identified that investigations were undertaken in 1973-74 by the Waikato Museum Archaeological Society, but these have not been published. Doug Pick wrote a paper published in NZ Archaeology (1968). It indicates that a survey of the site was undertaken, perhaps with some limited sub-surface testing.

The DoC file provides detail on the location of the pa, and previous site visits by archaeologists from the 1960s. One note by Doug Pick is of interest stating the following:

When I first saw the site it was covered with blackberry and willow, there was an outer row of palisade butts across the neck and some on the lake side. Many stakes stood in the water, out about 10 to 20 yards suggesting eel weirs

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or canoe harbour. The most important features were the totara stakes and posts that stood in all angles within the perimeter, few were upright, most were at angles suggesting braces or stays, there were (sic) no apparent order of their lay out, most were 3' to 5' above the soggy ground and all of totara. The whole arrangement suggested to me a platform pa... in 1966 I took Janet Davidson to see the site but some vandal had cut down every palisade. There were two small canoes, one was removed by Lyn Peart, the other partly buried by persons unknown.

A note on the paper file from Cathryn Barr (dated to 1993) states that the landowner, Mr Barris, mentioned: „when his grandfather brought (sic) the land in 1860 much of the area at the north end of the lake was in kauri. When he ploughed the area (local Maori) from the settlement across the lake (in the direction of Fullerton Road), came across and camped in the area which is now recorded as a pa. They put the palisades in around the site about this time – between the 1870s and 1890 to protect the camp from a group in Taupiri. (Local Maori) camped at the site and dug for gum following Mr Barris' great grandfather. The 'moat' which resulted in creating the island was also created by Mr Barris' grandfather with his tractor, at the request of (local Maori) who were using the camping area....Re the canoes – one of these was a dugout (Mr Barris has photos) one which was presented to the family for use on the lake.

Miss Barr mentions that the reliability of this information is "questionable".

A note from Owen Wilkes details a conversation in 1998 with Caroline Barris. She stated that her grandfather – Exelby – was the first farmer in the area and that he set aside the S14/5 site as an overnight camp for Maori and dug a moat for them for the protection of women and children.

The paper file and artefacts held at the Waikato Museum were examined. The Waikato Museum file contains the field notes and scaled drawings from two seasons of investigations (1973 and 1974). The site is described as a swamp mound pa, located on a swampy, willow and blackberry covered peninsula located on in the north east corner of Lake Rotokauri. The site was recorded as containing approximately 80 palisades and 80 stakes, and the mound approximately 4ft above water level, approximately 1/6th of an acre, and covered in charcoal soil deposits. A large number of artefacts and samples were recovered from the site including stone adzes, pounders, obsidian, pumice and wooden objects. As far as the records state, this site was not dated by modern dating techniques, however it is clear from the material viewed that the pa site has its origins the pre-European period.

