13: Definitions	Farming	The submitter wishes to have the 'farming' definition amended so it includes poultry as permitted livestock. Poultry do not have adverse effects that are materially different or more adverse than other farm livestock. Delete reference to 'in-situ' soil, which otherwise adds unnecessary complexity and uncertainty without addressing environmental effects.	Amend 'Farming' definition as follows:  "Means an agricultural, horticultural or apicultural activity having as its primary purpose the production of any livestock, (including poultry or eggs) or crop using the in-situ soil, water and air as the medium for production. It includes:"
	Intensive Farming	Amend to exclude range areas used for free-range poultry. If the birds are outside they are livestock that are permitted under the definition of farming.  Amend to delete reference to an outdoor enclosure. All paddocks are outdoor enclosures. This definition does not limit or describe what is meant by 'enclosure' and it should be deleted.	Amend 'Intensive farming' definition as follows: "Means farming which is not dependent on the fertility of the soils on which it is located and which may be under cover-or within an outdoor enclosure, and be dependent on supplies of food produced on and/or off the land where the operation is located (c) poultry or game bird farming undertaken wholly or principally within sheds or other shelters or buildings; (d) free-range poultry or game bird farming while inside an enclosure;"
Rural ZoneObjectives and Policies	22.1.2 Permitted Activity5: Rural 4.6 Industrial activity	Poultry farming does not result in adverse effects on soils or in contamination of soils or water and is therefore more consistent with the policies and objectives of the PDP and the RPS than other types of intensive farming listed and many permitted farming activities. Rules	22.3.7.2 P1 – (a)(vii) Building setback – sensitive land use	Poultry farming is a rural activity that can only happen in the Rural Zone. It is an activity that is a normal rural activity and has no greater effects than many other farming activities that are permitted in the Rural Zone. Any adverse effects of a reverse sensitivity nature are likely to arise from odour and visual amenity effects arising from the buildings that house birds, rather that from birds ranging outside. Therefore The reverse sensitivity standard ought to be measured in relation to intensive farming buildings rather than site boundaries. 300m separation from intensive farming buildings is adequate separation from likely sensitive activities (residential activities in houses) sufficient to ensure adequate residential amenity in a rural amenity context.	Amend to read:  (vii) 300m from any building on another site containing an intensive farming activity.