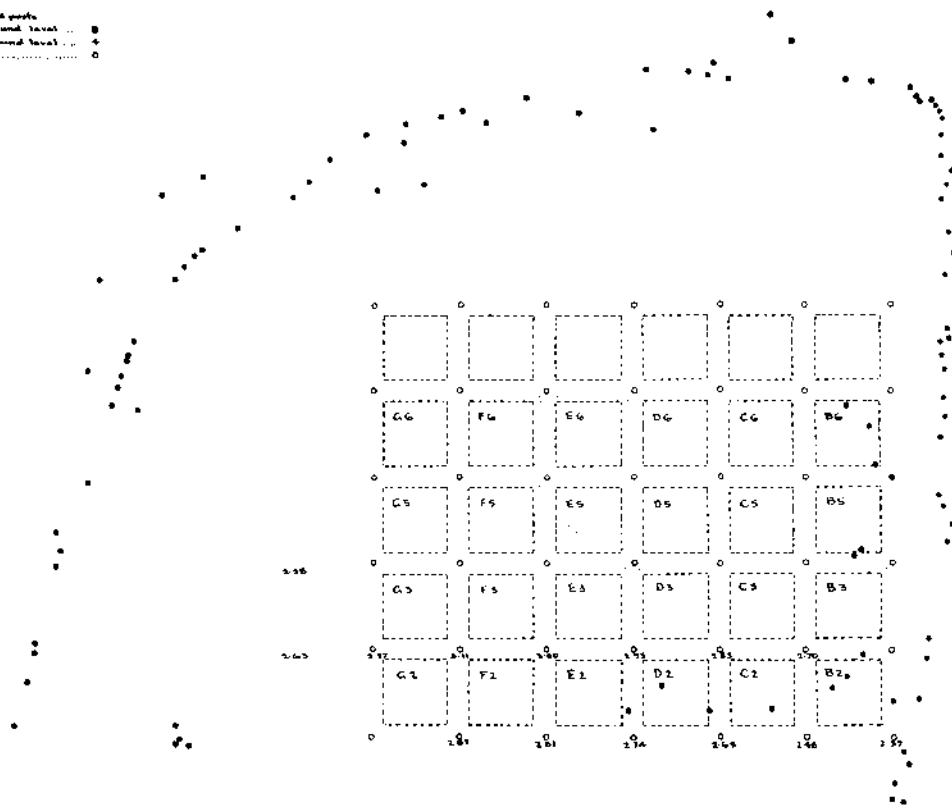

Morning John

Yes – it's all true. I first visited the site as an extension of the Shawcross / Bellwood work at Ngaroto and Maungakawhare. Doug Pick would have been in the mix. He was wandering the countryside taking palisades out of the ground with tractors. The site was covered by willow and we eventually cut and poisoned the trees on the site. Neil and Dave Rosenberg tended to lead on this – I was at the stage of becoming a museum person rather than archaeologist. A rather small test excavation did happen at Rotokauri with Neil as site leader and my memory is that notes and plans were produced and should be in the Waikato Museum files somewhere. We might even have taken some timbers that were lying about but that memory is confused with the work we did in Wiremu Thompson territory above the hills out of Cambridge.

Kapuni – records of locations attach to the sheet aerials (a vast book of them) that should be held somewhere in NZHPT.



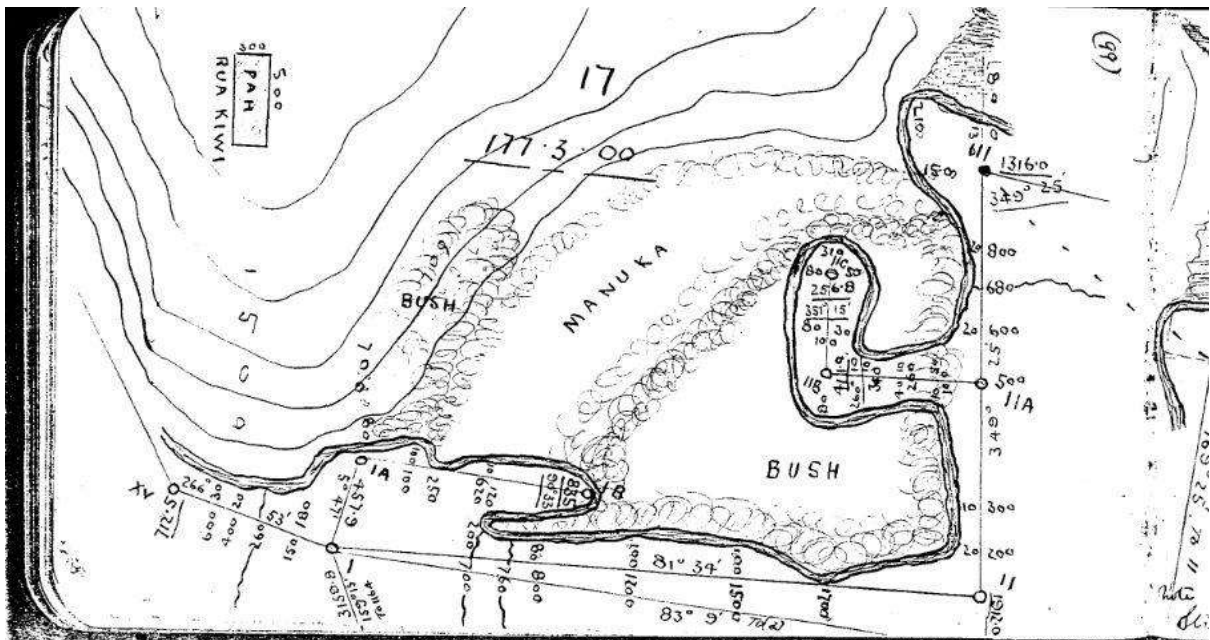

At least three raised platform structures are evident on the flat top of the headland. Several depressions suggestive of pits, ranging in size from 2 m to ~ 6 m across are also visible, with some of these being up to a metre deep.

A track descends in a zig-zag down the nose of the spur at the eastern end, almost to the mudflats. Two terraces are visible here, and an extensive scattering of shell midden outcrops down the steep eastern slopes wherever the ground cover is sparse.

There is terracing and midden scatter along the northern slopes of the headland also. The midden comprises whole and crushed cockle and pipi, with some mud snail also apparent.

Earthworks including pits, platforms, terraces and ditches are readily apparent within the pa. During a site visit in November 2014, the entire surface and flanking sides of the pa were covered in scrubby bush and grasses with trees no larger than 20 cm trunk diameter. The sides of the headland are more densely vegetated than the flat top area.

Midden is eroding out of the steeper slopes and it is likely that deposits remaining in primary context may be found beneath the vegetation cover.

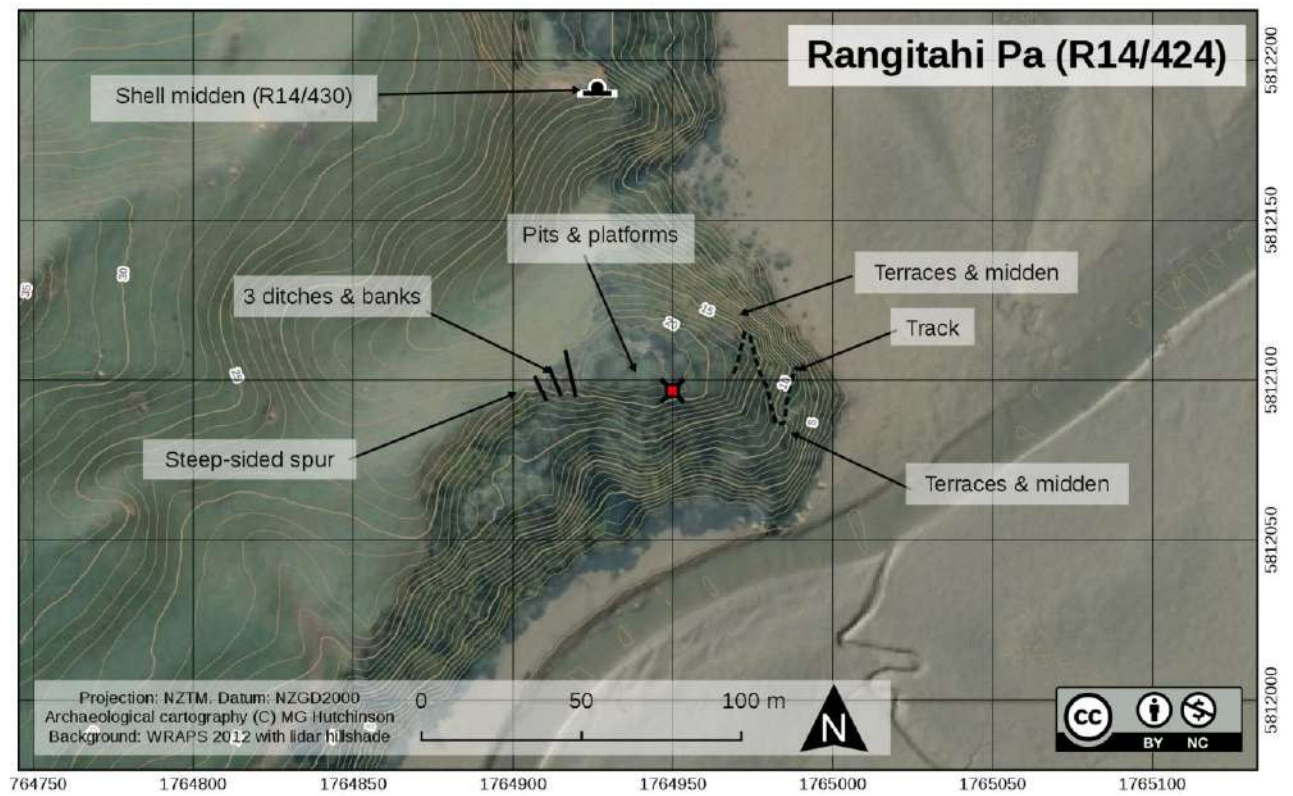

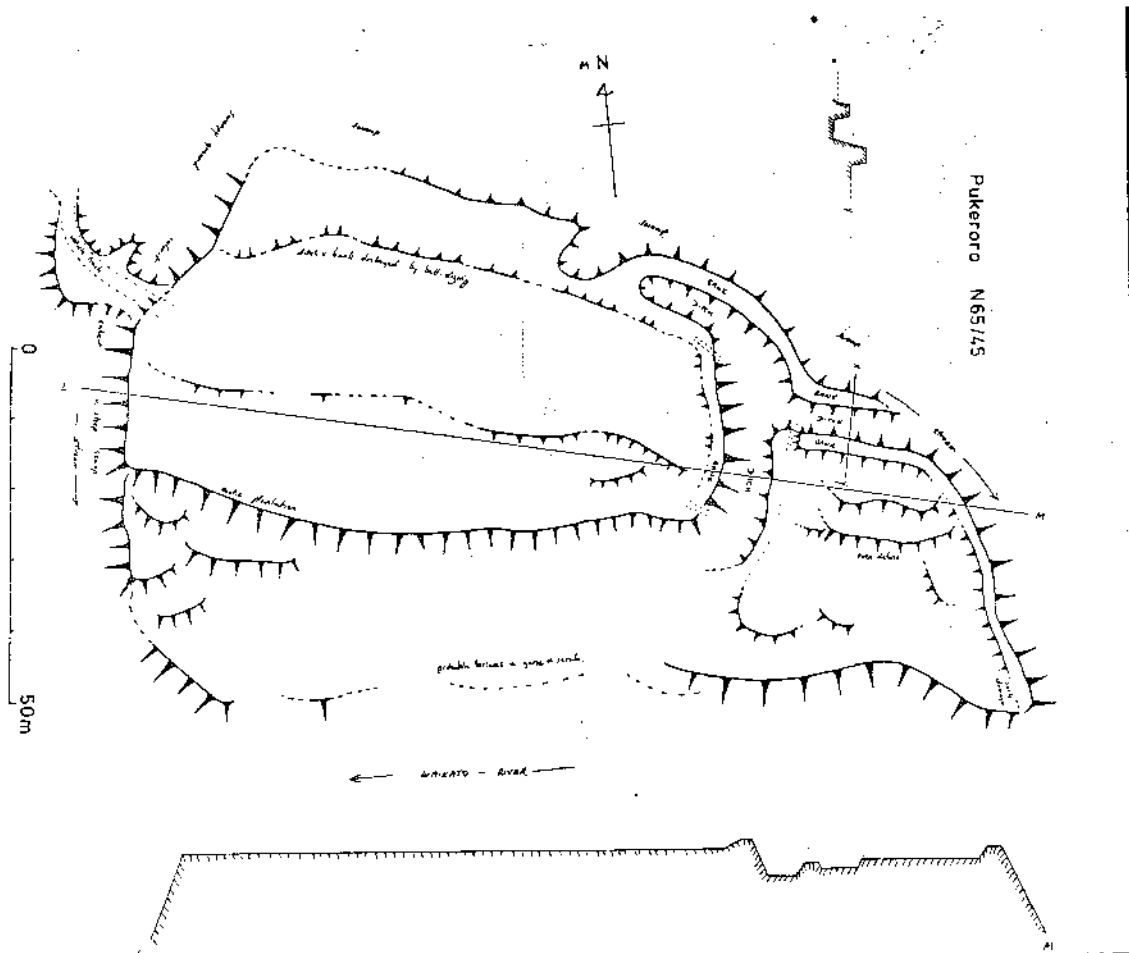

THE PARTIES AGREE:

THE Covenantor hereby grants to the Council a conservation covenant which shall forever bind the land into whomever's hands the same may come (but not so as to render the Covenantor personally liable in damages for any breach of covenant committed in respect of the land after the Covenantor shall no longer be the registered proprietor of the land).

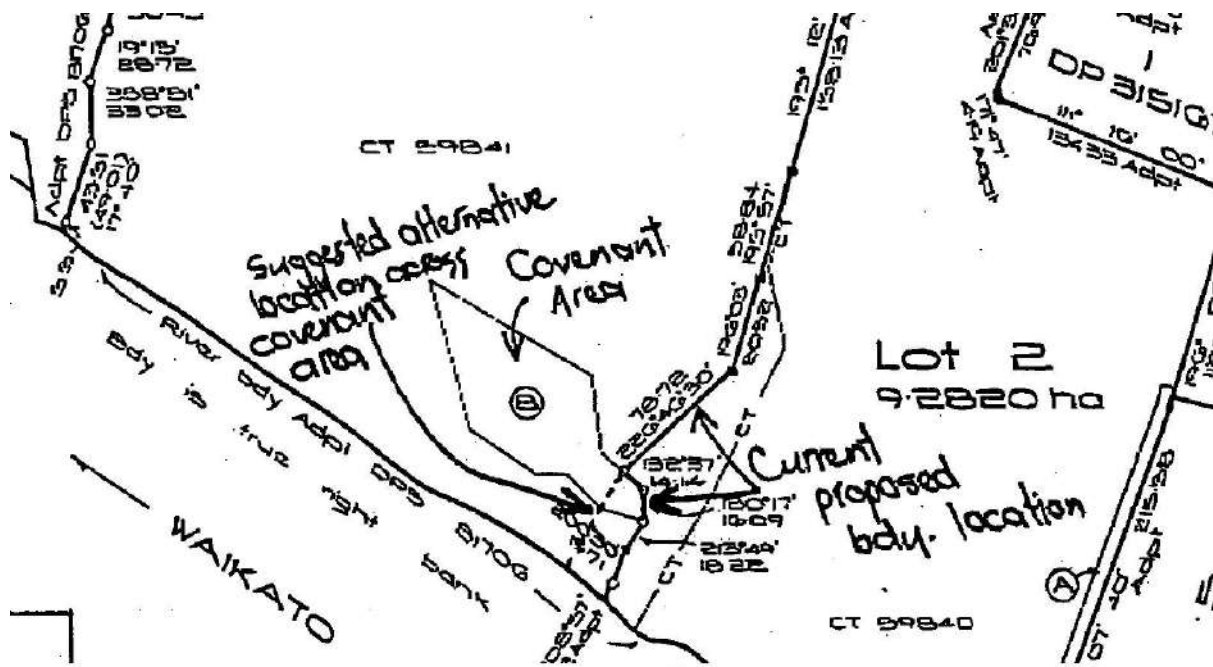
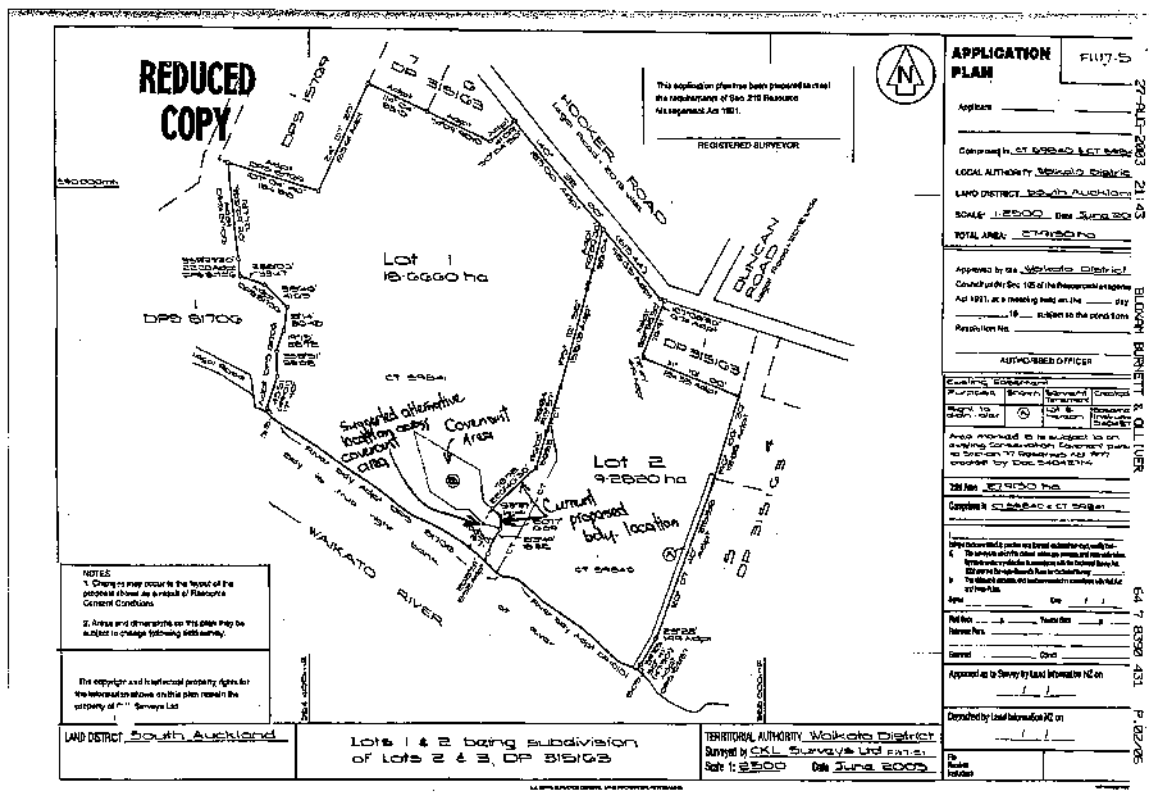

Within this area, 224 borrow pits have been identified primarily from 2007 lidar elevation data. A 50 m buffer around pits in this cluster encloses an area of 54.9 ha. The pits occur in dense clusters on terraces above the river, and on the flat Hinuera surface. They are densest around the golf course.

This large cluster of horticultural activity was originally recorded as S14/121. The site has been further broken into records S14/349, S14/377, S14/378, S14/376, S14/375, S14/374, S14/372, S14/371, and S14/373. A cluster of borrow pits can also be seen west of Rangimarie Road and these have been recorded as S14/382 and S14/383. For the most part, sites have been divided by the transit corridor containing the NIMT railway and the Great South Road. This corridor effectively bisects the cluster with an 80 m wide strip, much of which has been subjected to quarrying for railway ballast.

S14/373 records a component of this cluster, comprising seven borrow pits visible on the edge of a river terrace, east of the transit corridor. 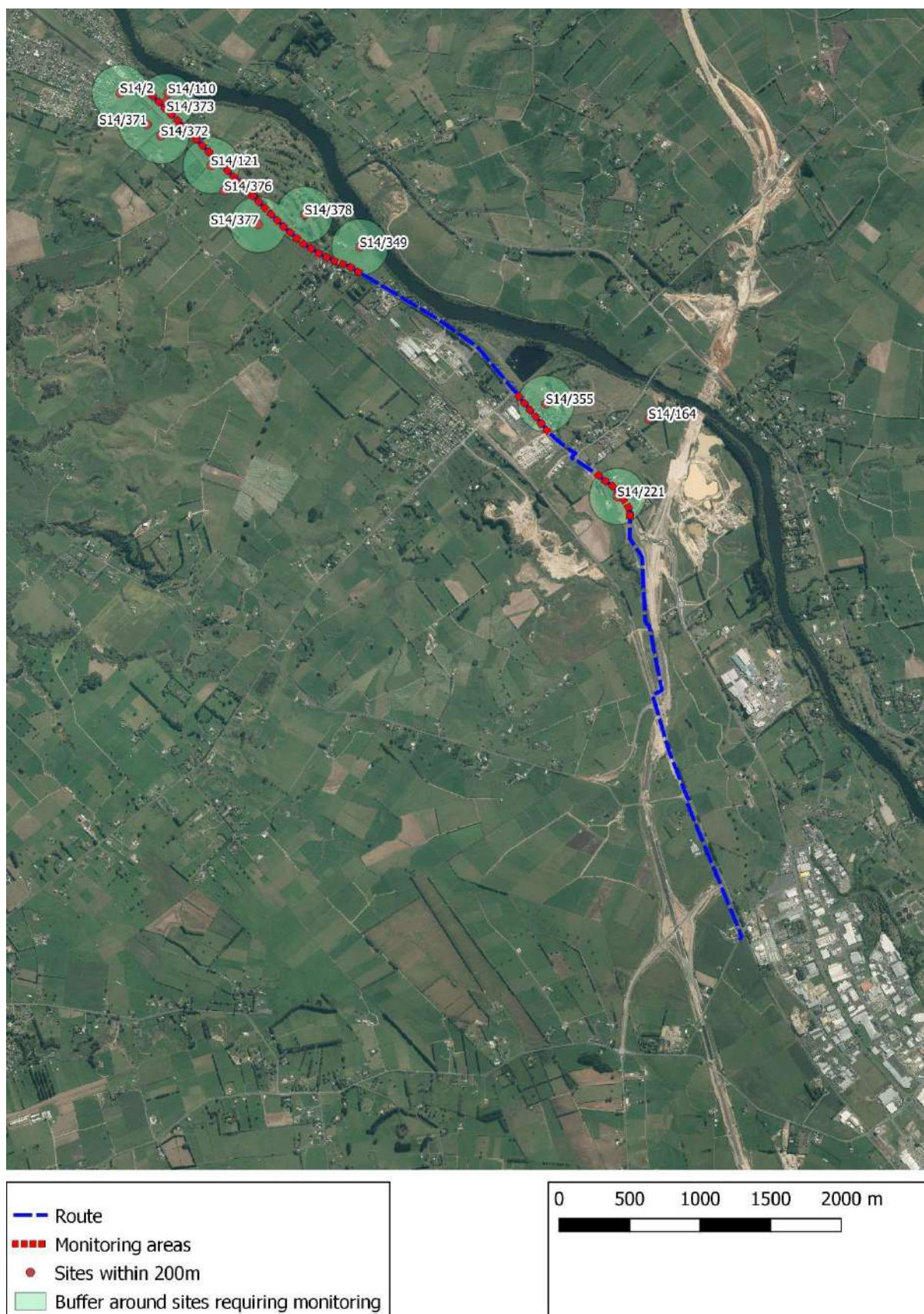

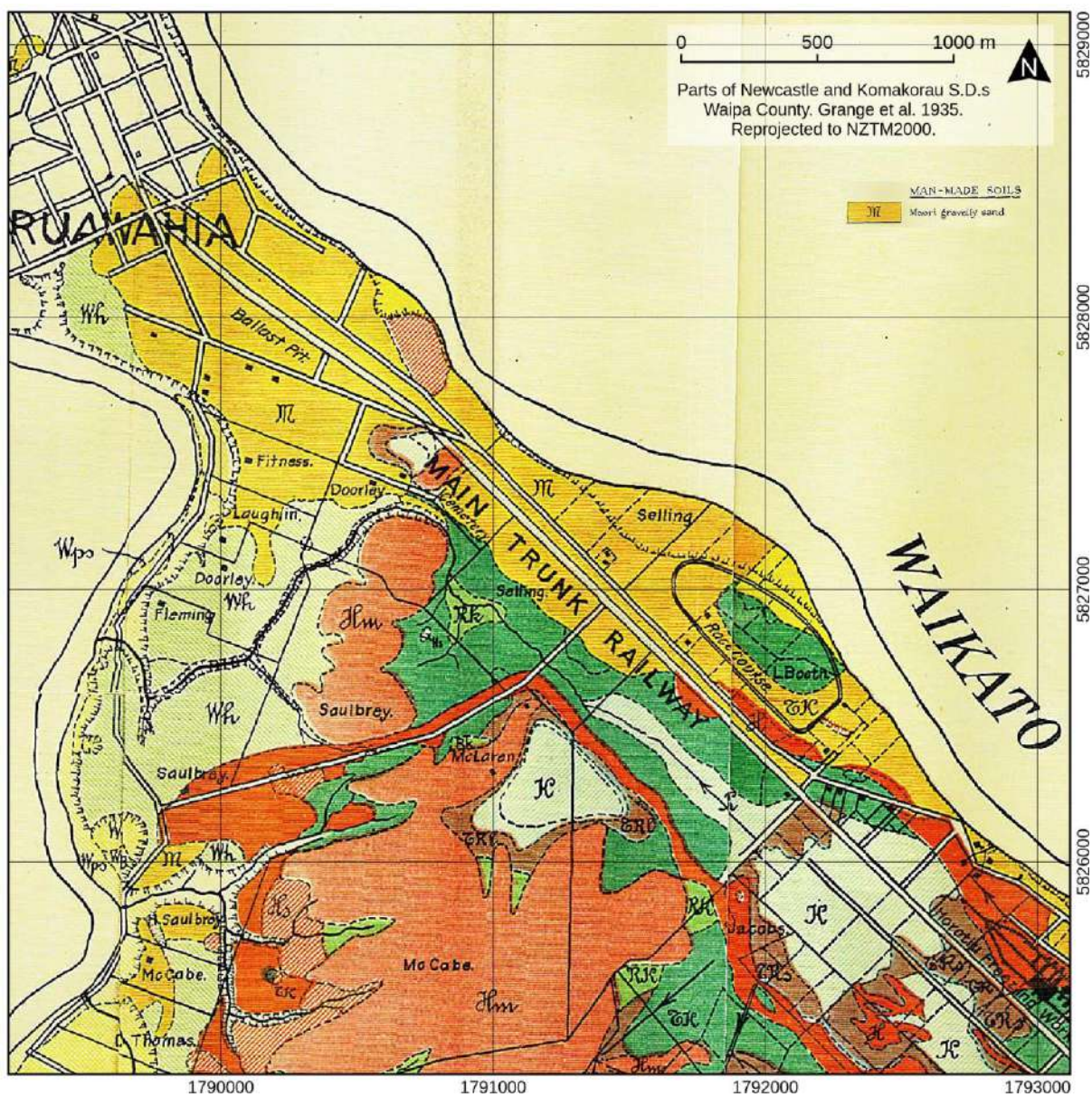

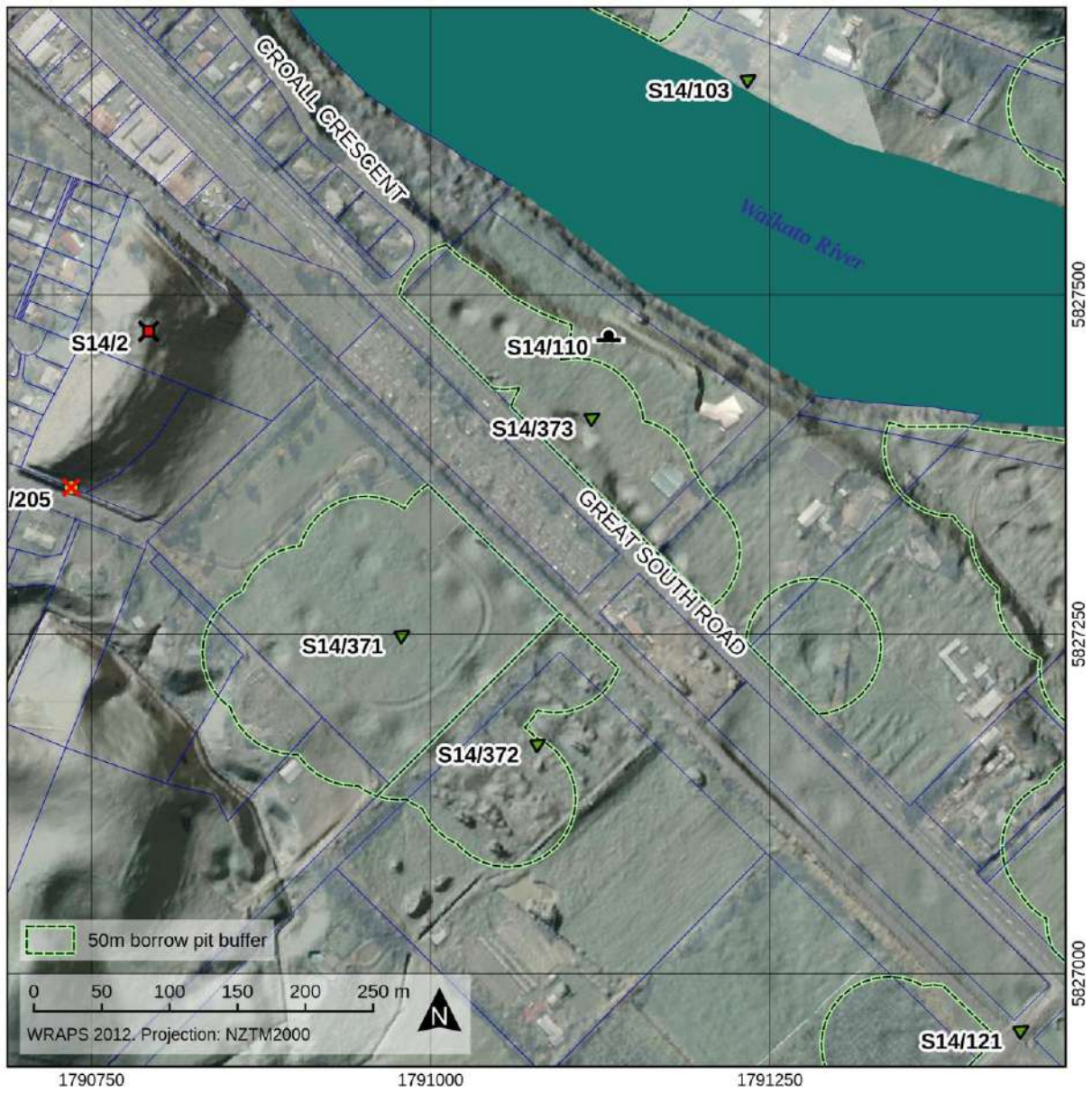
